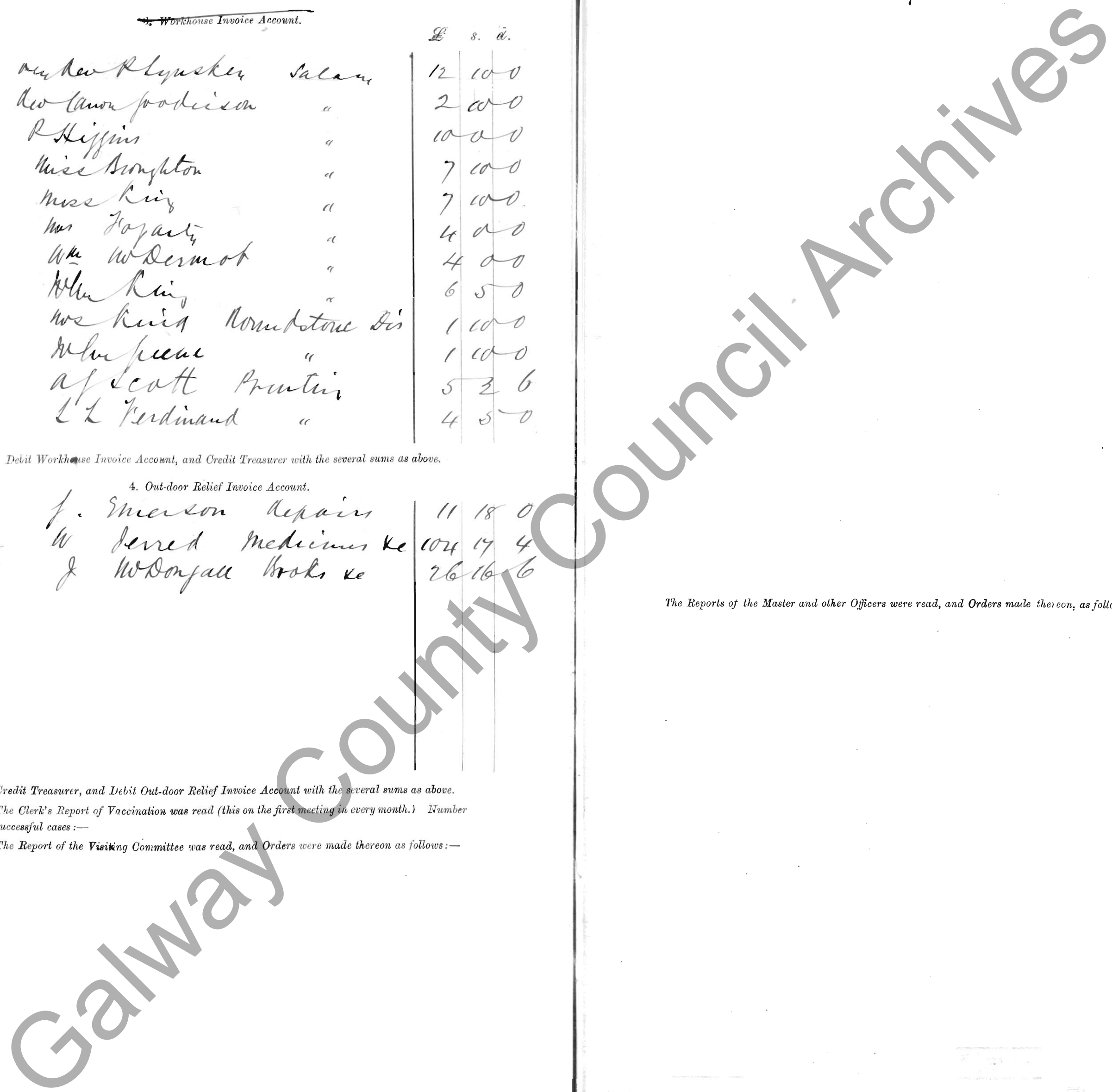

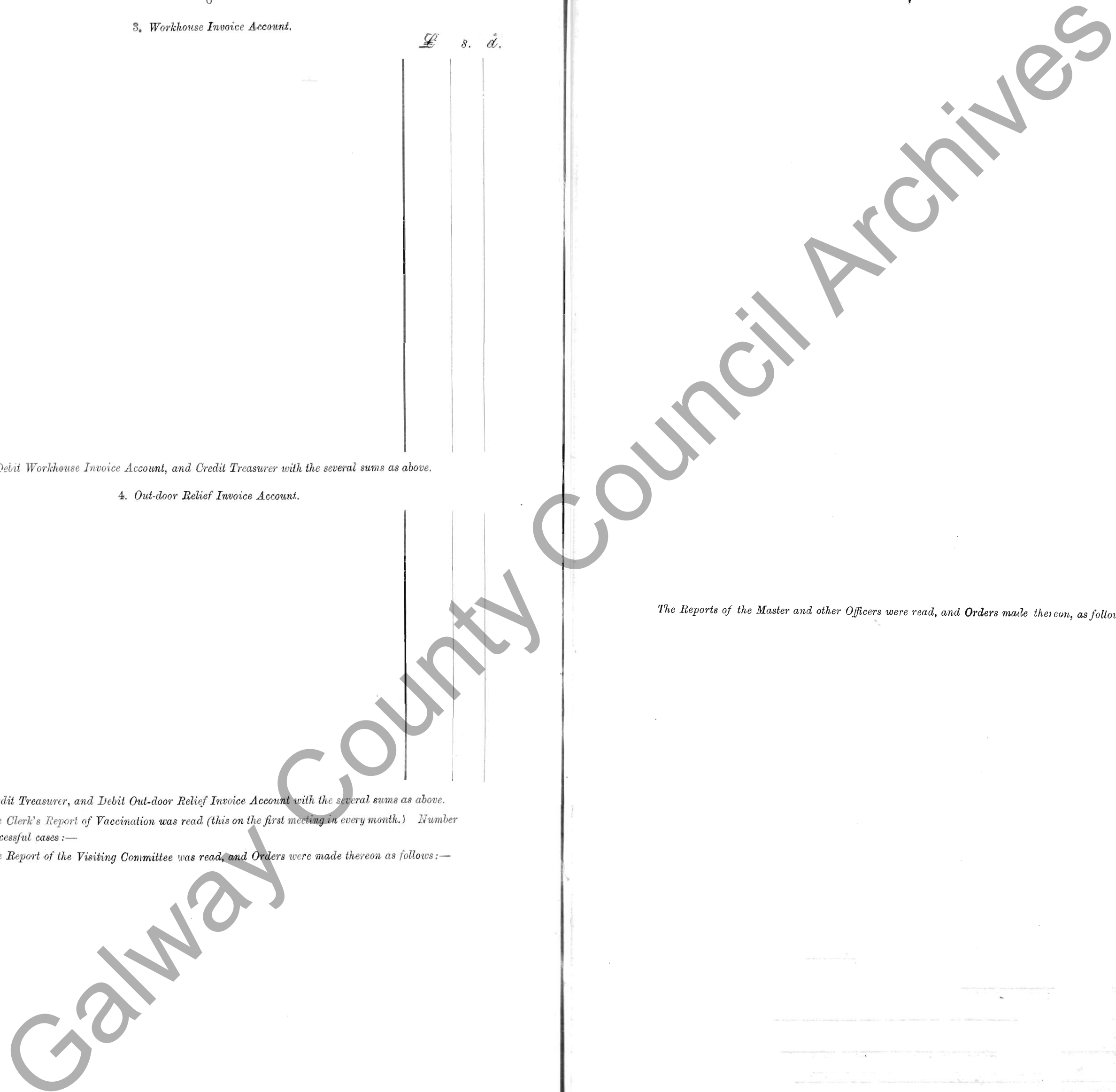

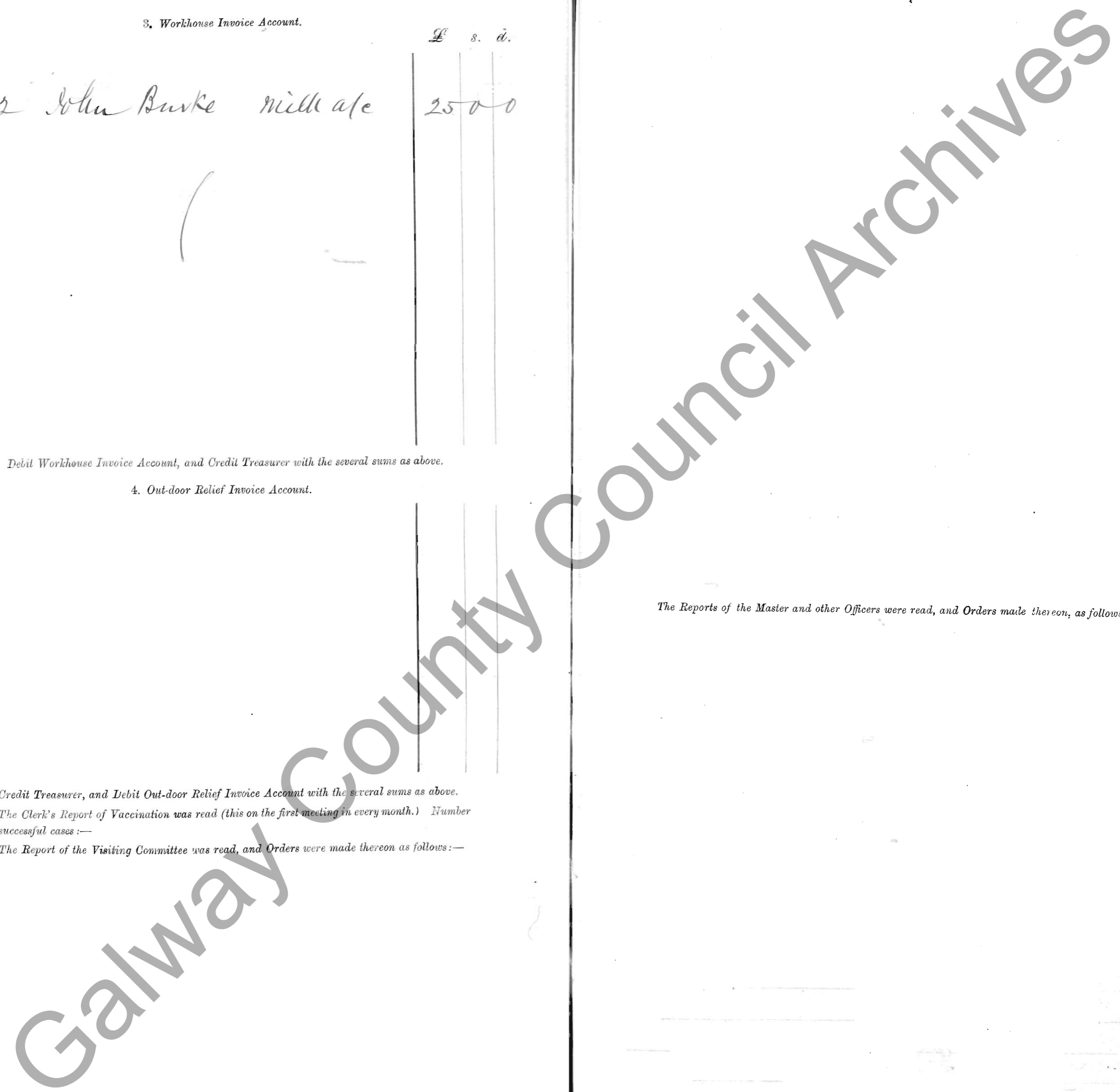

Gentlemen —

I beg to bring under your notice and to
recommend for your serious and immediate
consideration the wide-spread prevalence of
destitution in all Electoral Divisions in my
District, owing to the low price and the slack
demand for small cattle, to the severe and
extensive injury to the oat crop, and the almost
total failure of the potatoe crop. The resources
of the people are far more limited than they
have been within my recollection. All crops
yield this year a far less return than they
did in '79 or '85 the two bad years of which
I had official knowledge. In addition
to the general destitution and the very gloomy
prospect that exists throughout the District,
there are particular places where owing to the
failure of the crops comparatively worse
complete hunger and destitution have appeared
earliest and in a most aggravated form.

The districts to which in this respect I would
wish to draw your special attention are Baskin,
Armaghewagh, Gushen and Litter in the Renyfe
Division. In those places there are many
poor people who since last Board-day have
made

made to me many pressing applications for
Relief. I know they are in a most destitute
condition and stand in immediate need

Gentlemen

