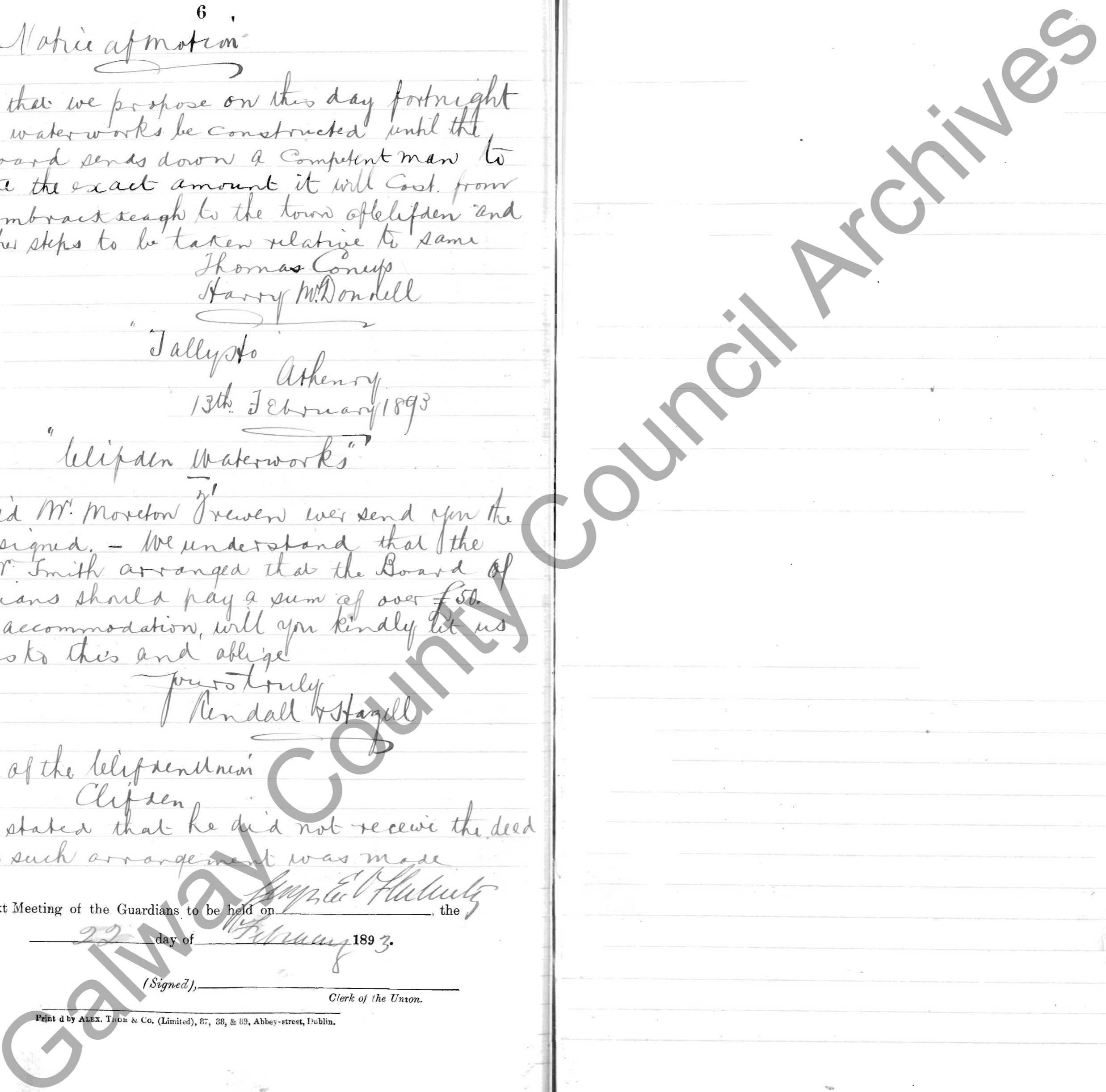

A man named John Hynes of Leashleen attended before the Committee who got a visiting ticket on the 17<sup>th</sup> December 1891 No 511 and was cancelled at a meeting held on 6<sup>th</sup> January 1893. Hynes states he is a very poor