Your letter of the 24<sup>th</sup> ult. has been under the consideration of the Directors, who desire me to

point out to you that under the terms of our "Agreements to Guarantee" in these cases we have nothing whatever to do with the Collection of the Rates and that we are only liable to make good any loss that may arise to the persons by reason of fraud or dishonesty on the part of the employed as Collectors of Rates, amounting to embezzlement of money. — It is an every day matter for Insurance Companies to afford Suretyship for the honesty of Tax and Rate Collectors but they would never guarantee that rates would be paid by ratepayers. —

I am further instructed to draw the attention of the Guarantors to the terms of the Agreements and to point out that they have failed to keep up the fortnightly checks upon the accounts stated to the questions 9 & 10 of the proposals and which are incorporated in the Agreements to guarantee. — The Directors cannot consent to or concur in (either as regards the past or the future) any prolongation of the time allowed for balancing the accounts or the payment of monies which have been received by the Collectors or to any other departure from the terms of the Contract.

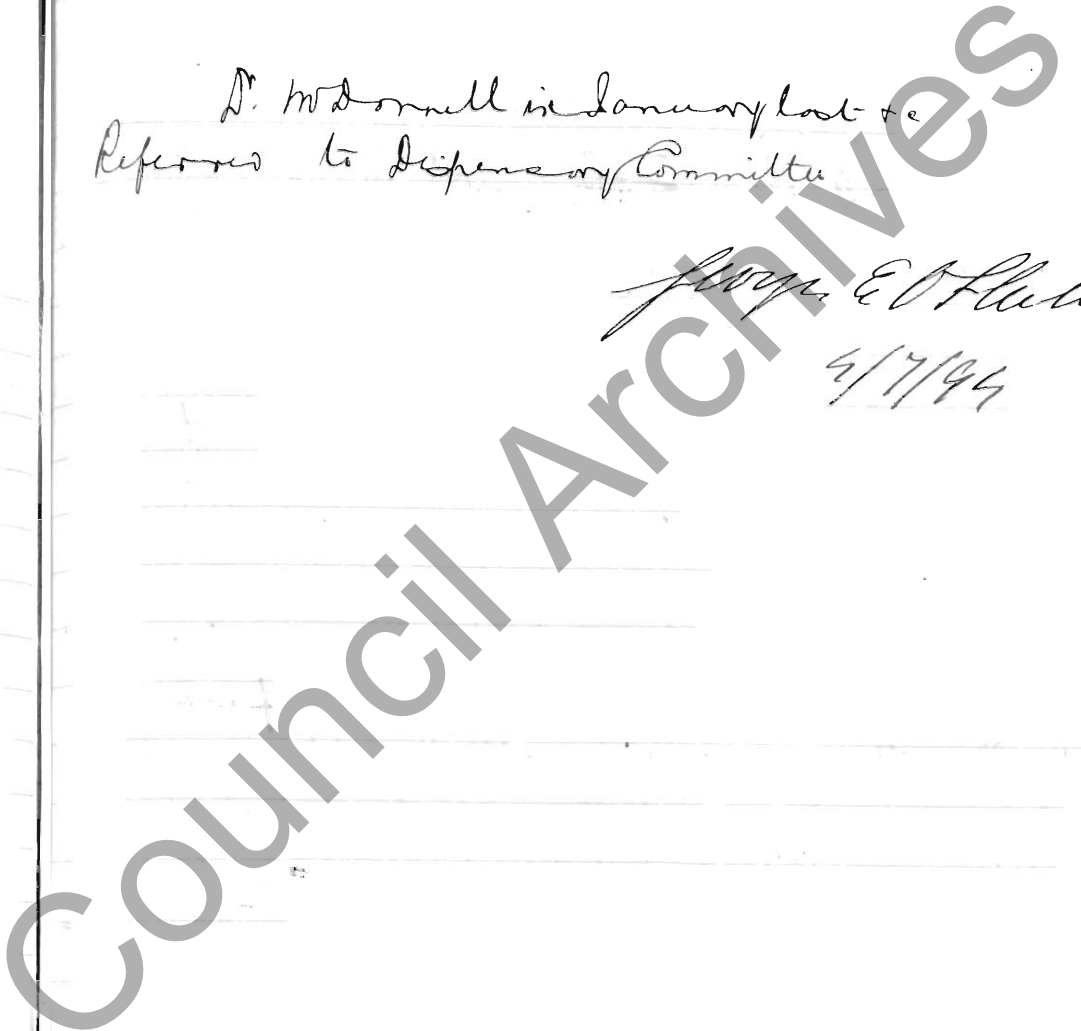

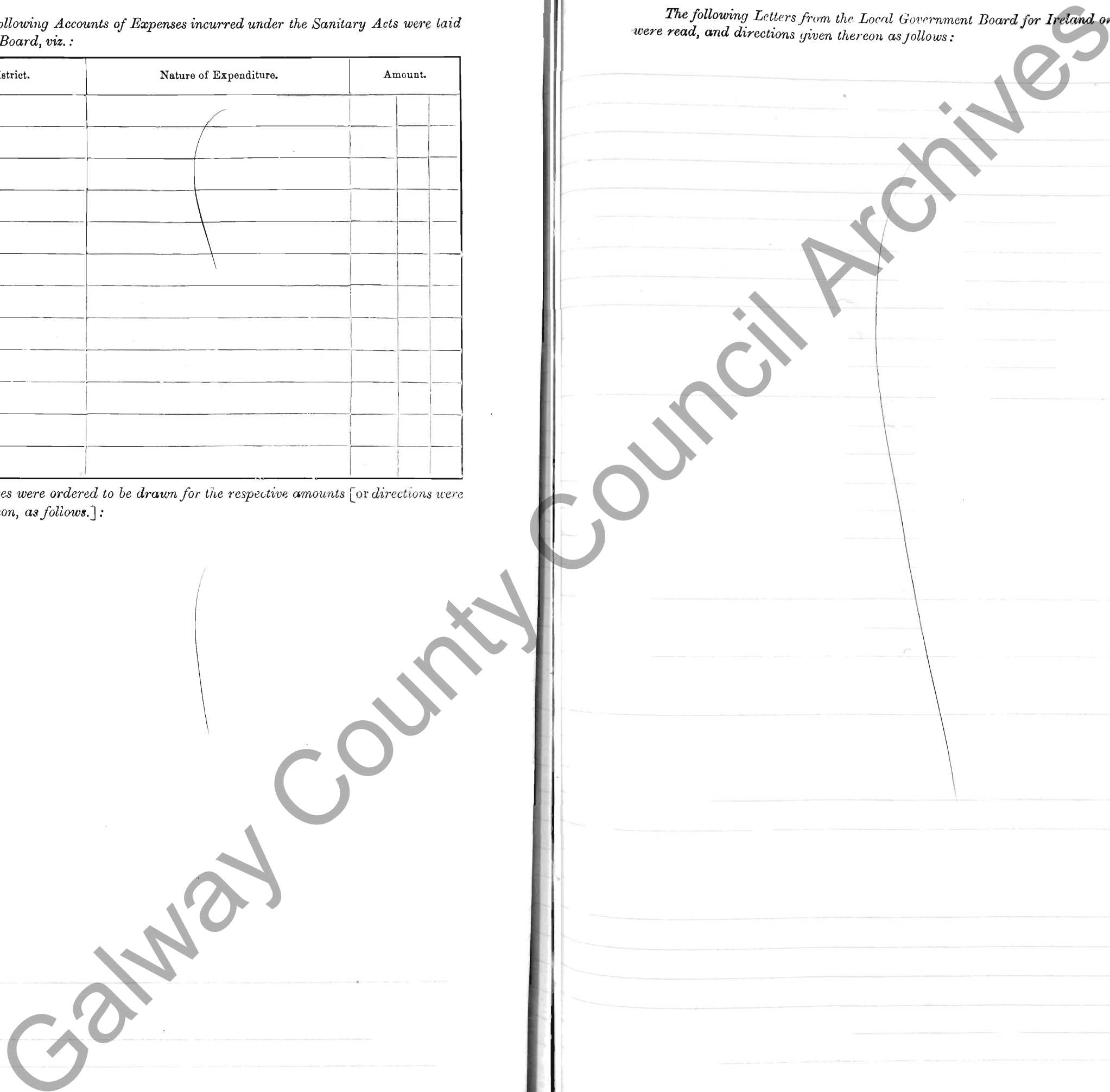

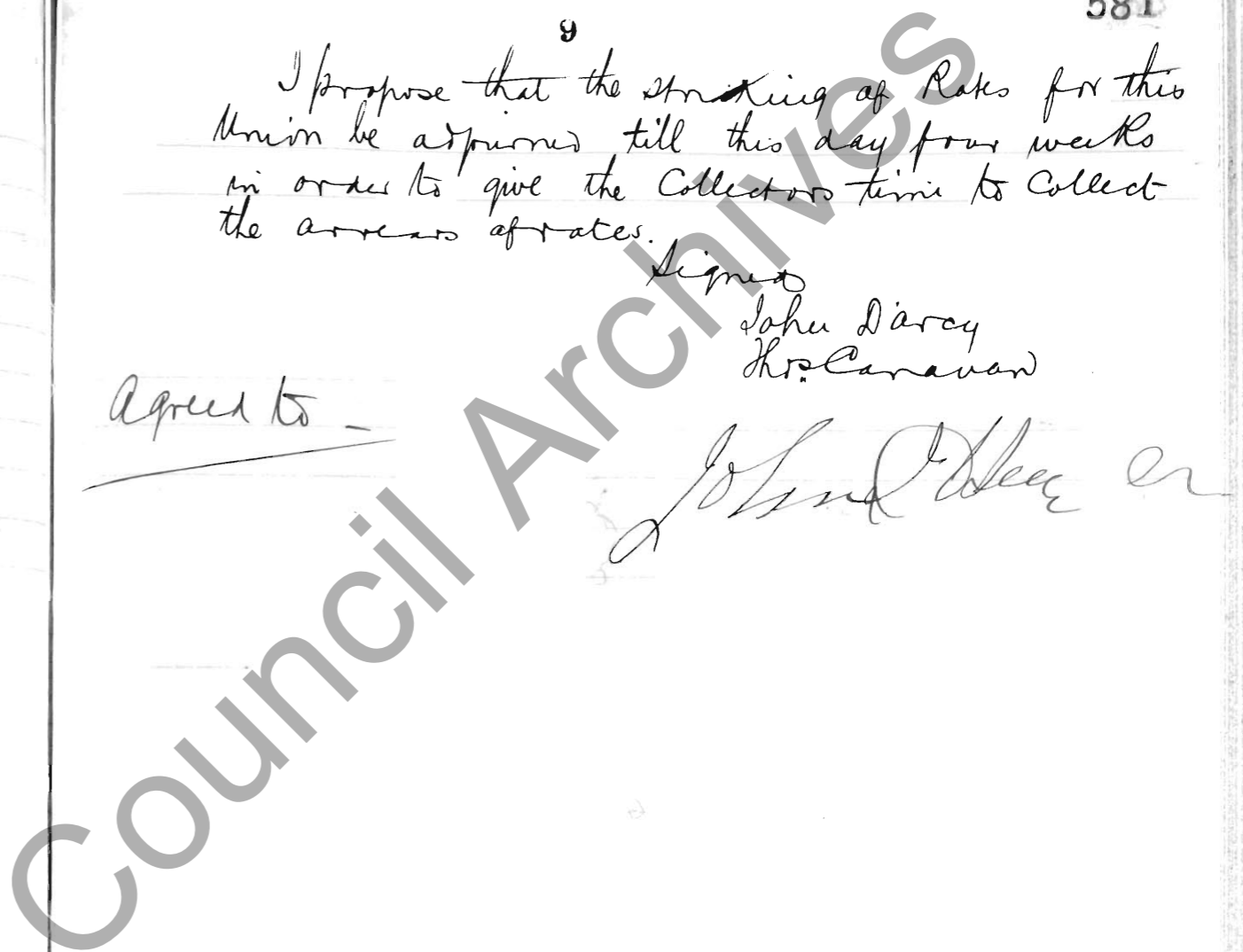
