I beg to report to you that there is a sink or drain in Tully village, the shore from which passes under the public road, has got blocked up and the water in the sink has become putrid and is a standing menace to the public health. The Rev. Father Lavelle complained to me on Sunday of the horrid stench from it. The shore should be opened and cleaned.

There is another shore a little further on

passing under the road which is supposed to receive the surface water from the gutters, but it has also got blocked up and is rendered quite useless; it should be opened and cleaned like the other. Father Spaville also mentioned a well on the roadside near the Coastguard Station which ought to have a protection wall around it and to be cleaned out and lime put into it at least twice a year.

I reported to your Board a few years ago about a well on the roadside in Letterfrack containing sewage water and which I feared was being used for domestic purposes by the Villagers living in the immediate vicinity and up to the present no action has been taken in the matter by the sanitary Authority nor in my humble opinion will there until an epidemic of Typhoid fever breaks out
