## Masters Journal

The Master report that he purchased last week  
532 qts of milk from different persons  
at 2s per qt of the extra a price being charged  
to the Contractor

That the quantity of Milk Supp by the Contractor  
was not sufficient to cover the extra price  
of the Milk purchased by the Master

That in consequence of receiving a sufficient  
supply of Milk since last Sunday from the  
Contractor and other parties he is now enabled  
to carry out the lottery

That the Milk was not delivered by the Contractor  
for the last week till near 12 o'clock which  
certainly if allowed to continue cannot

The Report of the Master and other Officers were read and Orders made thereon as follows

Fail in Carrying the utmost convenience  
and regularity in the Management of the  
Workhouse & requests the attention of the Board  
thereto & further requests that the Board will  
appoint a certain hour for the delivery of  
Milk say 7 o'clock

That the Contractor delivered this morning at  
8 past 8 o'Clock 49 qts of Milk that at 8 past 10 o'Clock  
he delivered 65 qts

That the Contractor has not finished the Glebe of  
the Workhouse yet

That he employed a Mason to repair the Boiler in  
the Laundry & to fit up the grates in the  
Womens day room

That he attended at the Cliffs Petty Sessional Court  
on last Thursday when there was a boy named  
John Corrally brought up for deserting the House  
with Union clothes which the Master identified  
& was committed for 1 month

Required - 10 Barrels Lime At the Thread

*Orders that the Society do  
take immediate steps to send  
the Milk Contractor to stand  
in contract. Ordered that payment  
be kept to 5s per c. & to last 1 or 2  
months & that the Milk be used for the  
remainder.*

*Orders that the house  
be sold back to the  
Contractor for the  
delivery of Milk*
