In case the lowest tenders for the same article chance to be equal and there is no difference in the quality of the article tendered for, the Board shall give preference to the person who was contractor for the supply of the article during the previous twelve months provided his previous record was satisfactory

11. With the exception of the Clerk, Press Representatives, medical officers of the Union and clergy men of all denominations, no other will be permitted to attend the meetings of the Board. Relieving officers and others having business to transact will be called when required and must retire when their business is completed. Any member of the Board with the permission of the Chairman will be allowed to take a friend to the Board meeting but in no case shall such person take part in the proceedings.

Gentlemen: — I beg to inform you that I requisitioned Dr. Loftus on the 11th January to take charge of the Carna District Round Stone No. 11. during Dr. Conry's illness. He accepted but resigned next day.
