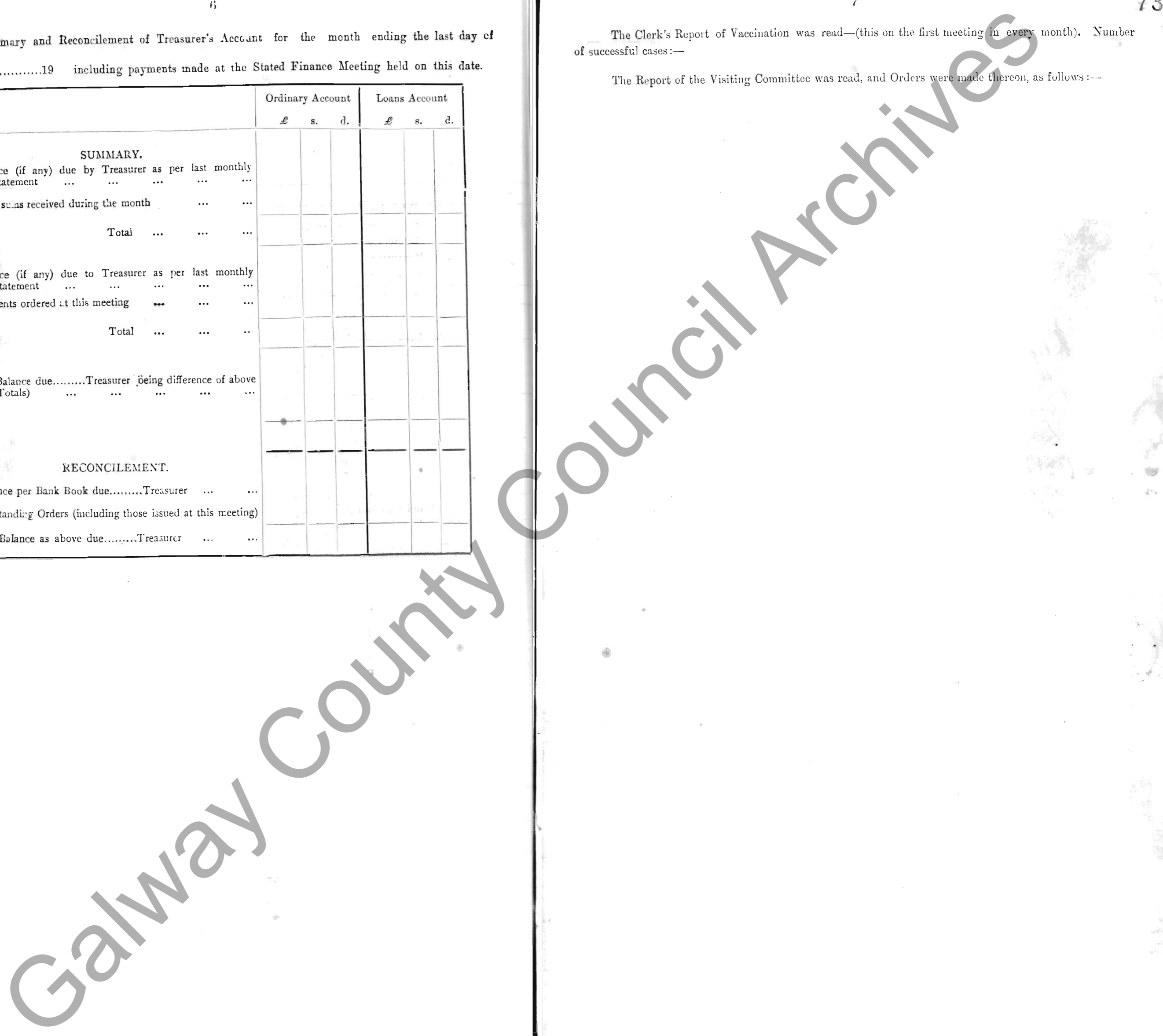

Annexed is copy of a Resolution passed at a meeting of the Board of Guardians here on Monday, the 24th instant, which I have been directed to forward you.

To the Clerk of each Union in Connaught.

“Resolved—That we, the members of the Ballinrobe Board of Guardians, having had before us the circular demand of the County Mayo Branch of the so-called Irish Medical Association for increased fees—without assigning any cause—as union and dispensary substitutes, hereby enter our earnest and solemn protest against such exorbitant and unjust charges, and pledge ourselves to resist this arbitrary and selfish imposition by all lawful means in our power for the following reasons:—

“We consider the medical officers are already very highly paid for their Poor Law Union work, and have no reasonable cause of complaint for the remuneration they receive for same. Only a small portion of their time is devoted to union duties, and they have besides their large fees from private practice.

“The population of their respective districts has much decreased within the past few years, and is still decreasing, consequently they have now less duties to perform to the poor than heretofore. Again, with the prospect of peasant proprietary looming on the horizon, and other legislative measures of amelioration for the people, workhouse and dispensary doctors, as such, will have much less to do in those capacities in future.

“Furthermore, should the doctors now succeed in their present greedy, imperative, shylock demand it will be an incentive and an encouragement to them to further increase the extortion, and add to their pensions and superannuations.

Finally, the ratepayers, owing to the increased salaries to union officers, compensation to retiring rate collectors, and other assessments consequent on the Local Government Act, are taxed to the proverbial ‘last straw,’ and considering the unremunerative price of live stock, and the increased cost of labour, can bear no further burden in the shape of excess medical taxation or otherwise.

“In the foregoing circumstances we request the L G Board to notify those dissatisfied union doctors that they can resign their respective positions if they will not discharge their official duties at present emoluments and fees, and make room for other medical men, who will be glad to obtain their appointments.

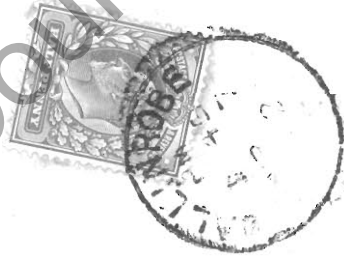
