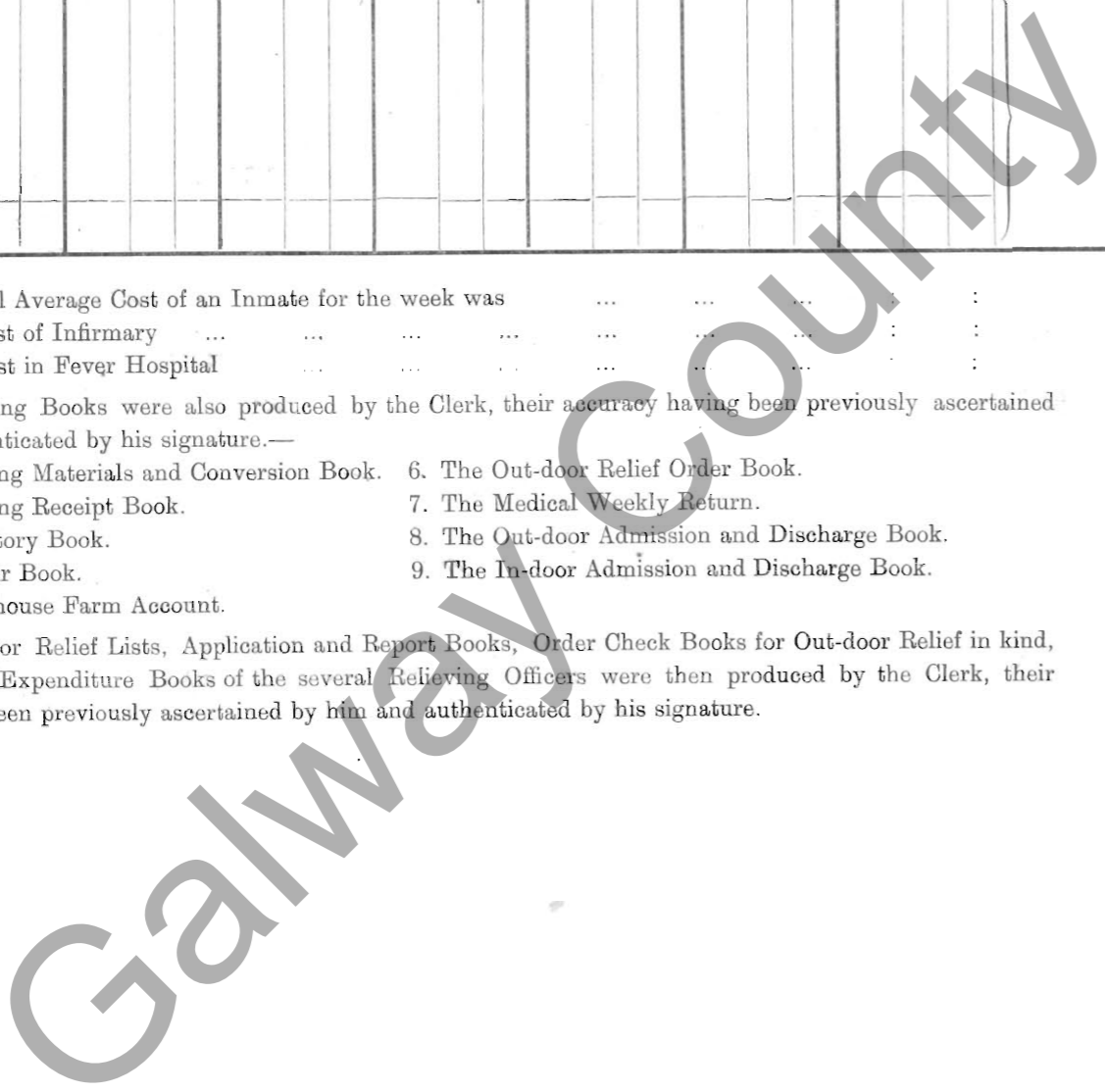

The Dispensary is situated, about one fourth of a mile from the town, and if I refused to give medicine without the production of a Dispensary ticket, and sent the patient away, the people would not return. In order to keep a record of the medicine distributed, I found it necessary to enter the names of the persons to whom I administered drugs in the Medical register.

