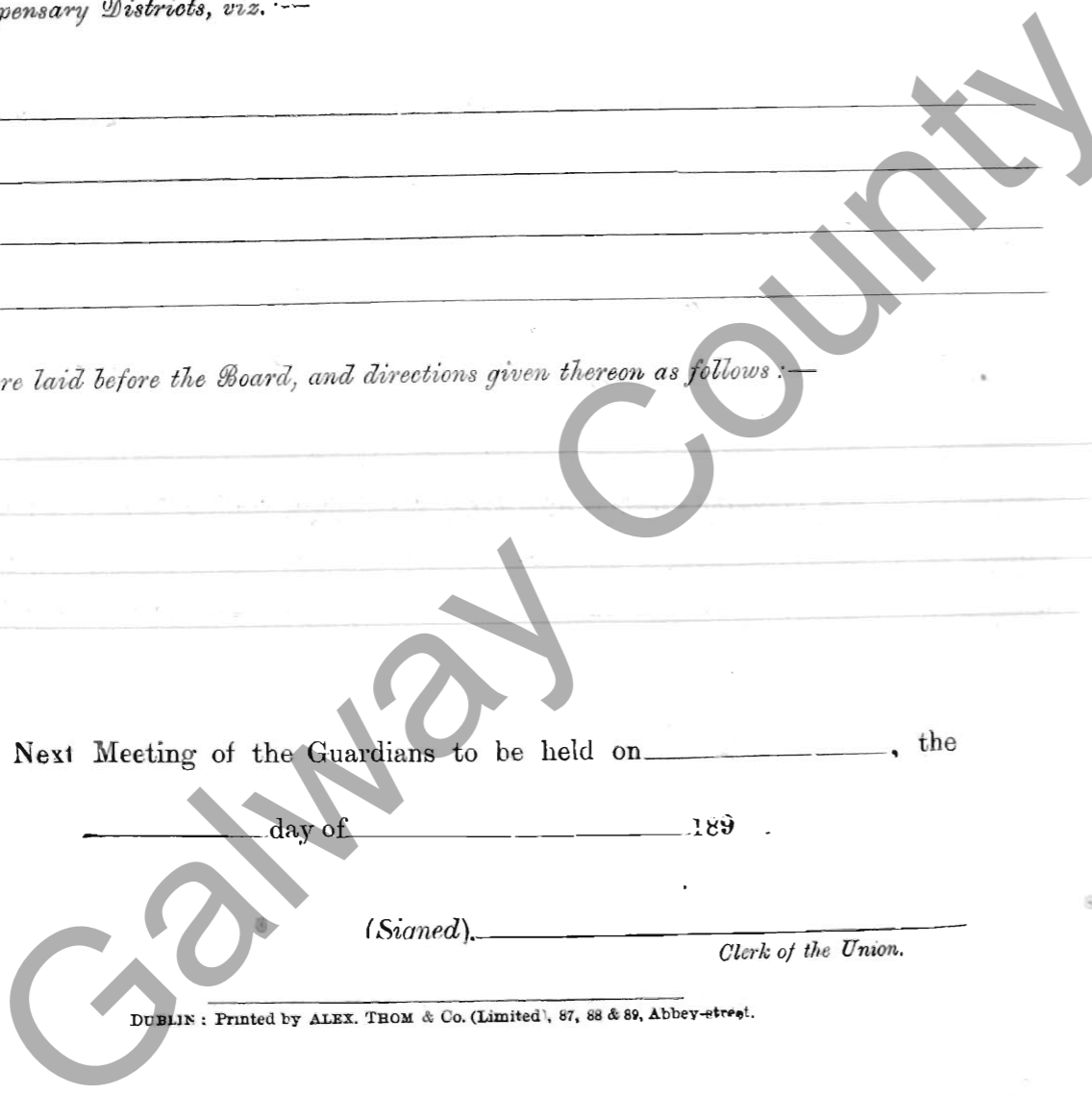

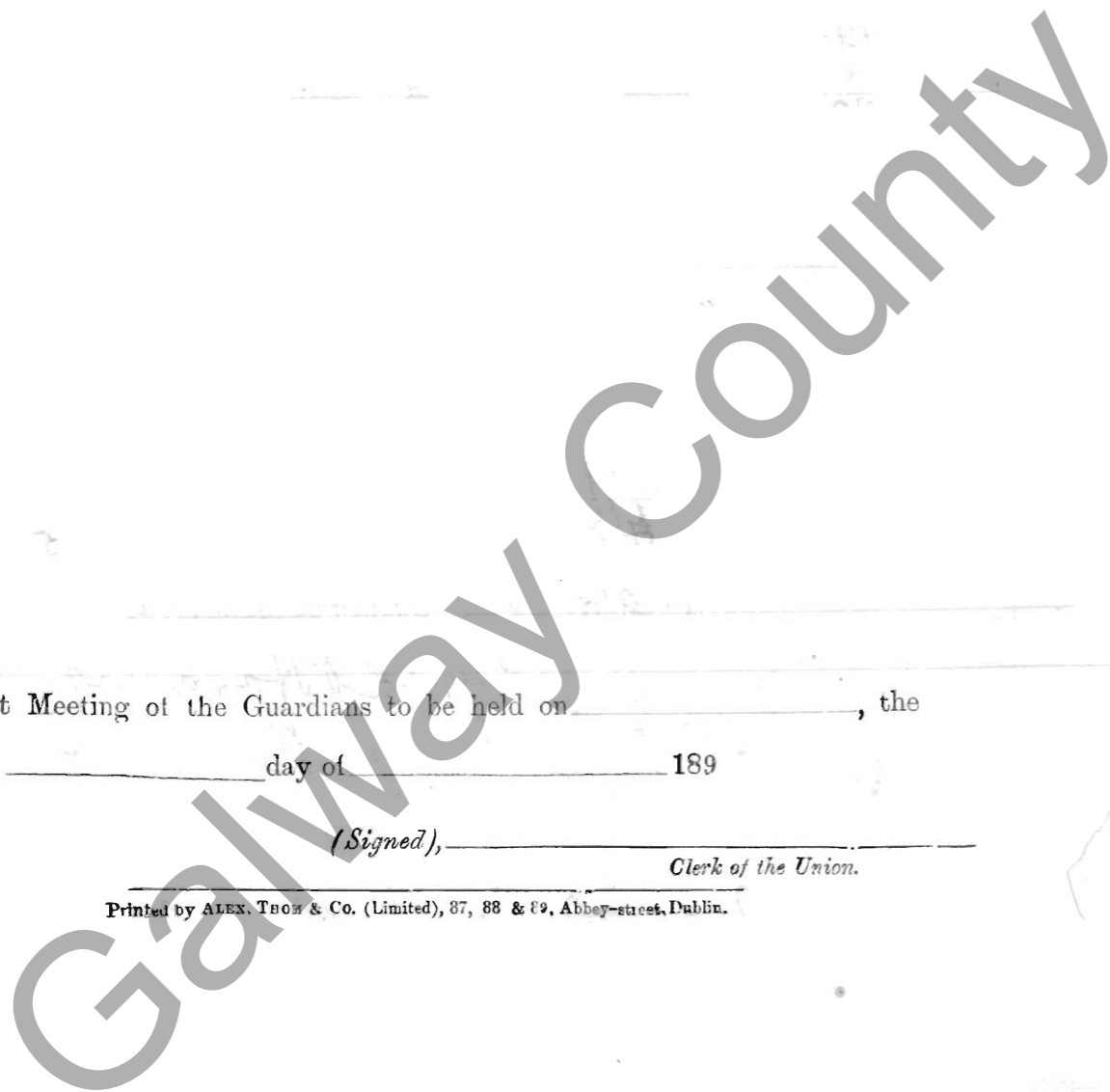

Resolved: We the Guardians the Guardians of the Clifden Union having a deep sense of the inestimable benefits bestowed on our poor Country by Mr. Arthur Balfour during the period he so ably filled the highly responsible position of Secretary for Ireland in making a free grant of £200,000 for the construction of the great Balfour line of rail, feel great pleasure in knowing that a Balfour now holds the same position: We feel no hesitation in bringing the wants and requirements of our people to his notice.

The so called public works carried on in this Country lately have not only been useless but mischievous and waste of public money. The great Balfour line of rail has considerably improved the Commercial position of Clifden.

We would now would ask the Secretary to make a grant of £30,000 for the improvement of our Harbour: - Removing dangerous obstructions



in the inner harbours, extending the Quay and making a deep water dock in the outer harbours.

Sir James Allport reported on the absolute necessity of this work — We would venture therefore to suggest to the Secretary, the desirability of appointing a competent Naval Engineer to examine and report. — We feel entirely assured the matter will meet with the most favourable consideration at the hands of the Secretary. —

We would remark that Sir John Franklen reported favourably near fifty years ago. The Engineer would have every information from the very efficient Harbour Master.

