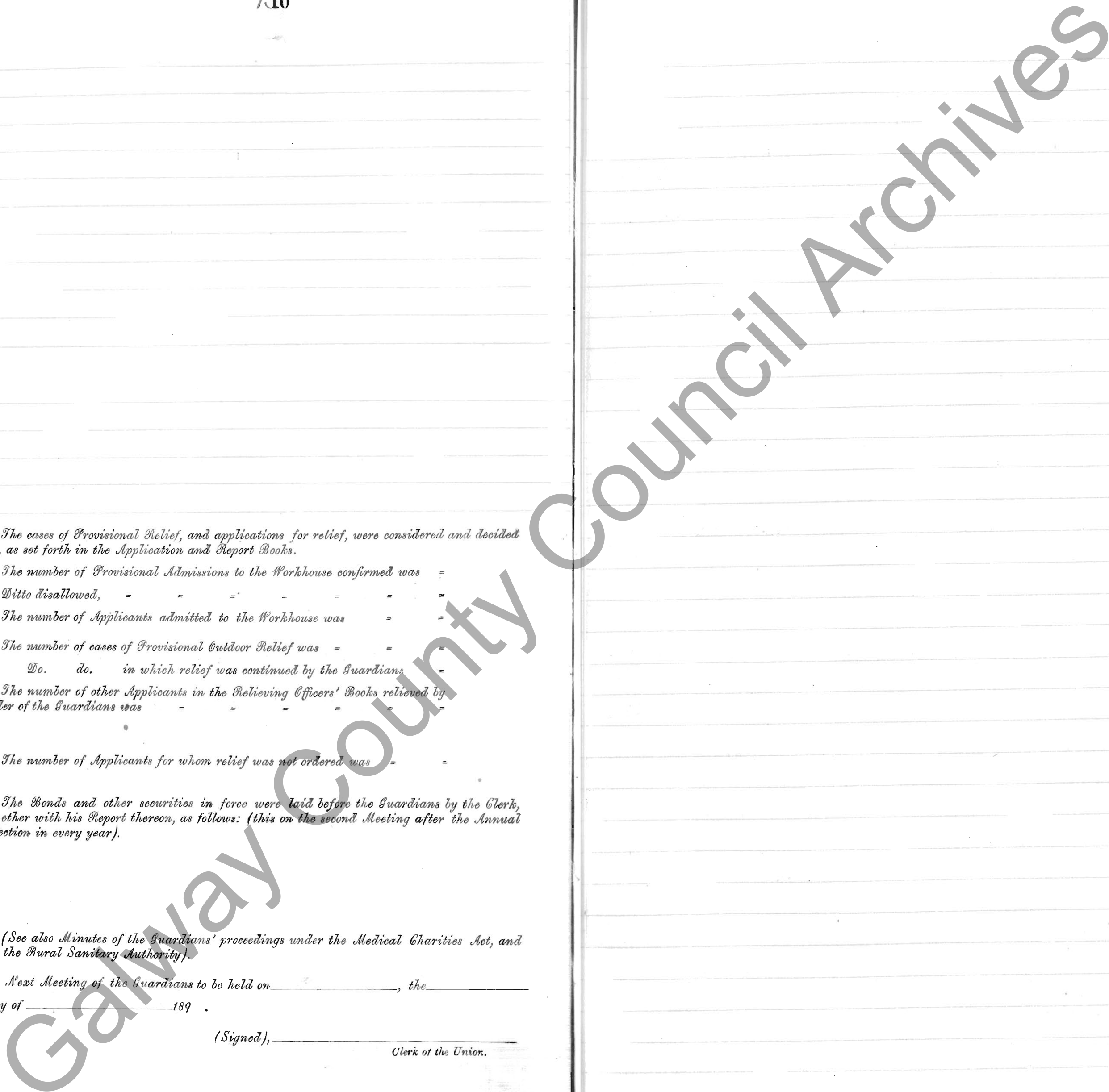

The collection of the two rates is not satisfactory  
especially in regards the Sewer Instalment which should  
have been paid to the Board of works on the 1<sup>st</sup>  
of August:— Mr. Michael Lydon has a heavy  
outstanding amount both of Sewer and Poor Rate and  
should lodge more regularly the monies he  
collects.

