A Report was read from Dr. Saffell again calling attention of the Board to the deficiency of Hospital accommodation and requesting that immediate steps be taken to have the new Iron Hospital at rear of Infirmary, completed as soon as possible, stating that as the weather is so very dry he considers it might be inhabited at once by a certain class of patients, regretting to be obliged to report most unfavorably on the state of the health of the boys at "Aldborough Stew" recommending their removal to the "Stomestown Asylum" stating that the health of the infants at "Craghton Stew" and of the children between (2 and 9 years) in the nursery at the W. House is very bad indeed - Bowel Complaint and Dysentery, Infantile Remittent fever and Scurvy are very prevalent, and have caused many deaths - stating that during the last two weeks 2 cases of small pox have occurred - that he had vaccinated as many of the healthy children as he could - observing that it would be useless to vaccinate those who are weak and delicate - recommending that the children between (2 & 9 years) should receive three days in each week, a portion of meat soup and white bread for dinner, that the use of Small pox should be suspended, and that a proper supply of Quinine be procured, and that 4 lb. Bread daily be given to the children under 2 years

Mr Griffith Inspector reported to the Board that the Infants at Craghton Stew had for the last 4 or 5 days only received half their allowance of milk, and that the health of the Infants appeared to be suffering in consequence and that notwithstanding the Master's statement that the Contractor did not send in sufficient supplies as ordered. The Inspector considered Mr Workman to blame in not having adopted some energetic course to procure an additional supply of milk or to provide some substitute for it until the next meeting of the Guardians.

In reference to the A. Officers report, It was Ordered that the Children between 2 and 9 Years at the N. House receive for dinner on 3 days in each week a portion of meat, Soup, and that the A. Officer be requested to state the quantity of meat to be allowed to each Child.

