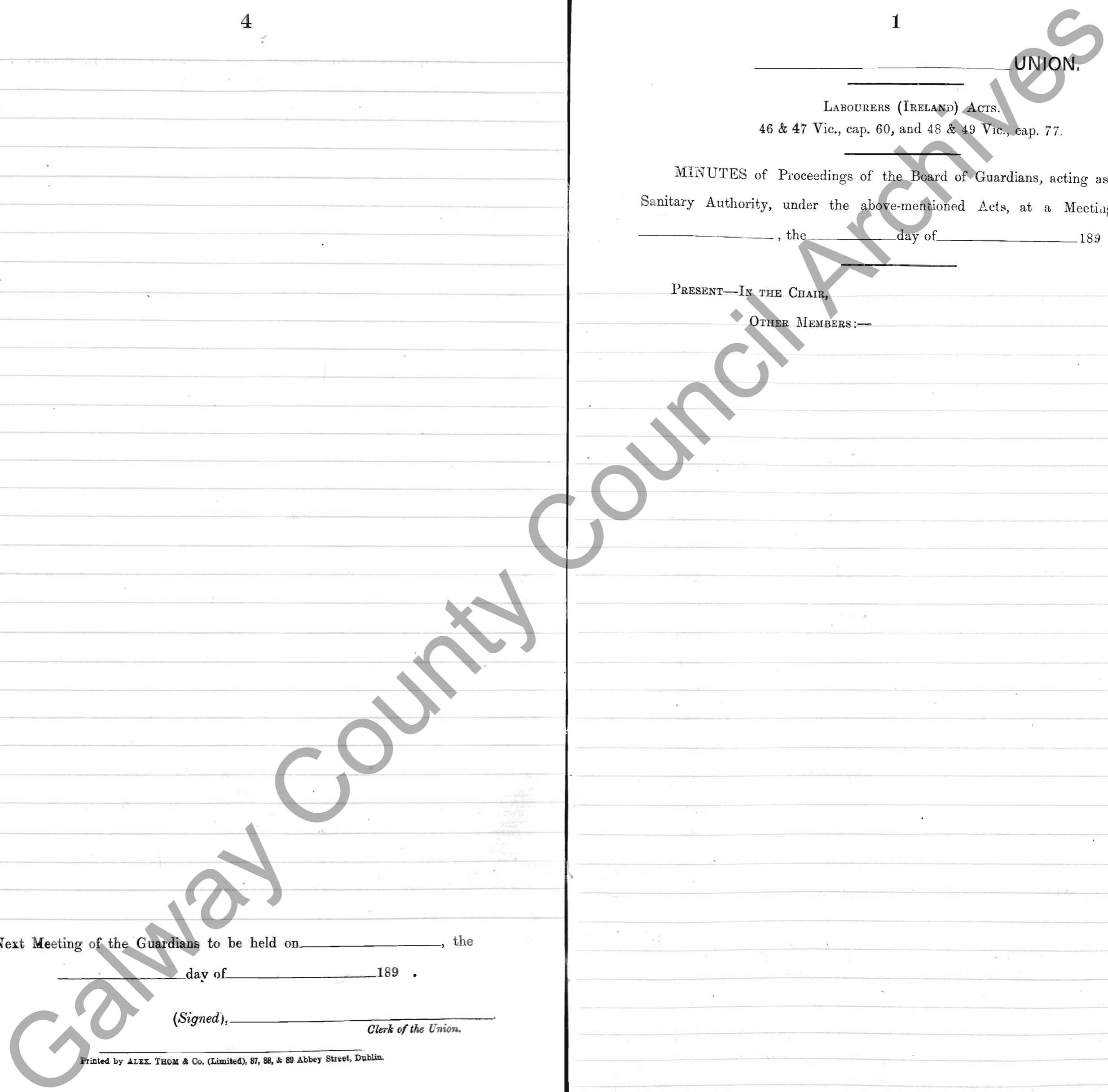

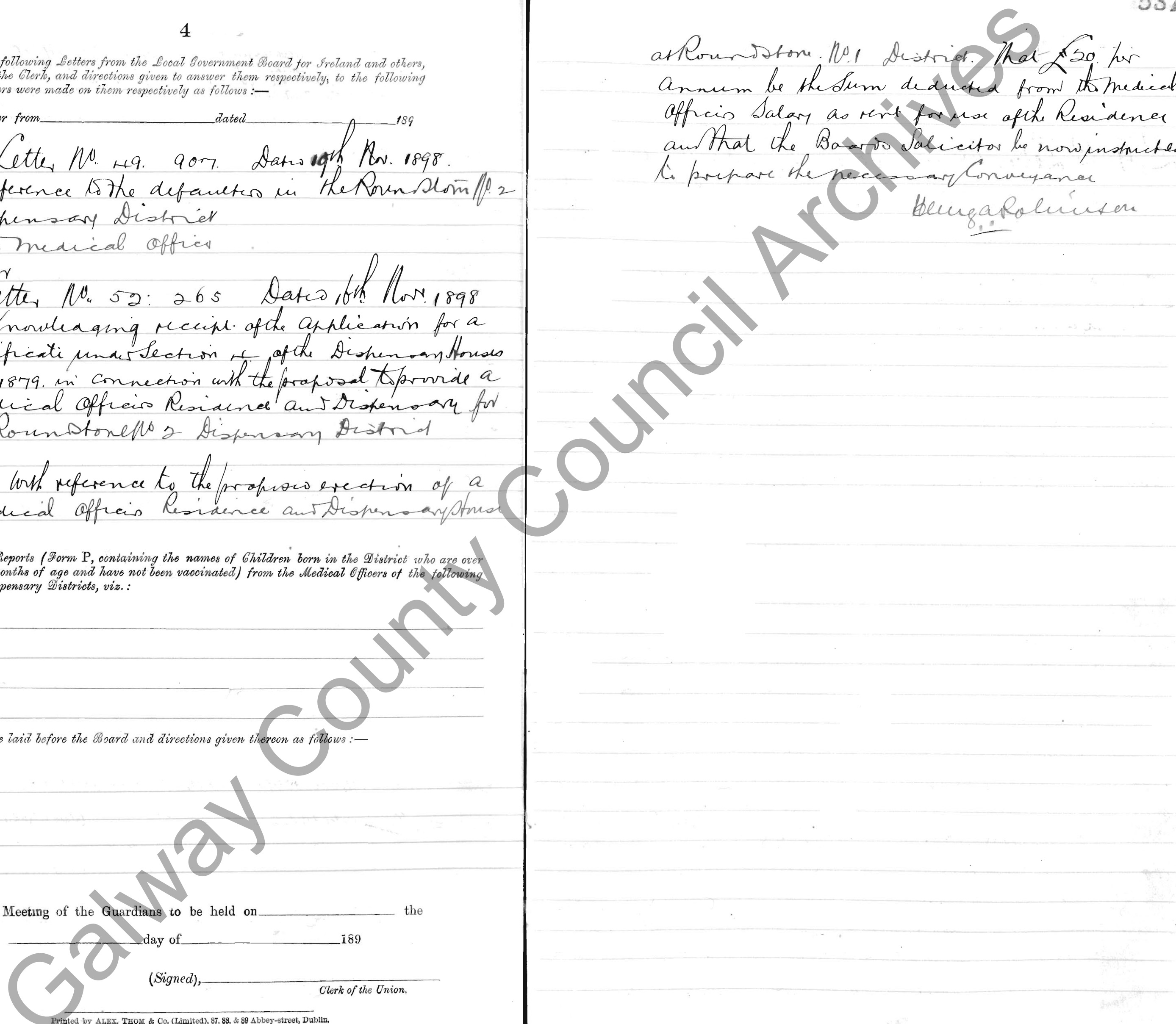

Clifden is nature's harbour, as is evident by the number of Boats at refuge there at present and it is much to be regretted that with all the natural advantages which Clifden possess we have not a fishing or curing station in this very desirable locality. The fish taken the result of the poor man's

labours having to be carted from Clifgan a distance of 9 miles, takes away the profit and to such an extent deteriorates the Fish by the Cartage thereof that it has to be sold in the market 15/- to 2/- per box less than the fish sent direct from Clifgan.

