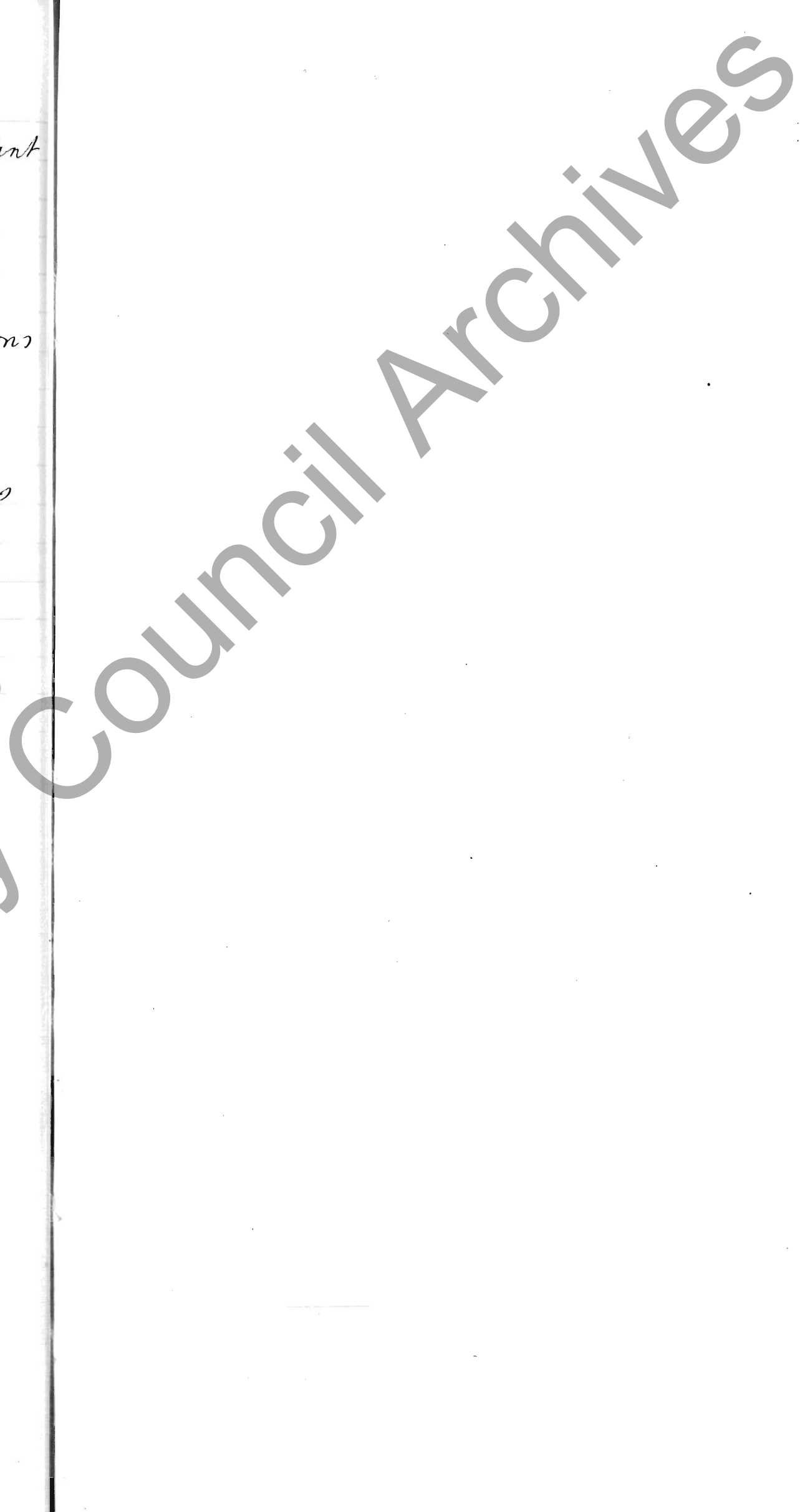

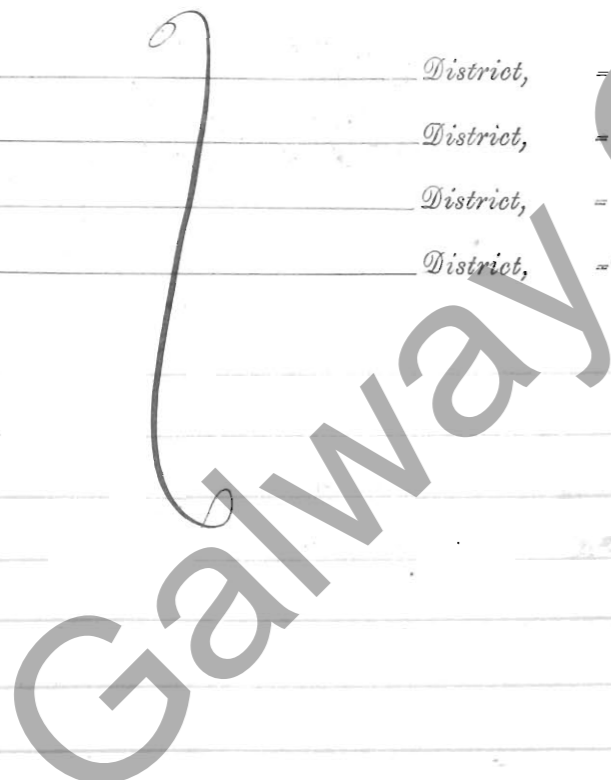

Resolved, That the Board of Guardians of the Clipden Union desire most respectfully to call the attention of the Right Hon John Mosley M.P. Chief Secretary for Ireland to a balance of debt incurred by them under the Relief of distress act of 1886 when  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the whole population of the Union were in absolute want. The grant to the Union under the act was entirely inadequate to meet the widespread distress existing and the poverty of the Union is so great that it is simply impossible to pay the large balance due. The Guardians have every year added 18 or 20 per cent to the already high poundage rate of the Union to pay the debt but it is of no avail. The Guardians hope and earnestly request the Right Hon the Chief Secretary will come to their assistance and from the funds at his disposal make them a grant to pay off the debt. The poor shopkeepers who supplied the meal to the Guardians have never been paid and are simply ruined.
