

They Clamowred for food and because they felt the rong of hunger as much as those who were directed to be put on the works, there Were no relief works at all engaged in, and thus, that time, there was no effort to relieve the famine of the people who were then Mognised by the Government to be in want, for to bring relief to those who then complained So bitterly and So loudly. This Electoral Division is undoubtedly the poorest in the Clifden Union. It is rated higher than any other Electoral Division in Said Union. There are only 29 rate payers in the Devision while at this moment there are 251 persons on out-downelies. 