It is to be hoped therefore that the Congested Districts Board will establish a Fishing and Curing Station at Clifgan, and that our Representative in Parliament will impress upon the Government the great necessity of erecting a Pier at Doughtbeg or the extension of the old Pier at Clifgan Quay so as to assist the Congested Districts Board in the promotion of this valuable industry. and that our Clerk be requested to send Copies of this Resolution to the Chief Secretary. 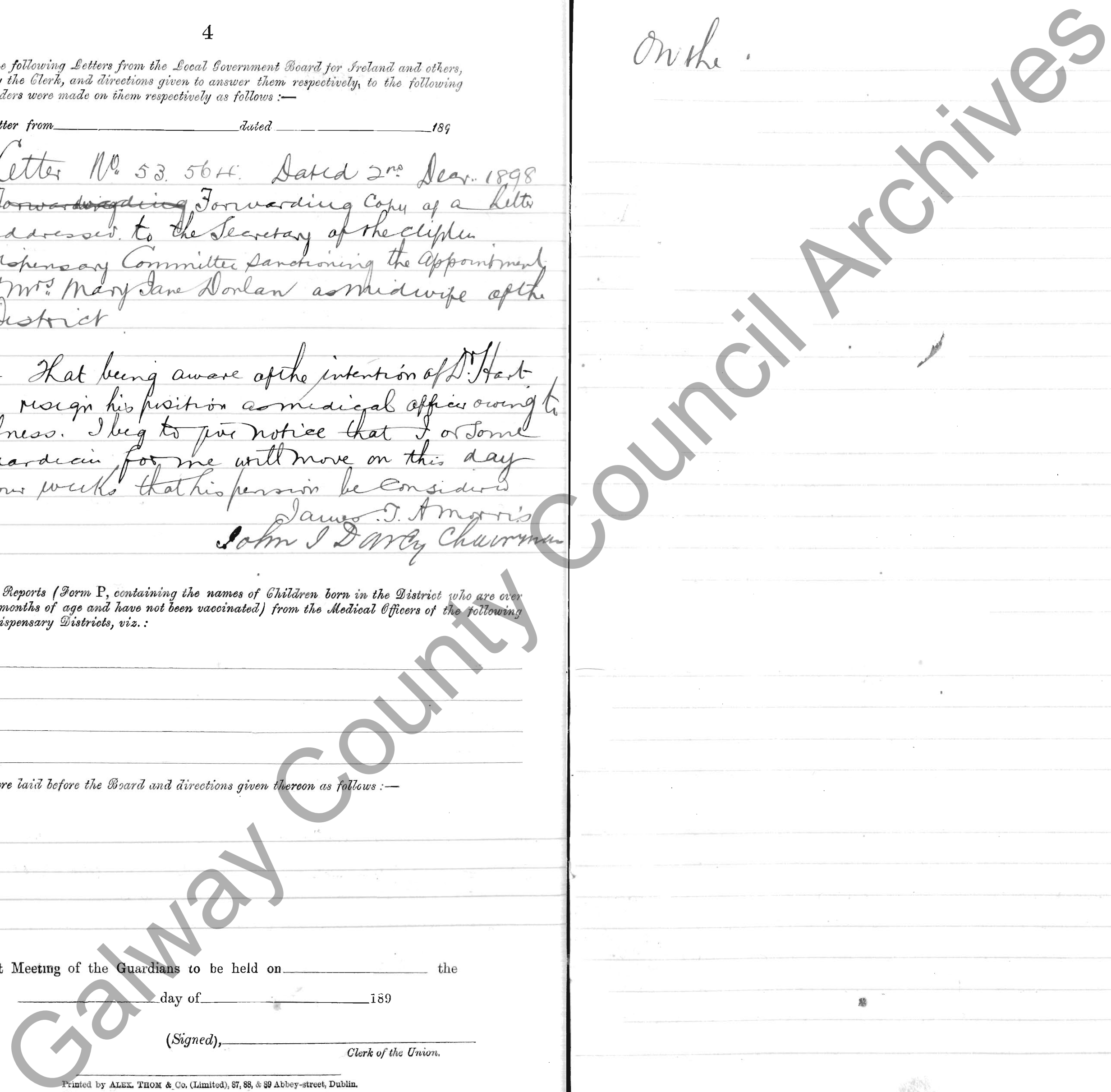

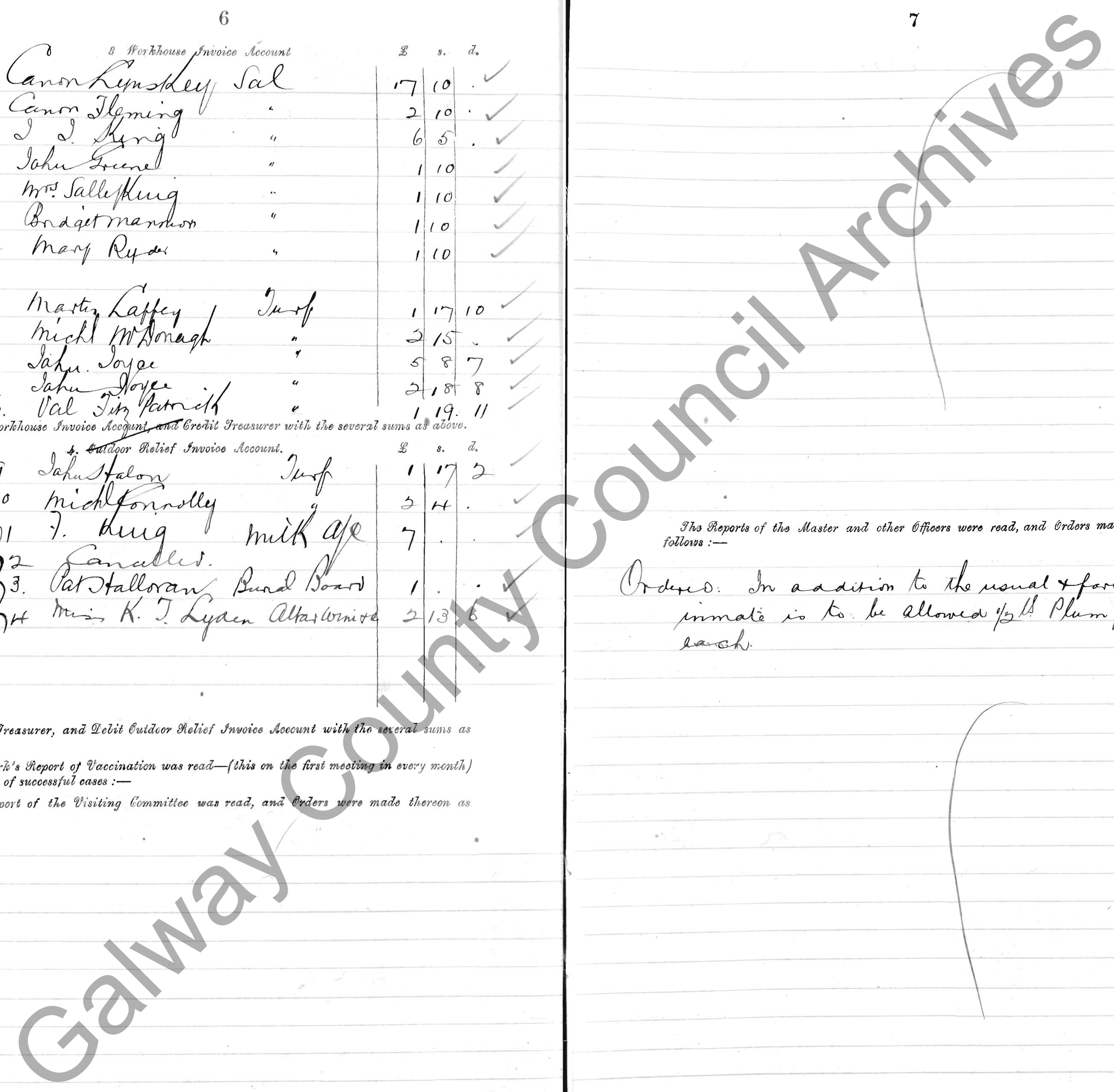

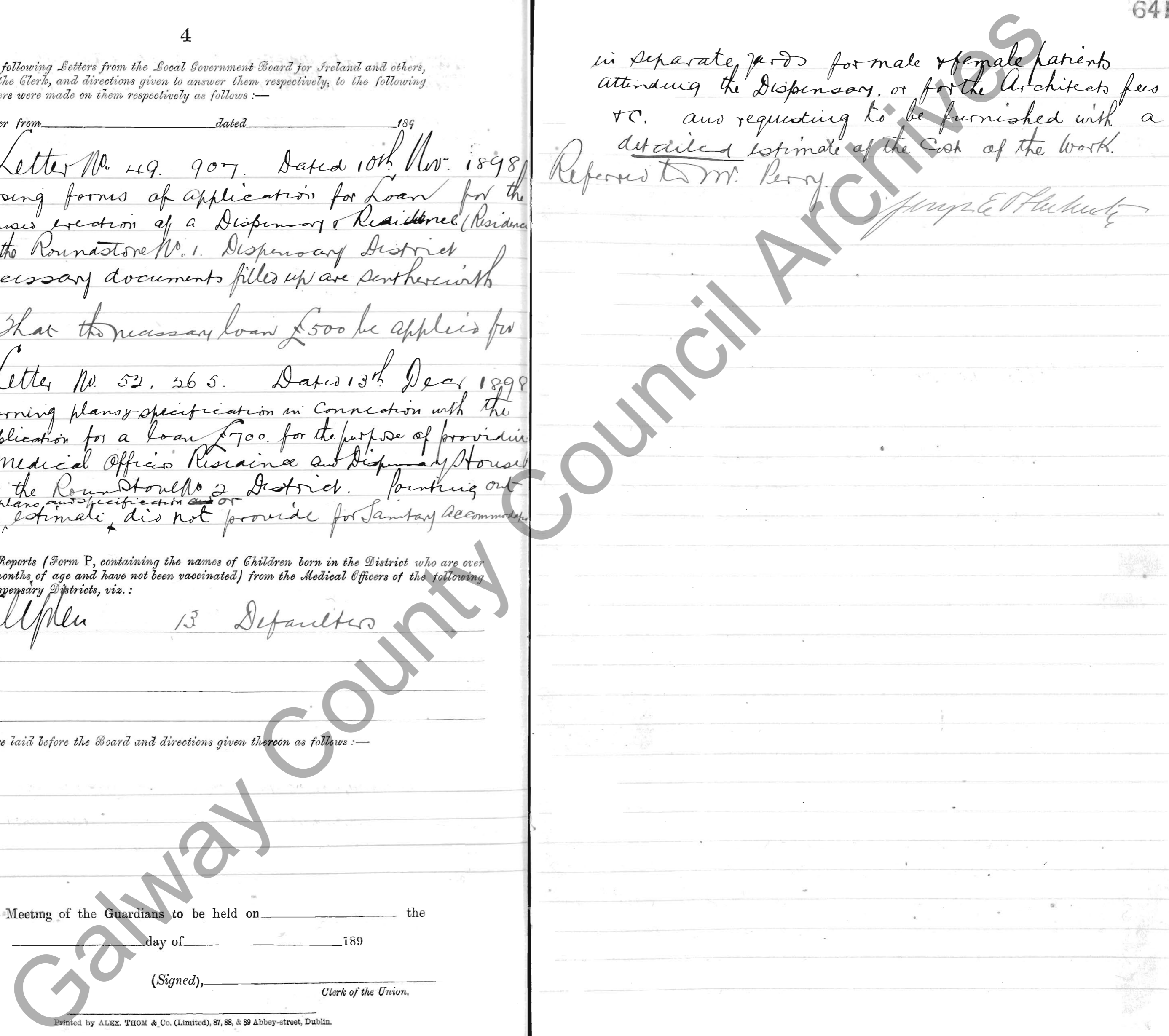
