I beg leave to bring under your notice the destituteness of some of the inhabitants of Bofin Island. There should be relief works open forthwith to bring them relief. I received a copy of resolution re my neglect of duty, in not bringing this matter earlier under your notice, and in gracious response must say that inclemency of weather prohibited my attendance. The causes of some of the inhabitants of both islands Shark and Bofin ^{being so destitute} are three-fold (a) the failure of the potato crop (b) the great loss sustained owing to the swine fever attack, and (c) the harvest fishing industry of last season stopping so early, and the prices given being so meagre. I would therefore strongly recommend that you open up relief works at your very earliest convenience, and in conclusion beg leave to deferentially remain,
