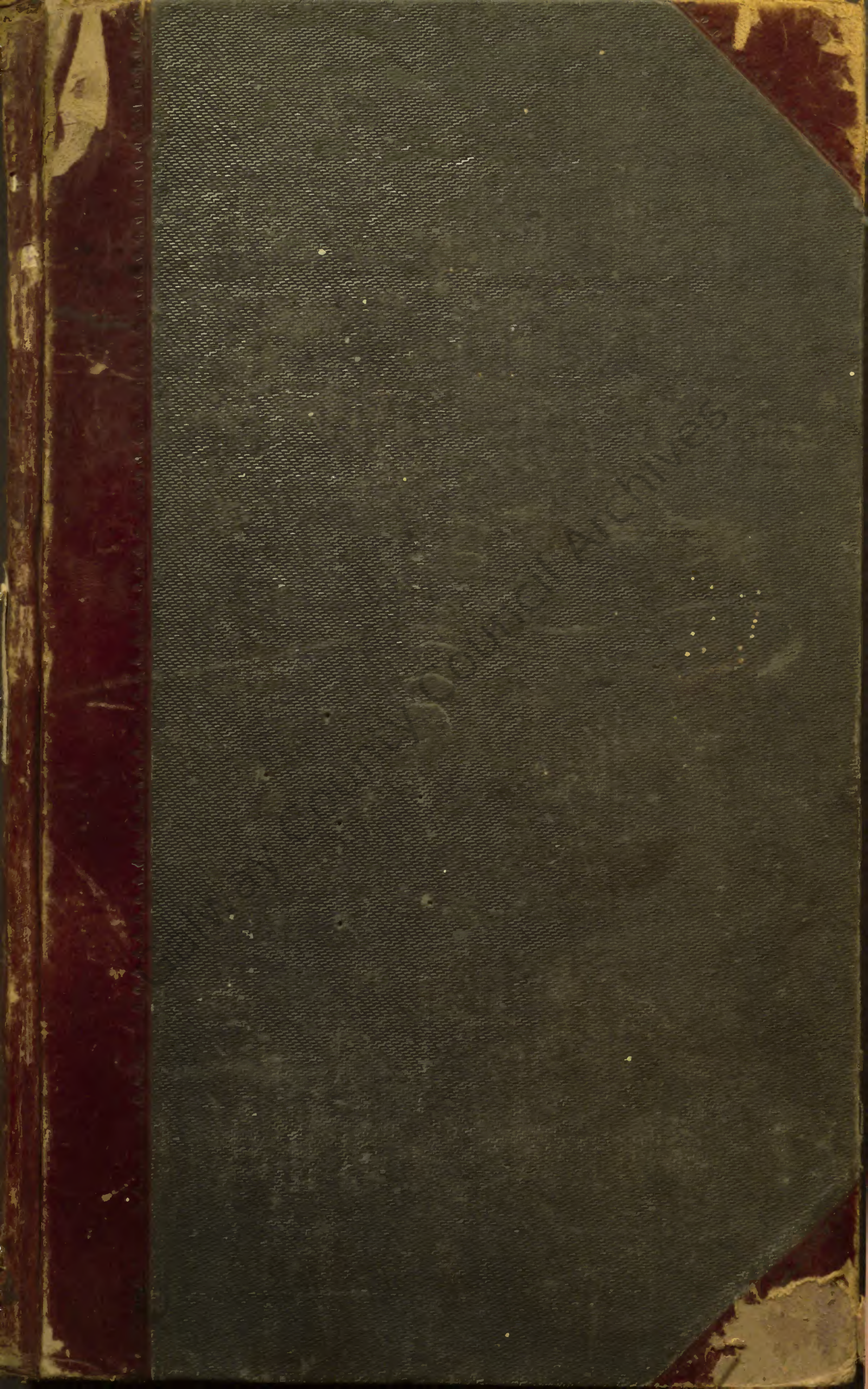

4 Each Candidate must be nominated by a separate nomination paper, but the same voter, or any of them, may subscribe as many nomination papers as there are vacancies to be filled for the town and no more.

5 Every person who forges a nomination paper or delivers any nomination paper knowing it to be forged, will be guilty of a misdemeanor, and be liable to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding six months with or without hard labour.

6 The nomination paper must be delivered by the Candidate himself, or his proposer or seconder to the Town Clerk, at his Office, before five o'clock in the afternoon of the 27th March, 1885.

7 That the Returning Officer will attend at the Board-room of the Town Commissioners, on Saturday, 28th March, 1885, from Two to Four o'clock in the afternoon, to hear and decide objections to nomination papers.

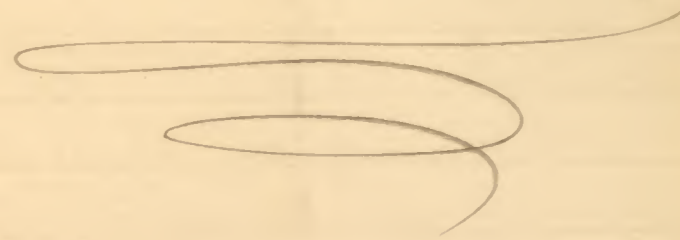
