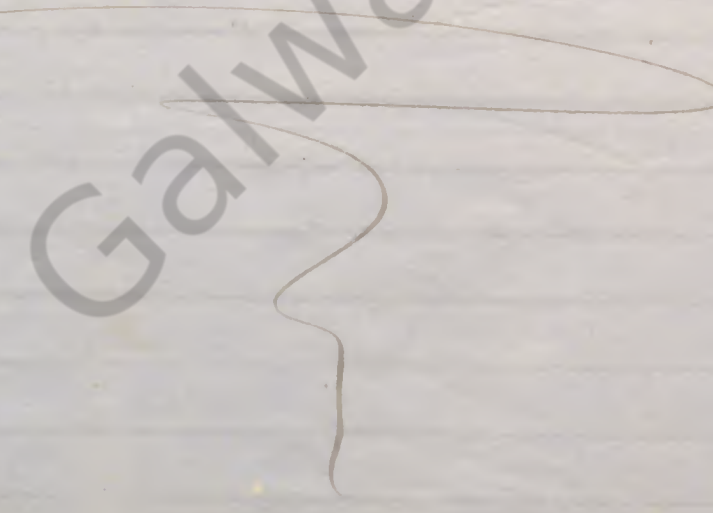

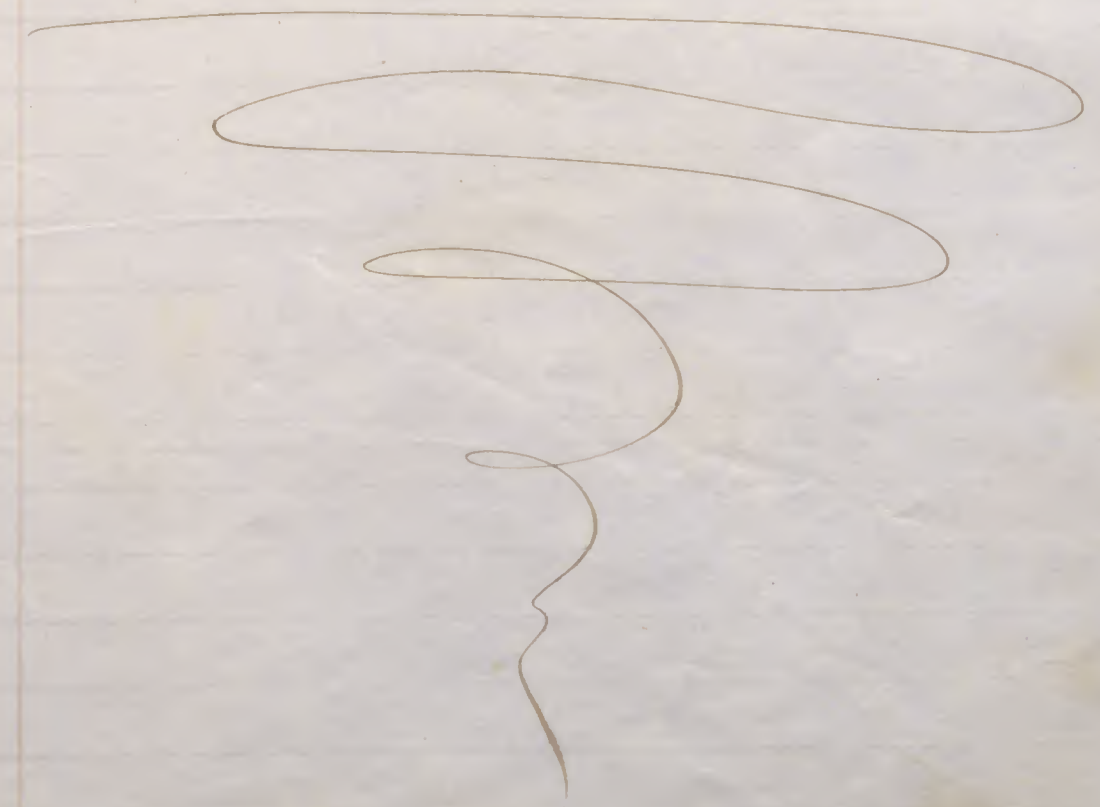

No such Compensation was devised for the hundreds of thousands who were ruined by the potato blight in 1846; or for the thousands of poor people, who more recently, suffered by the disease among pigs; these all contributed largely

largely to the prosperity of the Towns, while large landholders and owners of stock, have materially detracted from that prosperity, and in some cases paralyzed the trade of towns. It would therefore be manifestly unfair to Compel the towns to contribute to their Compensation; the more so, as legitimate and ample means may be devised on the principle of insurance."

"That Copies of the above Resolution be transmitted to the Chief Secretary Dublin Castle, and to the Members of the Comities of Galway & Roscommon, The Right Honorable Fitz Stephen French and W. H. Gregory Esq."

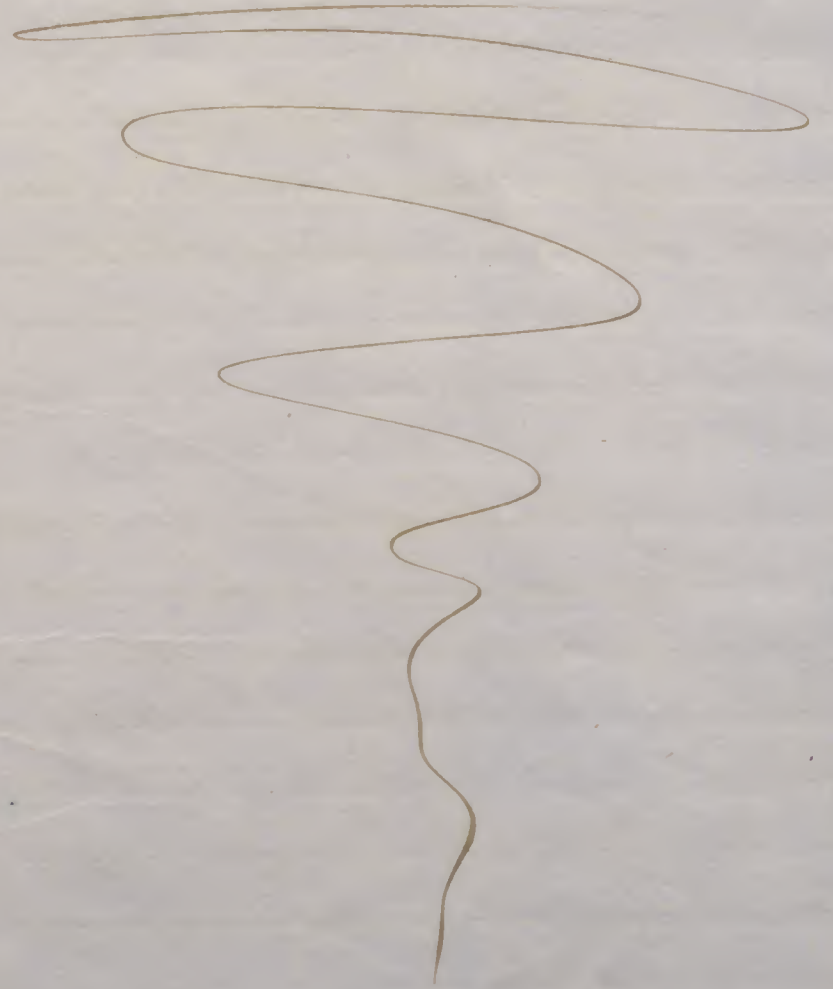