As regards vaccination my usual practice is to vaccinate in the Summer months. During the Spring the people are occupied in planting potatoes &c. During the last Quarter of the year the weather is generally so boisterous that the people will not bring in their children for vaccination. A list of surgical instruments was posted by me in the Dispensary.

We consider the Medical Officers explanation satisfactory, and that his recommendations be carried out.

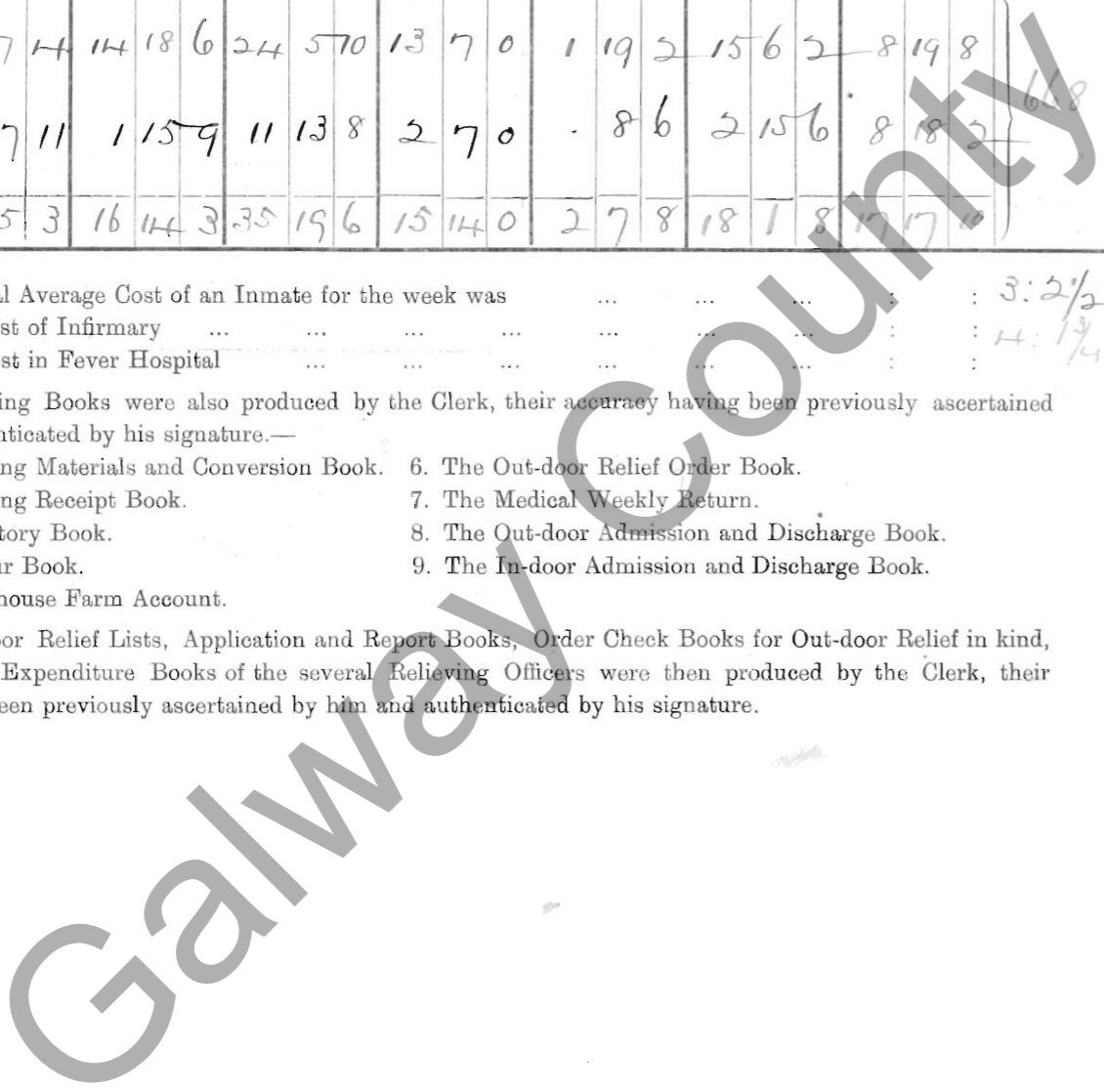

I am of opinion that said sample (which had undergone no change in its constitution that would interfere with its analysis, was in a proper condition for examination when I received and analysed it), was Milk to which at least 10 per cent of its weight of water had been added as an adulterant, making thereby a mixture of 110 parts of milk and water. Said sample contained 7.7 per cent. of non-fatty solids, and 2.8 per cent. of fats: total per cent. of solids 10.5. The poorest pure milk contains 8.5 per cent. of non-fatty solids. The said sample was labelled "Milk Sample E Mary Connolly, Glenvecker Clifden, Co. Galway, 16th February 1900"