The provisions by resolution calls may  
attention to their "Rulings" in out door Relief cases  
in Leppan and Renville Electoral Divisions in  
Mr. Joyce's district— The "Rulings" were "Repeals"

to sanction by initials of the presiding Chairman  
the relief which in summary cases had been  
given "in kind" in urgent cases on  
his own responsibility by the Relieving officer— This  
officer is responsible for the lives of the people  
and has power to give relief in urgent cases  
for one week and to report to the Board at  
their first meeting after such relief. It has been  
ruled by the L. G. B. that the Relieving officer  
can make a fresh case by visiting each week  
subject to his satisfying me on oath, that he considers  
the persons lives were in danger if he did not  
give the relief— In all these cases Mr. Joyce swore  
that he felt obliged in the discharge of his duties  
and to preserve life to give the relief, and  
I would incur grave responsibility if I refused  
to disbelieve his statement and punished him by  
disallowing the expenditure I have therefore  
passed the amounts— He was certainly not too  
liberal in the distribution of relief to save life for  
he only gave food to amount of 1/6 a week to  
persons he was relieving and 3/4 a week to a  
family of 7.

Since my appointment as Teacher I have done everything that could be done in the way of instructing the children in the different branches of Education, needlework, knitting &c. I trust with entire satisfaction of your Board and that my absence from the examination was not through any fault of mine I will present myself at the next examination to be held for classification of Teachers.

