



With reference to the master the Board believe his report up to this day week to be correct, they have not reviewed his entire conduct since his appointment and found it to be proper - they find the establishment charges to be rather diminished than increased since his appointment of which further, they beg leave to call the commissioners' attention - for their kind consideration -