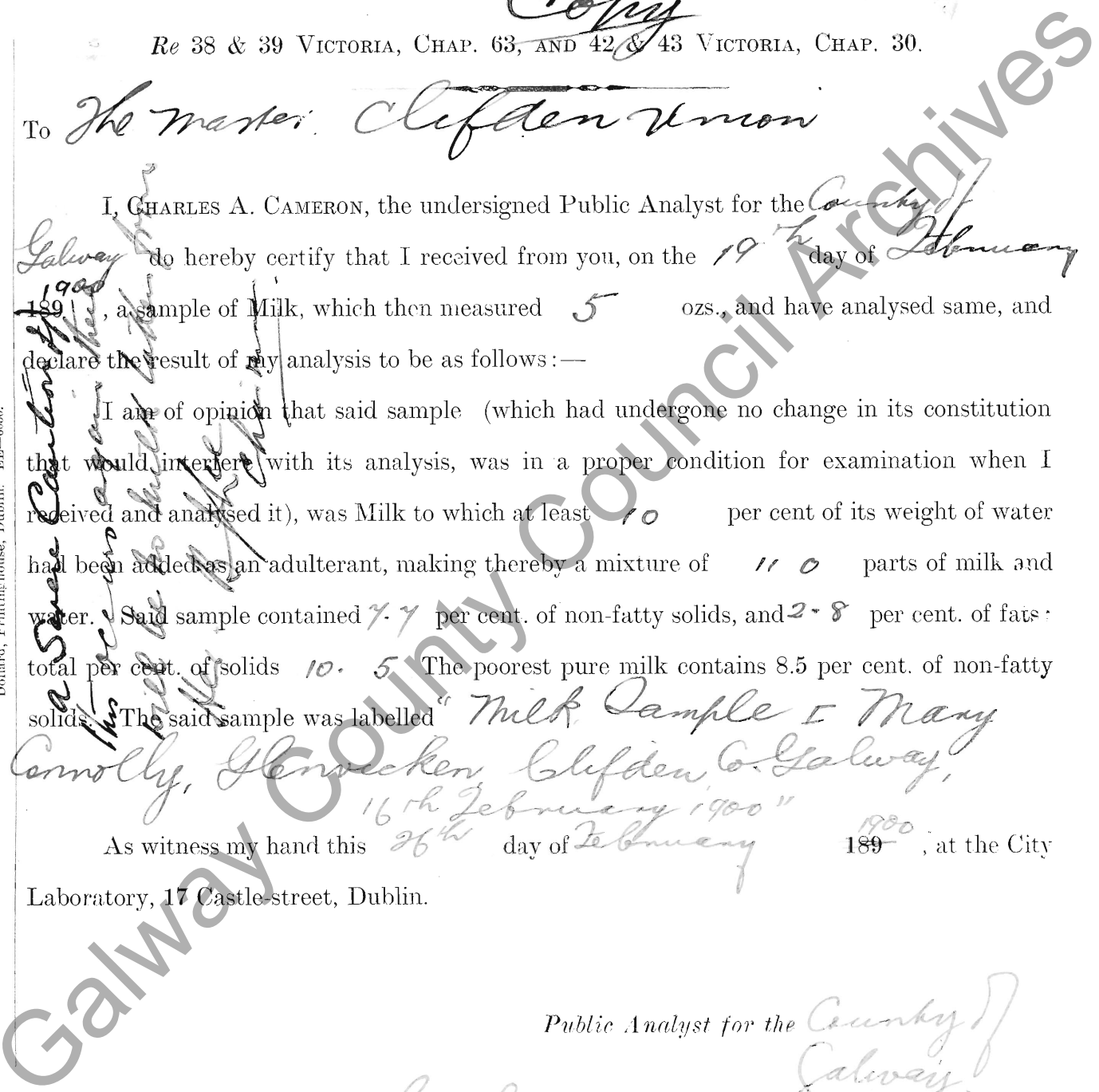
