Chairman of the Town Commissioners

My dear Sir

Should the subject of Police interference
with the Traders of the Town of Ballinastoe
become again the subject of consideration with
the Town Comm^{rs}. I must beg you will give unjudged
contradiction to the statement that I had reported
the Police to the Gov^r.

The Sub Inspector had from me
a courteous remonstrance against certain grievances
connected solely with the immediate locality in
which I reside and which have for a long time
rendered the residence of myself and neighbours
almost intolerable which remonstrance was neither
connected with any other part of the Town or had
even a remote reference to the ^{acts} of the Constables
which some members of your Board have so justly
complained of - I deem it right to place you
in possession of the above facts although
I purpose giving further details of the matter
