Amendment That this Board cannot in justice to the
interests of the union accede to the proposal to dispense
with a local treasurer. They feel it would be
unwise and impudicious until a Bank is estab-
lished in Clifden to disturb the arrangements
which have now worked so beneficially for
the last 13 years - We find our present treasurer
was appointed in the year 1847 in consequence
of

of a Galway Bank (then acting as Receiver), totally failing to meet the requirements of the Union and from the risk and inconvenience experienced in the transmission of money to and from Galway.

That no circumstances have taken place to remove the difficulties so urgently felt 13 years before that in point of economy there would be no saving on the contrary increased expenditure after paying the amount of postage, stationery &c and the increased price which collectors would look for and contractors would surely put on the various articles. If the Rates had to be lodged in a Galway Bank and the Boards checks paid there. Likewise that the difficulty of transmitting money to Galway is much felt. and as much of the Poor Rates are collected in silver we feel how impossible it would be for the collectors to obtain notes in lieu of same for transmission. thereby affording them a legitimate

excuse

excuse for holding large sums of money of the Union in their hands which would prevent the Board actually knowing the amount at their disposal notwithstanding any weekly statement they might receive from the Bank. That much of the funds of the Union are paid out in small sums and we feel it would be unjust to subject the holders (after persons of small means) to the trouble, risk and delay of forwarding their cheques to Galway or to oblige them to submit to a heavy discount for getting them cashed in Dublin and in case of cheques drawn for sums under £1 or cheques containing odd money it will be at once seen how difficult and expensive it would prove to get it from a Galway Bank -

That our present Receiver has acted to our entire satisfaction and in hard times has frequently assisted the Union with his money without any charge - That from the peculiar position of this Union it would labor under the greatest disadvantages and consequent embarrassments in the carrying out of its affairs if the proposed change were effected -
