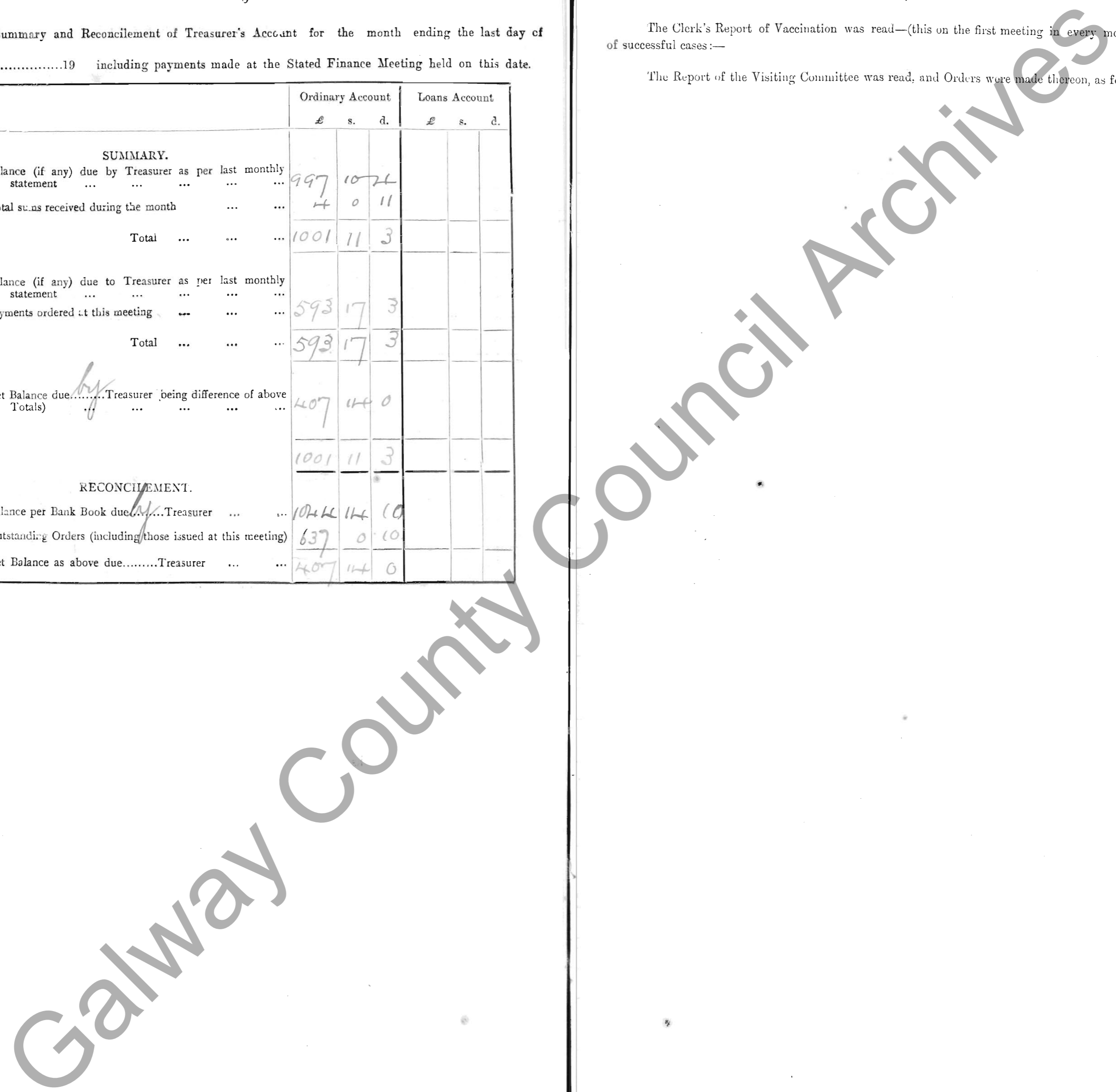

Gentlemen

On Saturday May the 17th an inmate of the Clifden Convent Industrial School was admitted to the Infirmary of the Workhouse upon a ticket of admission issued by the Relieving Officer.

When I found she suffered from cerebrospinal meningitis, on the 19th instant I had her transferred to the fever hospital for treatment. The master on my requisition procured the services of two nurses to take charge of this case. I proceeded to the Convent School on the 20th instant in order to examine all the inmates of the Industrial School particularly those children who occupied the same dormitory. I found the children apparently in good health. I do not think the nuns were justified in removing this patient Mary Flaherty from this Infirmary to the Workhouse Hospital without first consulting a medical man.

Mary Flaherty died on the 22nd inst of Cerebro Spinal Disease

I telegraphed to the Mater Hospital Dublin for a nurse and Miss Binella was sent on the 20th and took charge of the Fever Hospital where she is at present, acting on the same order I secured the services of Mrs. Donohoe of Lifford to act as night fever nurse in charge of a patient in the Fever Hospital on the night of the 19th inst. which charge she held till after nurse Binella's arrival.
