

I have the honor to acknowledge receipt of copy of yours letter and also copy of your minute on the short supply of milk to your workhouse -

I regret exceedingly that you have such just grounds of complaint both as to deficiency of supply and its too late delivery. I beg to assure you that I am doing everything in my power to try and set up a full supply of milk. I would gladly pay any price for milk if I could get it to buy. but a single quart is not to be had here -

my cows recovered quickly from the foot and mouth disease. but they do entirely eat their milk. that I have found it impossible to bring them on

on again to milk anything worth
the name of milk. Many of my new
calved cows have got sick from
I believe too liberal feeding in the
main endeavour to force milk from
them - I cannot get a good cow
to purchase. I bought several
and have found them an entire
failure - I have a good man
to calve which I hope will be
dropping from this out. and I shall
do all I can to send a nice
supply of milk.