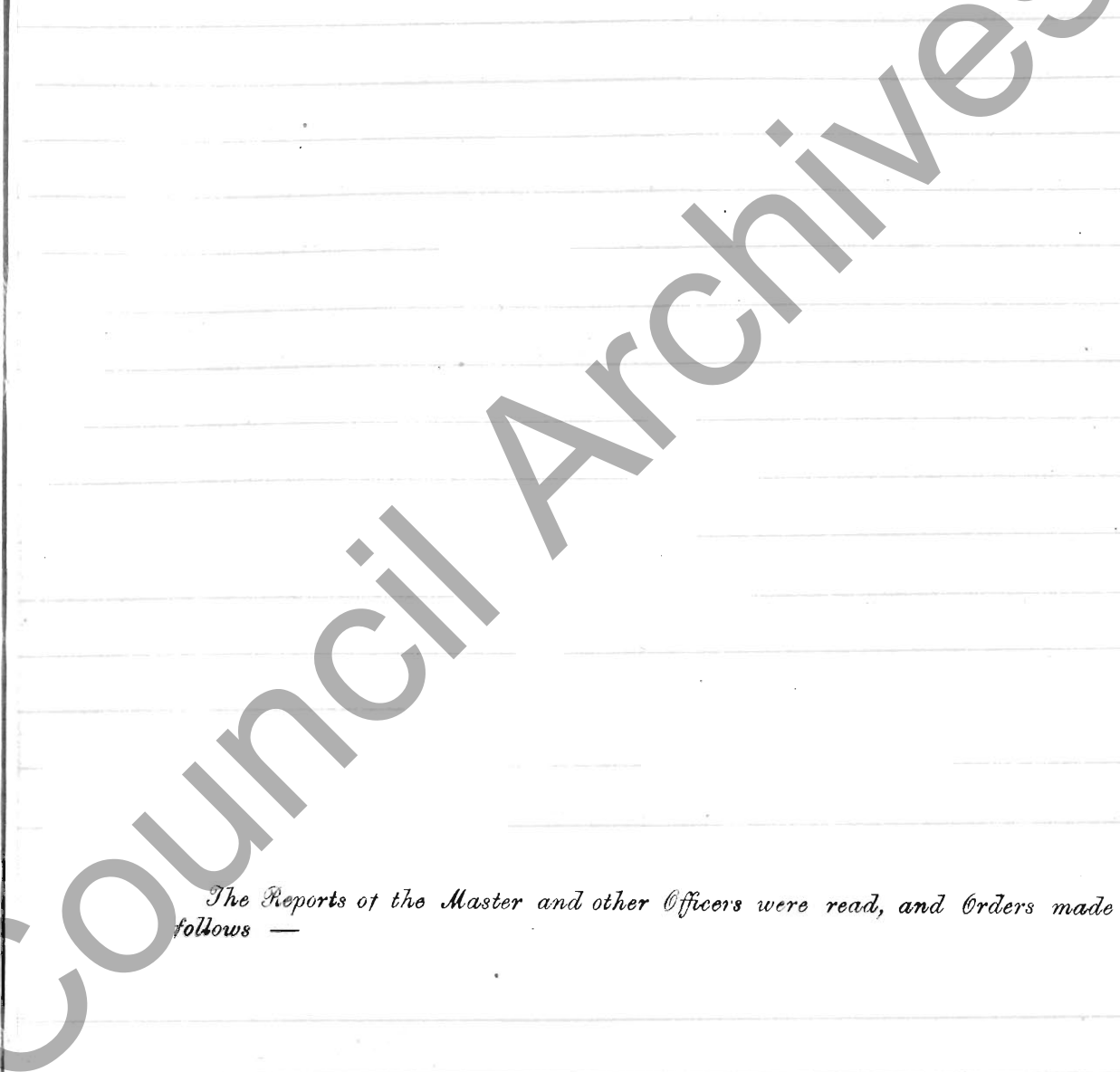

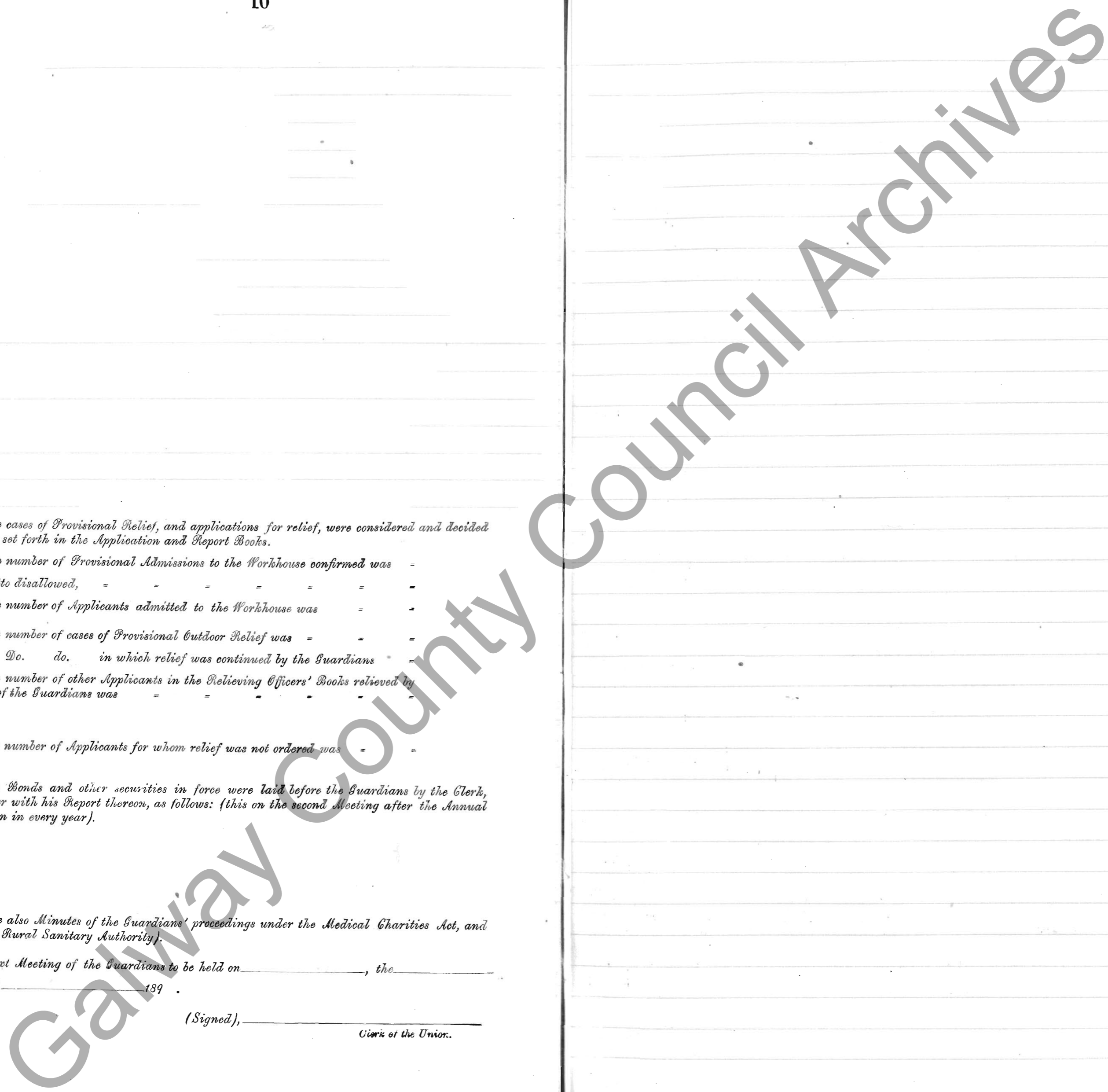
