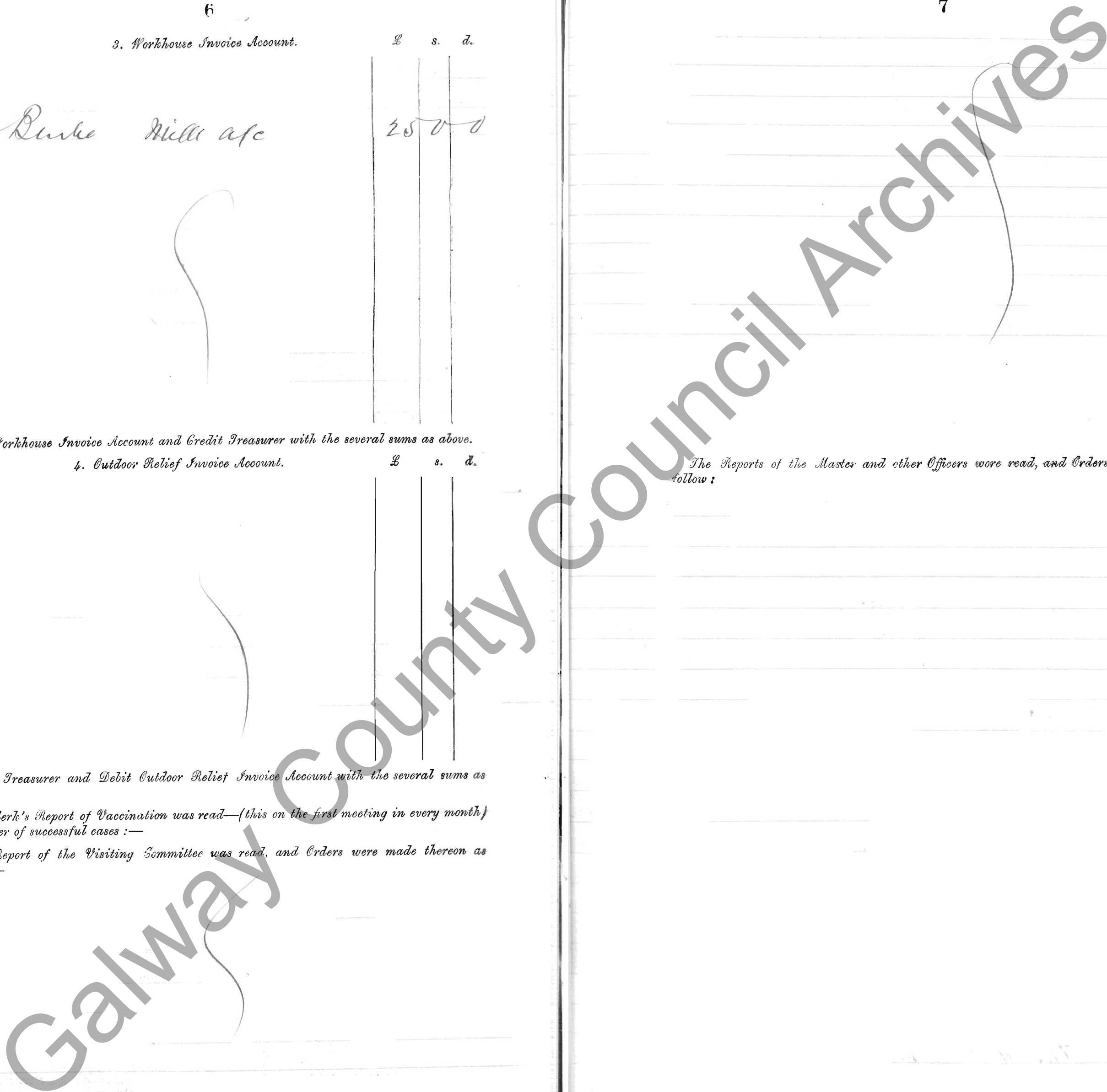

The guardians consider that as those people reside in the immediate locality - the amount of expenses in each case should be still further reduced to one half the amount allowed in each case - that no expenses ought to be paid to Stephen and Mary Copps or Bridget Lydon who brought the charges against the Relieving Officer and which they failed to sustain. We respectfully request the Local Government Board will reconsider the matter. The principle of the payment of witnesses of persons bringing charges which they fail to sustain should be discouraged.