I do not feel able to allow the sudden death of your much valued clerk, and my much esteemed friend - to pass by without sending a few lines expressive of my own deep regret and at the same time of my profound sense of the irreparable loss which you and indeed the whole of the Union have sustained by this much to be deplored event. -

I have had the happiness to be associated with my late friend for upwards of ten years in various efforts made for the relief and benefit of the poor of your Union - my acquaintance with Mr. Burke began in 1880 at a time when widely spread

spread distress existed, in the relief of which both in this and the following year, I was able to give him some assistance - In 1882 when by a minute of the Clifton Guardians assistance to those wishing to Emigrate was voted, as well as in the following years 1883-4. I found Mr. Burke's services invaluable in this work, nor is it too much to say, that without him it would have been impossible to have carried out a work which conferred so great a benefit on many hundreds of your people. - In 1886 when the partial failure of the potatoe crop in your Union made the supply of new seeds necessary, Mr. Burke devoted himself to this non-official work with his accustomed energy, and no year since up to the present one has passed in which in one way or other your lamented clerk has not to my knowledge cheerfully and willingly given up his time in efforts for the benefit of the poor of your Union - In thus looking back to the cordial assistance which Mr. Burke has at all times afforded me. I feel it to be both my duty as well as a pleasure to ask you to allow me to place on record my grateful sense of the invaluable services which apart from his official duty he has rendered to the poor and indeed to every rate-payer in the Union. You who have been associated with him in the charge of the Clifton Union, can even better than myself bear witness to the ability and fidelity of purpose with which he has served the Board and there is I feel assured no poor man

or woman in the Union who has not regarded Mr. Burke as his or her true friend. -

The death of Mr. Burke comes upon you at a moment when his intimate knowledge of the people and the wide experience of past years are especially required in the face of some impending distress, and a wise choice of a successor is of the utmost importance - Although it will not be possible to find one with equal experience and judgment - will you allow me to express my sincere and earnest hope that you may be able to select one who will prove worthy of his predecessor and serve you with a similar ability and the independent uprightnes so marked in Mr. Burke's character.
