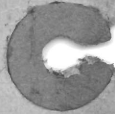
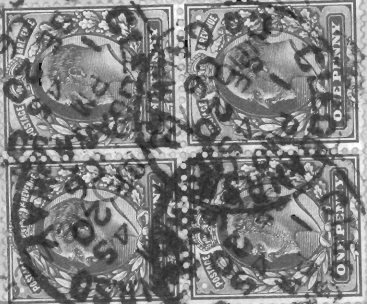

Still up to this the fond hopes of the people has not been ~~not~~ realized, as the promised grant has not been given, and therefore no works started in the district we therefore respectfully urge upon the Chief Secretary this great want and earnestly hope the promises of the Government will be carried out, and that the much needed Pier at Doughtbeg will be proceeded with, & thereby much needed employment afforded our people.
