I have gone over the entire of these Receipts and checked them accurately with Poor Receipt Books, Abstracts, and collecting Books and find the entire overcharges by Mr King amount to the sum of £15-0-0.

John Lydon Poor Rate Collector (since deceased) appears to have exacted a sum of £1-2-6 on 42253 Receipt. Waudstone Electoral Division for the Rate of 1849 - James (now Poor Rate Collector in 1852) received two Receipts