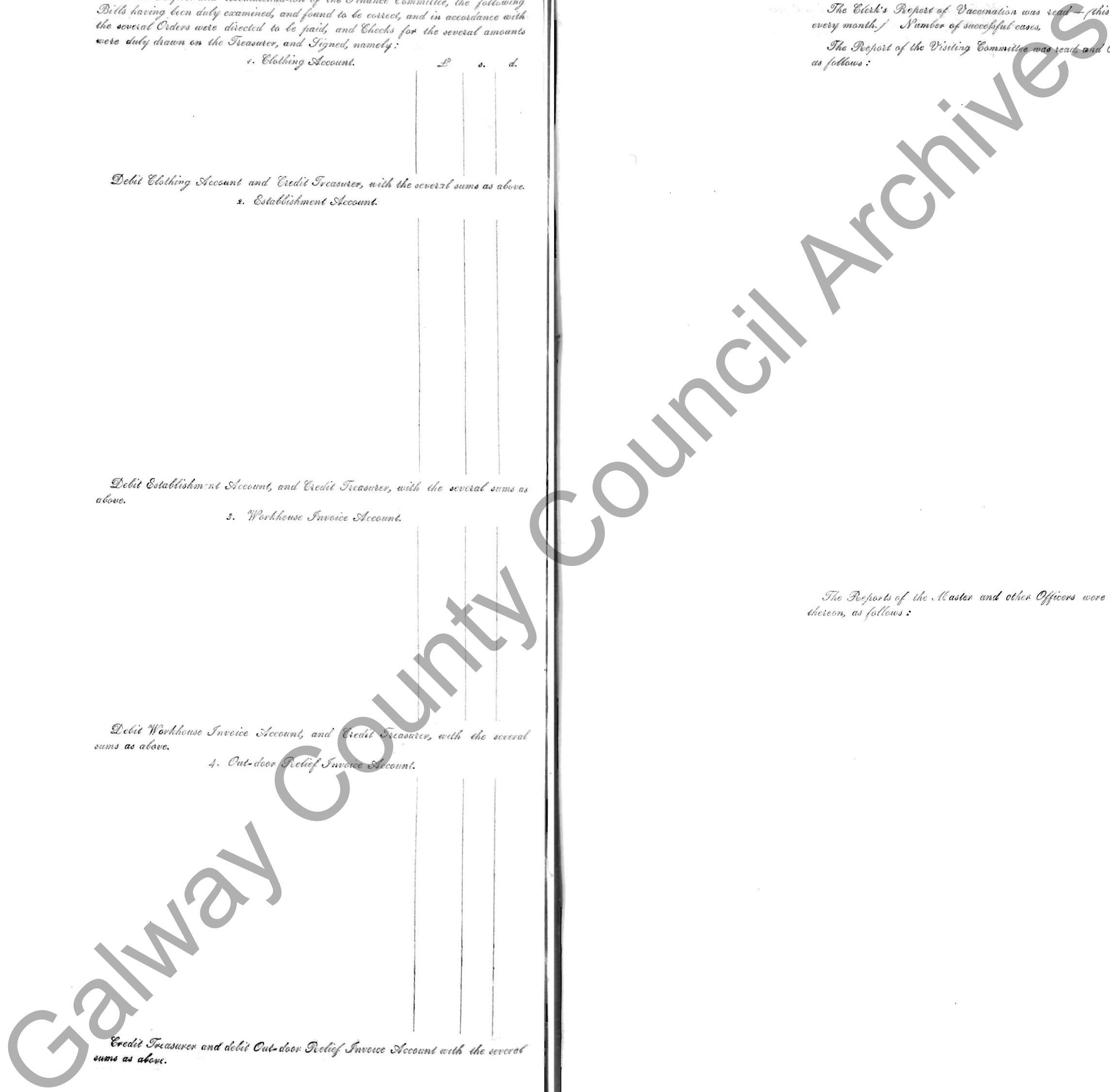

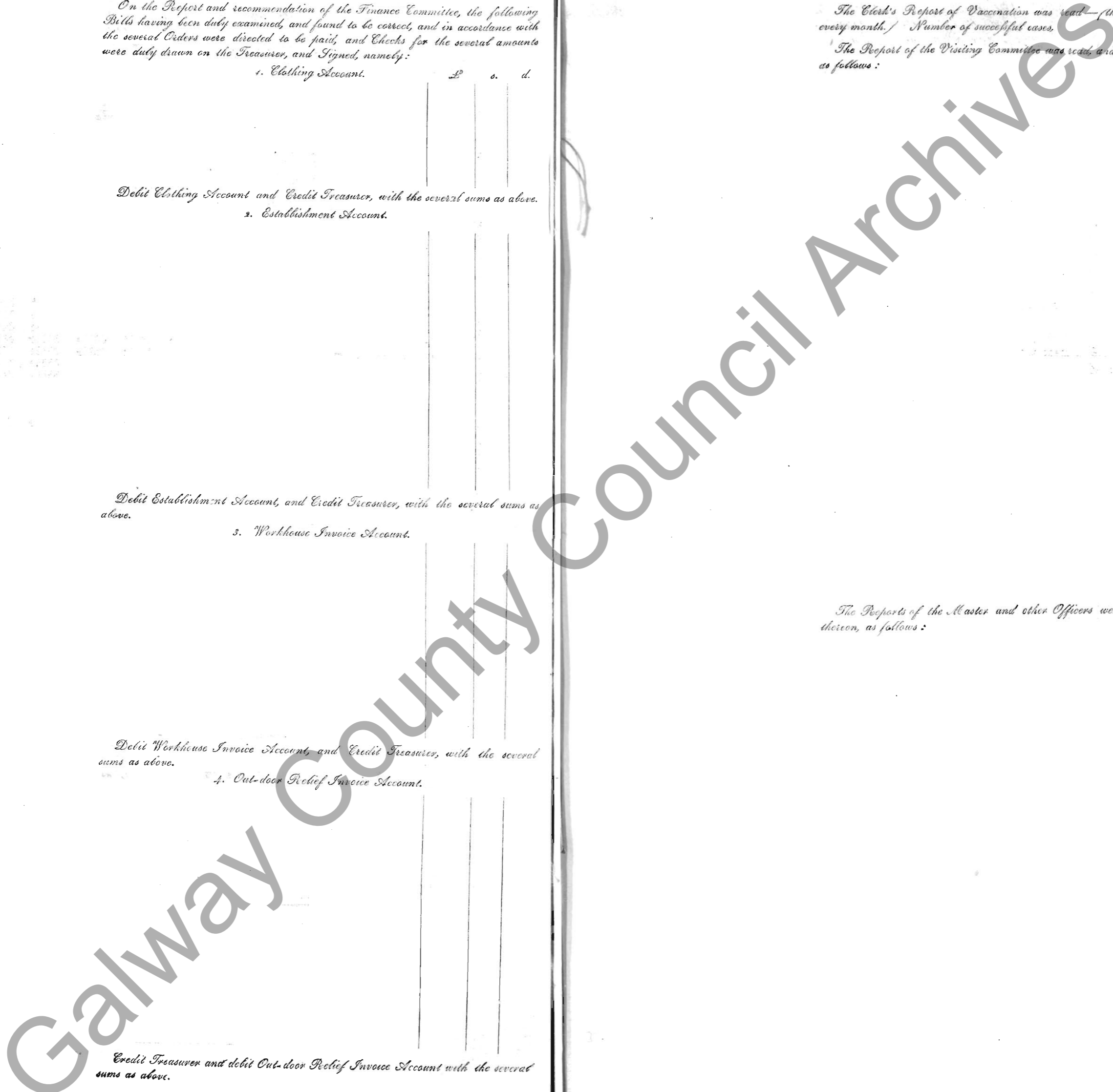
