The Master reports that he was obliged to return some of the Milk supplied by the Contractor on two occasions during the past week being of an inferior quality and has to substitute Faranaceous Soup for Breakfast.

That he received 3 Tons Pigeon Meal from the Contractor on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Instant which enables him to carry out the Dietary.

That he the Master, made every exertion to purchase Milk with little effect many of whom the parties to whom he applied stated that they had customers in the Town & the Master not being in a position to take the Milk regularly they would not leave them.

The Reports of the Master and other Officers were read and Orders made thereon as follows:  
That he purchased 29 qt Milk at 2d per quart  
the extra price being charged to the Contractor.

That in consequence of the Contractor not sending in a sufficient Supply of Surf last week the Master was obliged to purchase 50 Boxes of Surf from Mr. Pigeon at 10<sup>c</sup> per Box and 7 Boxes from Mr. Stroy at the same price the extra price being charged to the Contractor.

That the able Bodied Males & females are still using Faranaceous Soup for Breakfast in lieu of Milk.

That the road in front of the Workhouse requires to be gravelled & would suggest that a Hene Cart be employed for conveying Gravel.
