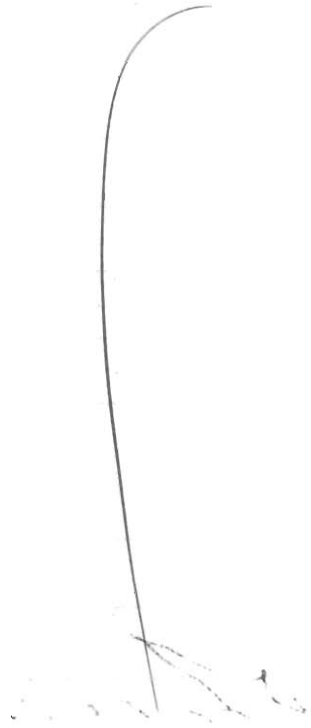

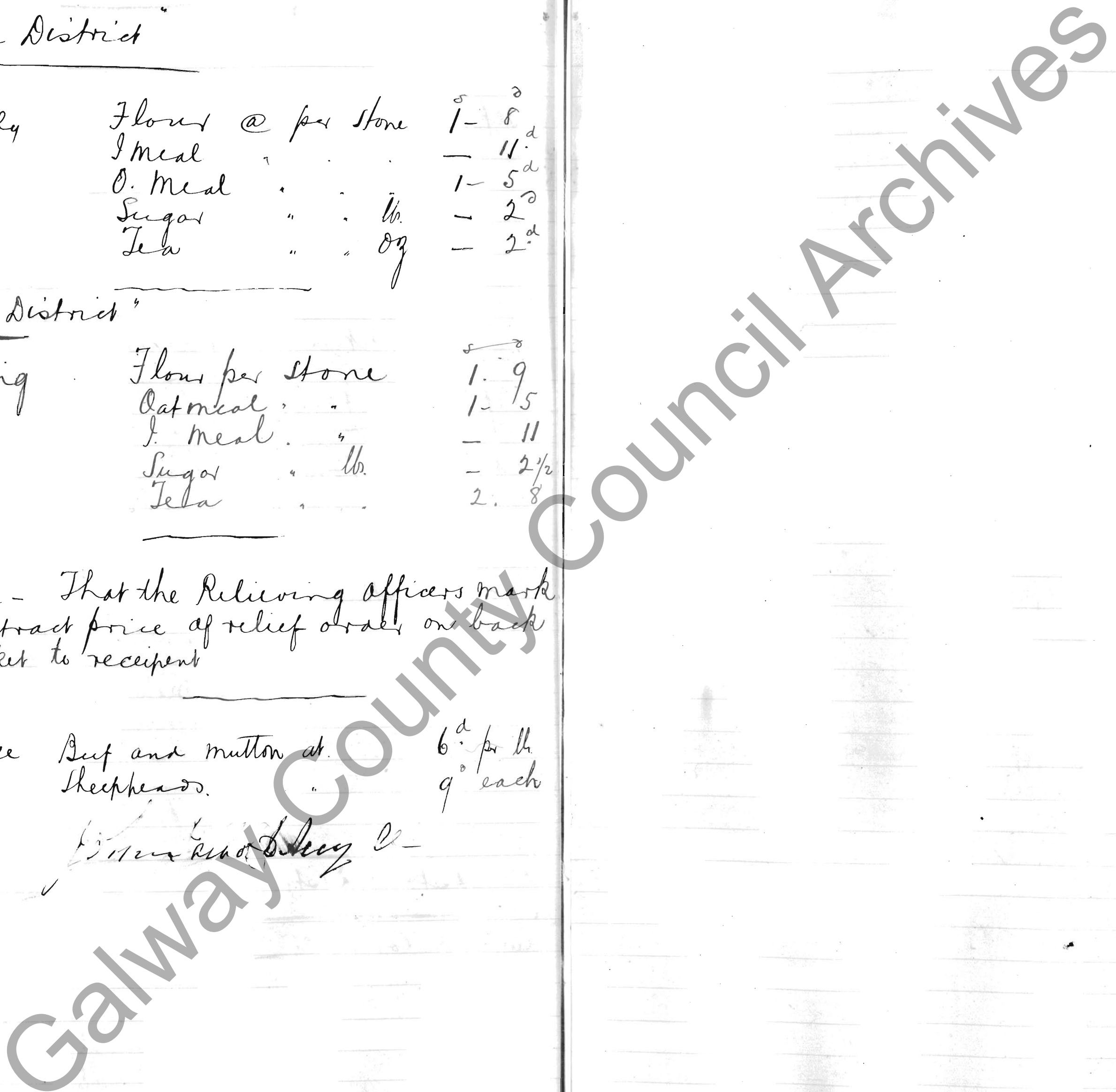

With reference to Local Government Board Letter N^o 17250 Dated 3rd May 1889 - on the subject of Mr. Michael Lyden's explanation of a Complaint made against him as collector of Seed Rate, by Mr. Cornelius King. I beg to state that having examined the several cases referred to - it appears that Michael Kelly paid two instalments of seed rate, the second instalment being put in

the poor Rate Column of the warrant, and in bringing forward the arrears credit was not given, although it appears to have been entered on the warrant abstract Book and lodged with Union Treasurers - at the time of voting Kelly was not charged for the two instalments referred to.

John O'Donnell's case is similar to that of Mr. Kelly - Mr. Lyden states that to the best of his belief O'Donnell or any person on his behalf did not produce the seed Rate receipt sent forward by Mr. King but he told O'Donnell, that if he subsequently found an overcharge, he would refund him the money.

In the case of Pat Lydon of Aillebrack he appears to have paid three instalments of seed Rate which are duly entered and lodged, but Mr. Lyden states he inadvertently returned Pat Lydon as owing £1: 10: 8 instead of $7\frac{5}{8}$ the actual sum due.