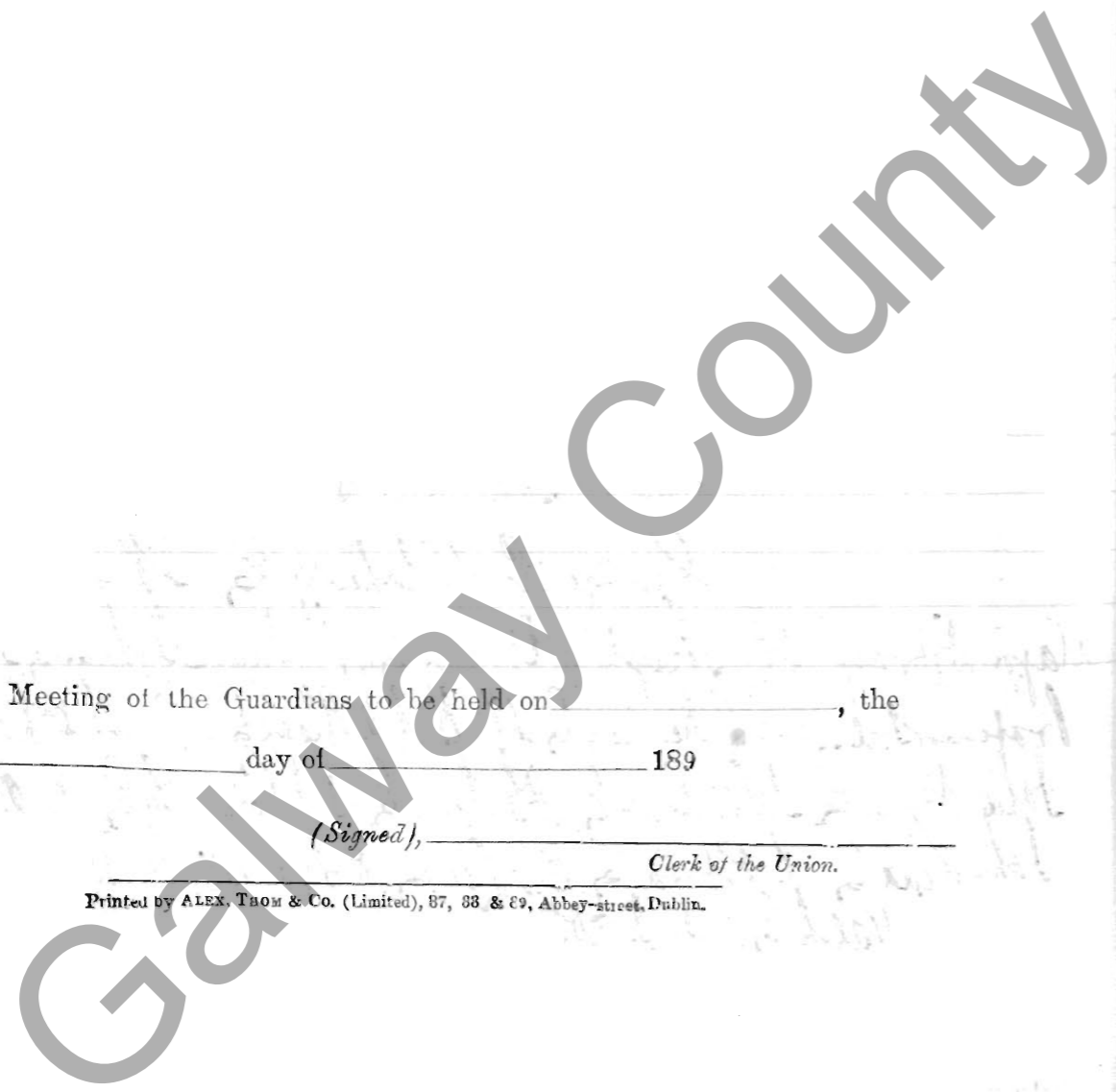

Gentlemen

I have the honor to report that I made  
a minute inspection of the Workhouse,  
Infirmary and Fever Hospital on 25<sup>th</sup> inst.

a copy of which I have forwarded to  
Messrs Rutledge Jan L. G. B. Inspector

The upper wards which have not been  
in use for many years are in a more or  
less dilapidated state - in some cases the  
rain coming in through the windows  
and rotting the floor, several new  
windows require to be fitted in, in  
order to keep these wards staunch.

As regards the Sanitary arrangements,  
the privies are earth closets which are  
emptied three times a week into a



cesspool in the garden along with the general house refuse - a distance of about 80 to 100 yards. The contents of the women's closets are removed into a cesspool in the turf yard and covered over with turf mould which in the spring time is conveyed to the garden for manuring purposes.

I am quite satisfied with the nursing arrangements that at present exist; we have a good Infirmary Nurse, assisted by two able-bodied inmates, who do the scouring and cleansing of the wards and act as wardswomen. In all the wards there is sufficient ventilation.

The food used by the inmates is good and suitable and will compare favorably with any similar Institution and I am happy to state that the health of all inmates is quite satisfactory. The Colden waterworks are now in course of construction and I hope we shall soon have a constant supply of good wholesome water.

In conclusion I would respectfully suggest the following recommendations be adopted.

1. A supply of flock mattresses be kept in stock and (a) the Hospital  
15 Iron bedsteads  
Infirmery be supplied with wire-  
7 Mattresses wire  
- wire mattresses being more cleanly  
iron  
than the ones at present in use  
10 Fabric Mattresses
2. A bath room with hot and cold water laid on.
3. Two cess-pools (male and female side) should be constructed of cement and kept as free as possible from admixture of water.
4. House lime washed and wood-work especially over Hospital and Infirmary painted.
