Sir  
In the last eighteen months I after proposed to myself to trouble you with a statement of the deplorable condition of the population of these Islands - namely Raffin & Shark for want of medical advice and attendance



When I came here I perceived you were anxious to have a medical officer appointed but was sorry to see the Council did not approve of your selection. I waited then expecting that some charitable member would move for the appointment of a M. officer for a population of more than 1100 individuals.

During the period I am here I have met with many cases in the discharge of my duty where life depended upon medical treatment. At present there are a great many children ill in the Island, and if an epidemic broke out the consequences would be frightful. There are a great many children in the Island that have not been vaccinated.

In behalf of the Islanders I hope that in justice and charity your Board will not neglect them in future and put them to the blessing of a medical officer.

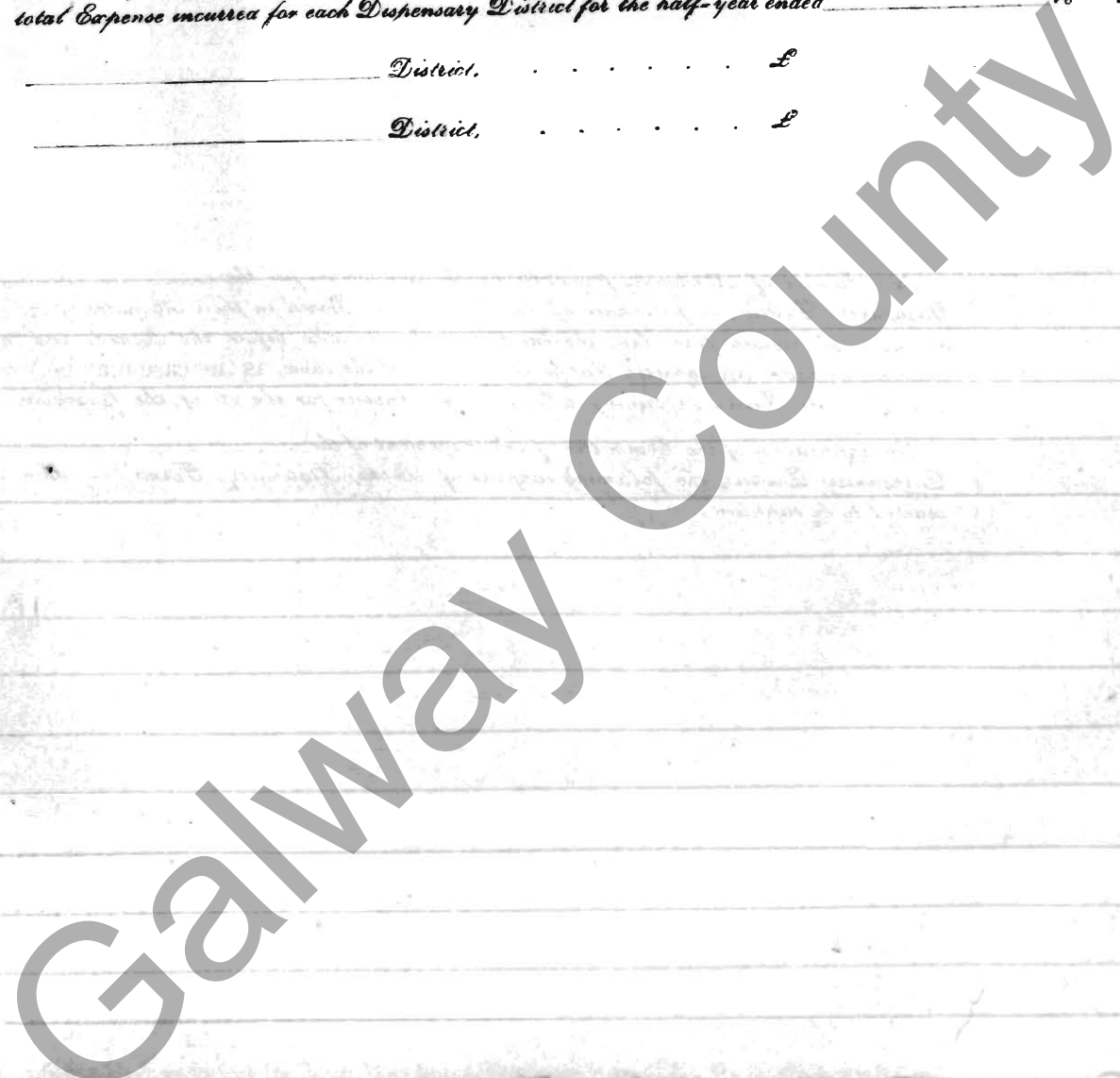
