Resolved. That the approach of Election
of Guardians being now near. We beg
to call the attention of the Poor Law
Commissioners to the many objections
that exist against the present mode
of issuing voting papers, where there
is nothing by which any voter can know
his own voting paper from that of another.
There being only a mysterious number or
figure on the back of the paper, instead
of the voter's name. as was the case
heretofore until lately -

First in the case of a proxy where
he may be appointed by two or more
persons, and two or more papers
may be left for him. The proxy cannot
know one paper from the other and
can only fill them at random or
not fill them at all in either case
the votes are lost. though not by any
fault or neglect of the proxy,
but from the improper manner the
papers are issued

Secondly - in the case of two or more voters residing in one House - the papers for all parties are left there - no voter can know his own paper - hence these votes are also lost -

Thirdly many of the voters being illiterate are obliged to go to some party who will write the papers for them and in doing - by placing two or more papers to be filled at the same time a like mistake arises because once the voter lays the paper out of his hands he can no longer identify it, these votes are also lost - Thus a large number are totally disfranchised contrary to the spirit of the act and without any fault of theirs but entirely owing to their mysterious mode of marking the papers -

Fourthly, it affords much opportunity for fraud inasmuch as a guide if he thinks proper can misdirect the person dropping the papers and can do so with impunity, which could not be the case if the name were on the back, or even the party dropping the papers may do so by mistake in either case the votes are lost - These could be immediately corrected had the names been on the back - Thus as this mode of issuing voting papers has the effect of disfranchising many voters and as they have no possible control over it, we request the Commissioners will be pleased to give directions to the Returning officer to have the voter's name on the back of his voting paper when issuing, same as had been the practice in this union until lately,

We also request the Commissioners will be pleased to direct that an equal number of voting papers will be issued with the number of votes to which each voter may be entitled. So that each voter can know the number of votes he possesses. This was the case until lately, at present only one paper is issued to a voter no matter what the number of votes may be. It is the same as the voter having one vote only -