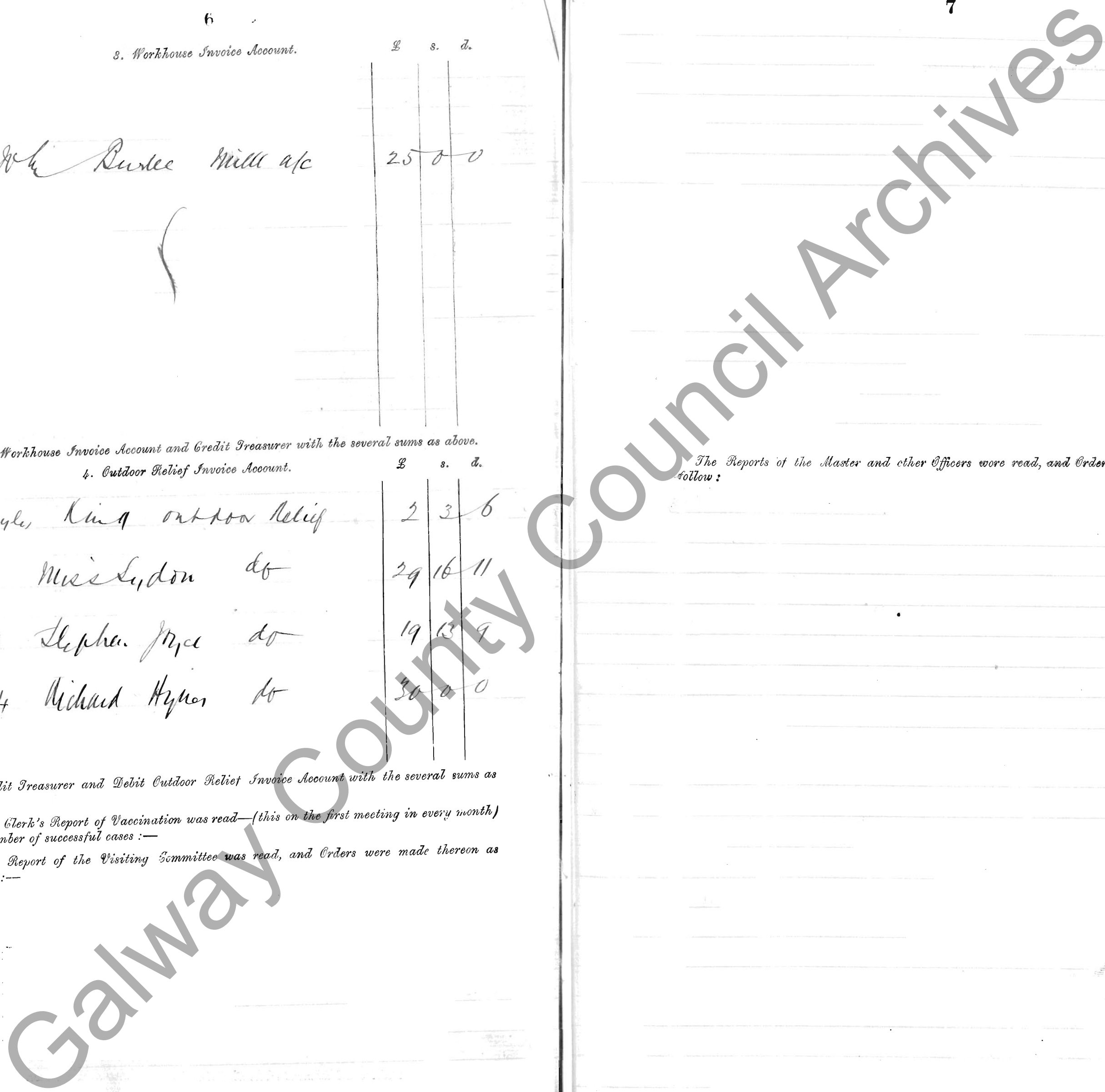
