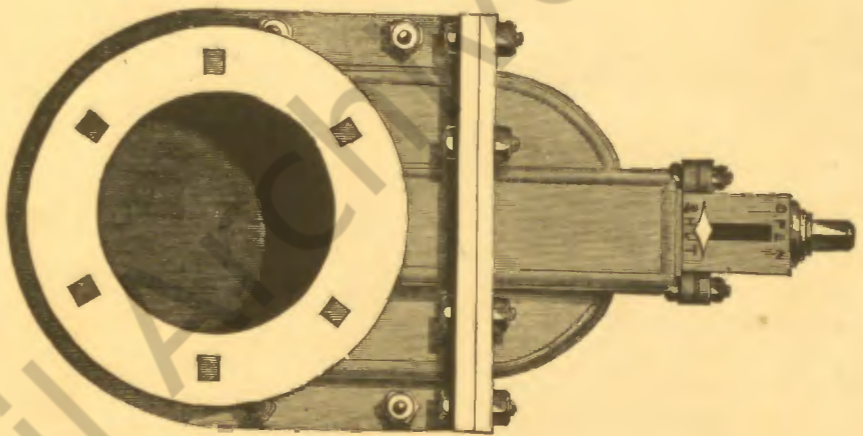

 from Naphthaline or other Corrosion.

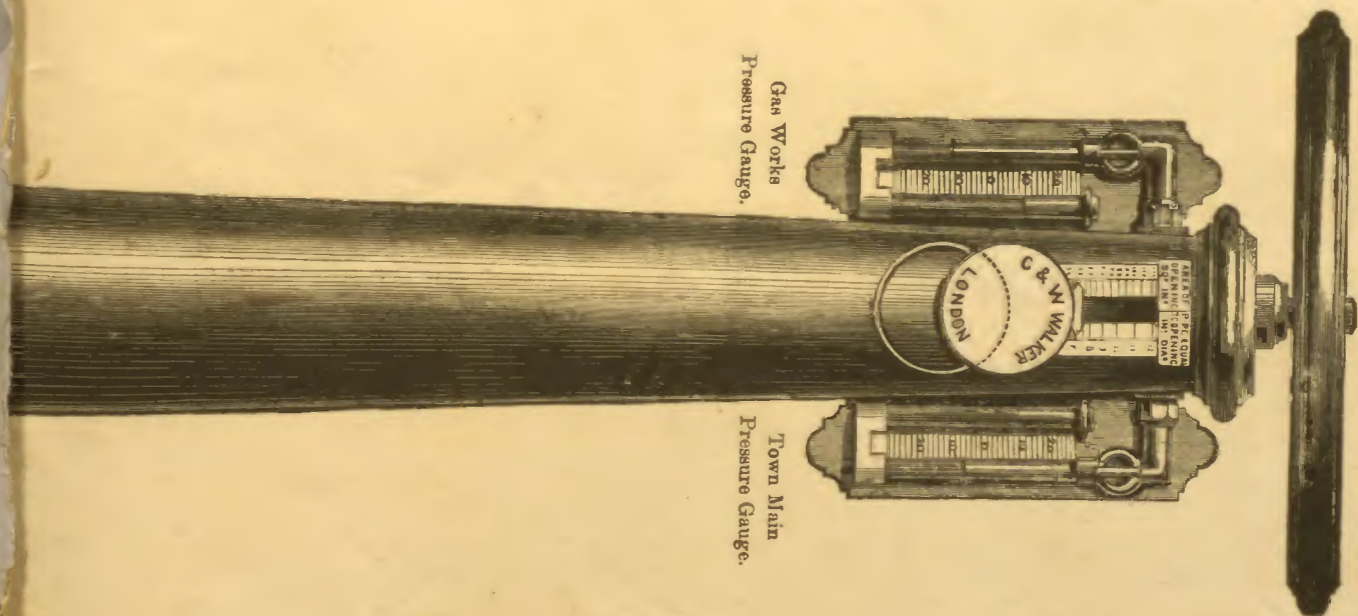

When I hear of Gas Companies in
other towns being able to pay Dividends
to the owners, I confess I am puzzled why
in our good town there should continue
for years such opposite state of affairs,
and in your interests and that of the
Town generally I think it well to bring
the matter before the Board

Surely if the Concerns cannot be made
to pay for themselves, at the high rate

rate charged here for gas, it would
be wiser to rent them to others and thus
get rid of an almost increasing
responsibility

M. Chairman & Gentlemen.
In reply to a question of the Board, Why the Rate for 1870 was struck in Sept and not in June as heretofore. They to say that the Copy of the Township's valuation was first sent to B. Selby when it adopted the 11th Vic Chap 103. in the year 1860, the same Copy continued in use being revised every year for a period of ten years, and the names and valuations were so often changed and rewritten, that it became quite unintelligible and was obliged to be sent up to the general Valuation Office, for a fair Copy of the Book to be made, as directed by the Board, which Copy was returned to the Commissioners on the 29th July 1870, and signed by J. Pall freene on the 19th July 1870. The Account had then to be copied into the Rate book; an estimate prepared, and submitted to the Board which was objected to, (inasmuch as the Clerk's salary was all charged, on the Rates) and an amended estimate directed to be made, charging only half that Officers salary to the Rate use. The Rates had then to be calculated and a fortnights notice of "Intention to make a Rate" given, which was duly struck on the 16th September 1870.

VI The grates in Boulgers lane crickets from the circumstances that they are not placed in the channel through which the rain water flows, they are close to the wall and should all be removed, they are choked and give an offensive smell which would not be the case if placed in the Canal as the water then flowing down through the shore, would carry away all offensive matter

VII In Canine at the end towards the canal there are two ash pits, if they the ground between them now vacant were joined in it would afford a great accommodation for the poor people residing in the neighborhood

VIII In Boulgers lane a place belonging to Mr Jamies Storie to which I feel assured if his attention be directed he will gladly remedy

IX At the bottom of Boulgers lane a Cess pool which should be removed, Mrs Boulger understands is the owner

X In the Brewery yard a few slight improvements required

XI The yards in the rear of the buildings called the barracks, situated in Green street require to be cleaned

XII It would now add in addition accommodations in the way of gates for the poor people of the town ought to be provided, the want of yards in the rear of every vicar's house, in the town consider a great evil and force the people in the absence of Public Jakes, to have the town scattered with nuisances

Which ought not to be tolerated or permitted in a civilized County

XIII Pumps to supply water are absolutely necessary in Doonagh and other localities of the town. It is a very important matter now that the County is threatened with Cholera that abundance of water should be had ready to hand in the various outlets of the town. The service in the market square affords this important element to the poor,

XIV of the Town
We found many pigsties (and they occupied) in the rooms of houses for want of regard and means of keeping them. It would be a hard thing to deprive a poor man (labourer or tradesman) of this way of support and some mode of helping them to do so in providing accommodation in such circumstances could be obtained

XV It would in the best place connect the street with the slip in river street. It is most dangerous to cattle, and I would advise the present one to be changed and a proper one substituted in its stead

XVI I cannot conclude this report without expressing my great satisfaction at the general condition of the Town in the matter of cleanliness and the absence of cess pools, which some years since existed and were the cause greatly of vitiating the atmosphere and increasing disease and death.