man and submits his ticket should not be cancelled. He states he has two old cows and three calves and that if he brought them to all the fairs in the County he would not get £5 for them and he further states that he owes debts £4 and rent £3. He states the medical officer told him he had cancer and that he could do nothing for him and that he should go to Hospital whereas it turned out he had no such disease. He states, too, he was for a considerable time very ill and the medical officer called only on one other occasion when he was passing through the village. The Committee are of opinion the ticket should not be cancelled. Ticket No 357 was a black ticket and the Committee take no notice of it. 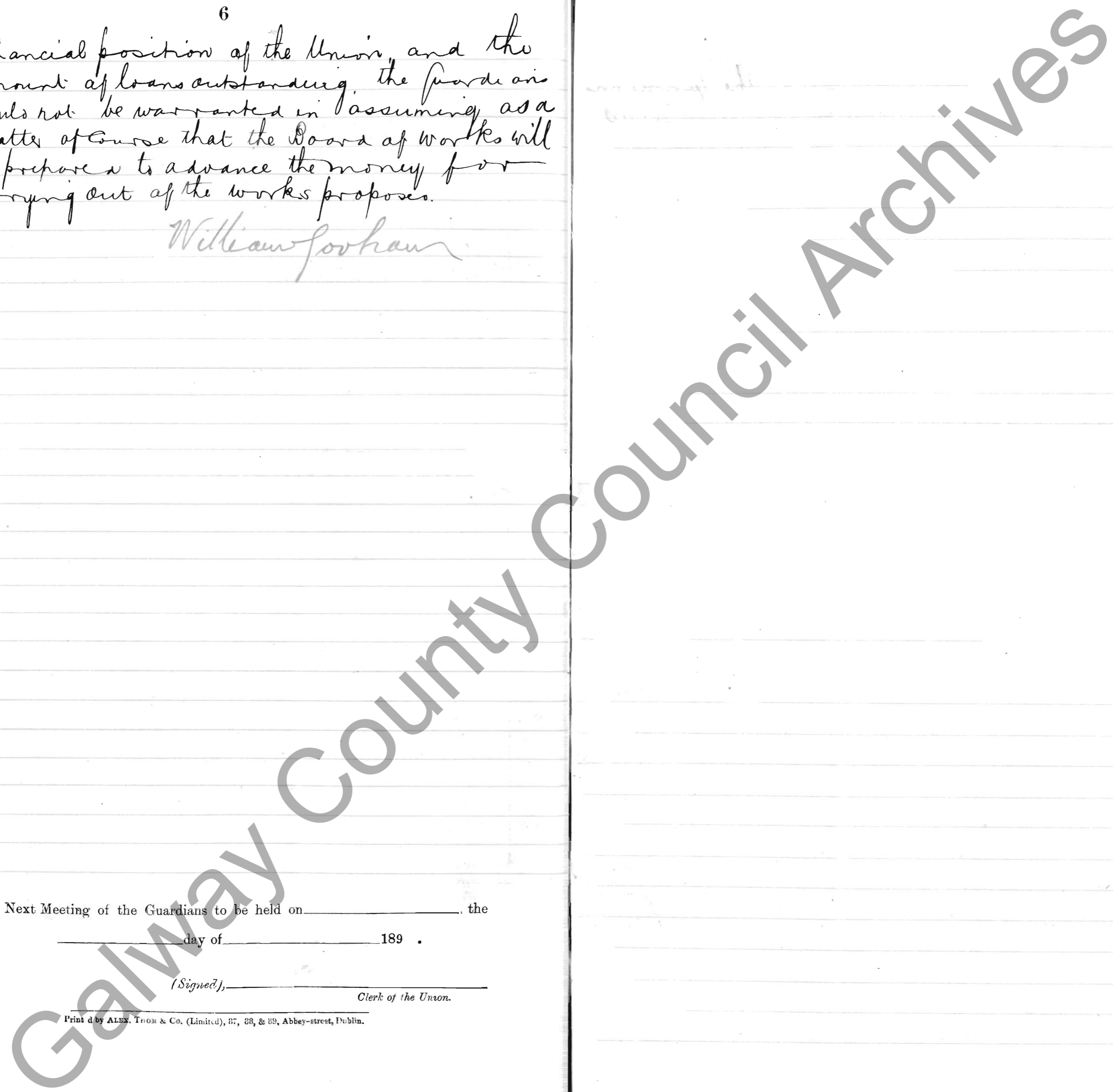

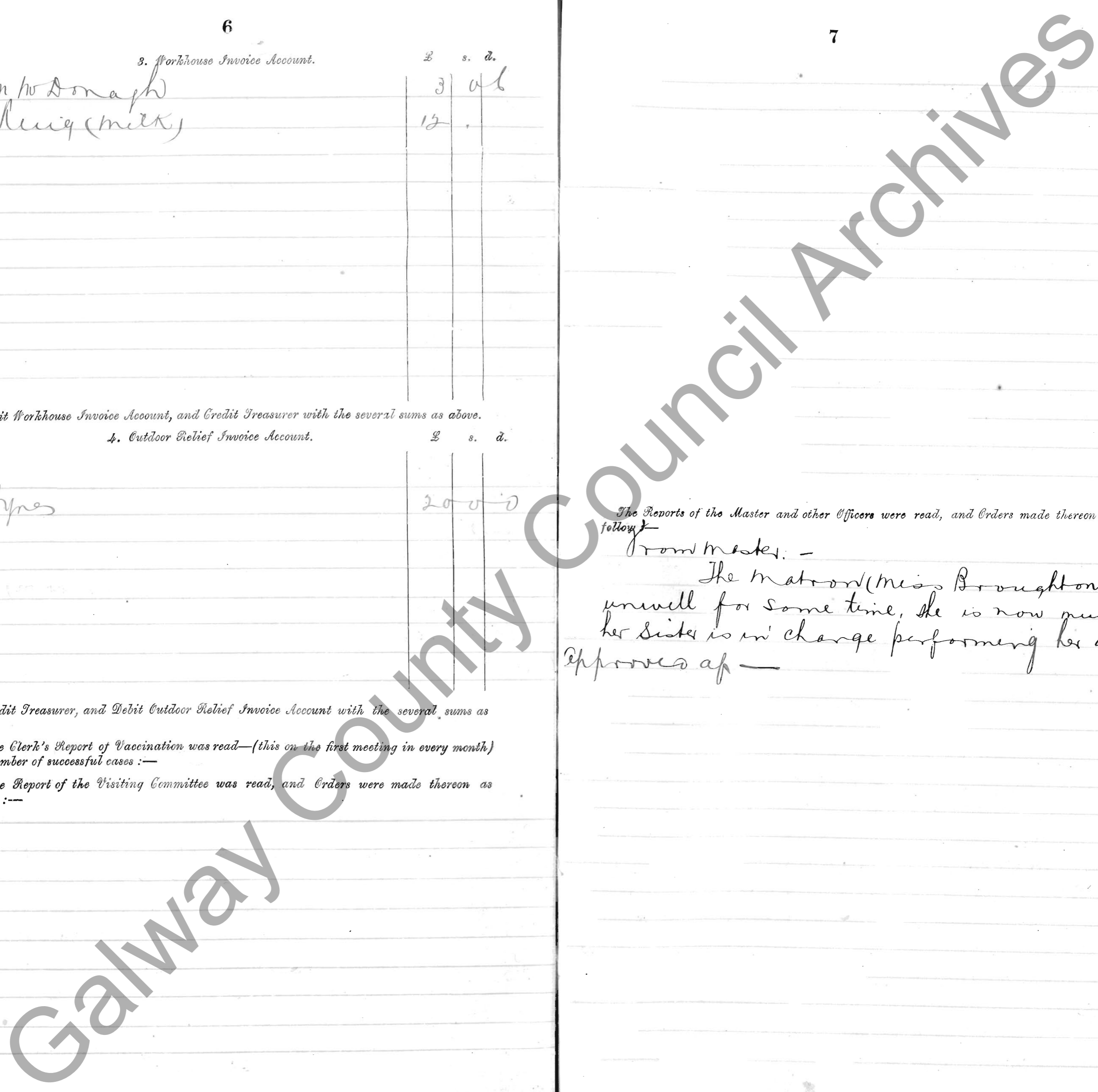

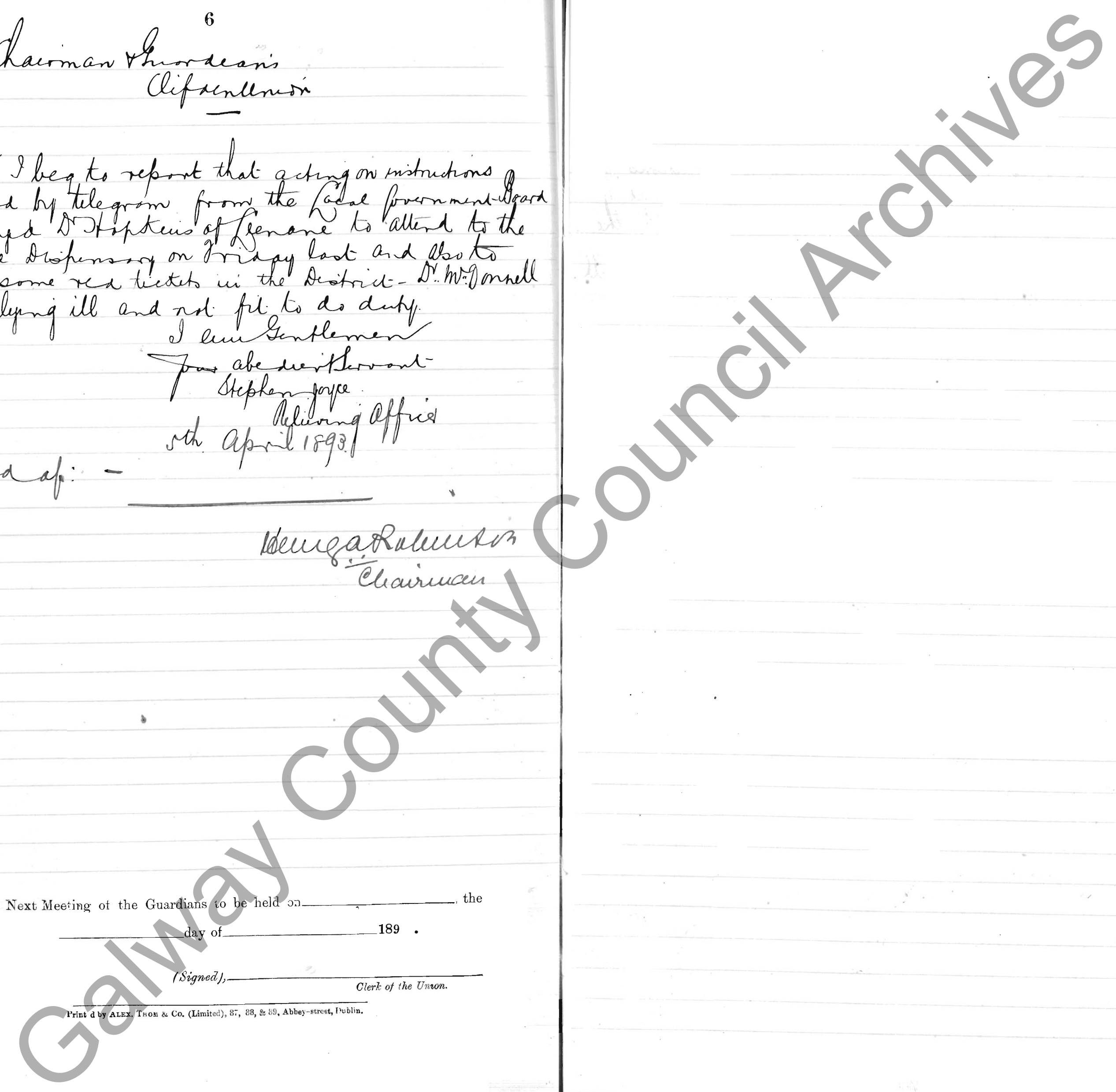
