Sir,

Referring to the Resolution of the Clifden Board of Guardians requesting the County Council to assess a Seed Rate at the rate of 5s per stone on persons who received Seed Potatoes I beg to say that before such step can be taken it will be necessary to supply the County Council with a complete list showing the amount which the Guardians propose should be charged in the rate for the coming financial year to each person. This is assuming that there is any power to alter the price at which the potatoes were originally sold by the Guardians.

As however I cannot find any authority to make any such alteration and it would be a very serious matter if the rate was endangered I would be obliged if you would refer me to the authority enabling a County Council to comply with a request such as that contained in the resolution of your Board.

In reply to yours of the 12th inst. I beg to state that "Six pence" per stone was the original price at which the seed was sold, and that lists form it were printed and published all over the Union to effect a sale of which I send you the Electoral Division at Illion. But having regard to the price from the Department of Agriculture, the Guardians afterwards, at their meeting on the 29th Nov. 1906 when considering the question reduced the price to "Five pence". The seed supply for 1906 was not passed till the 30th May following and the Guardians were not aware that interest would be charged on the loan.

I understand the Local Government Board have written to the Guardians of other Unions who fixed the price without giving any credit for the loan received from the Department of Agriculture that they must now allow 5% by reducing the price to be charged for the second moiety. Don't you think this is only fair and reasonable? as it would be most inequitable and in my opinion illegal to make up the deficit by assessing a rate on ratepayers who never got any seed, because under the Rules and Regulations made by the Local Government Board the whole price of the seed with all expenses attending same must be charged to the persons receiving the seed.

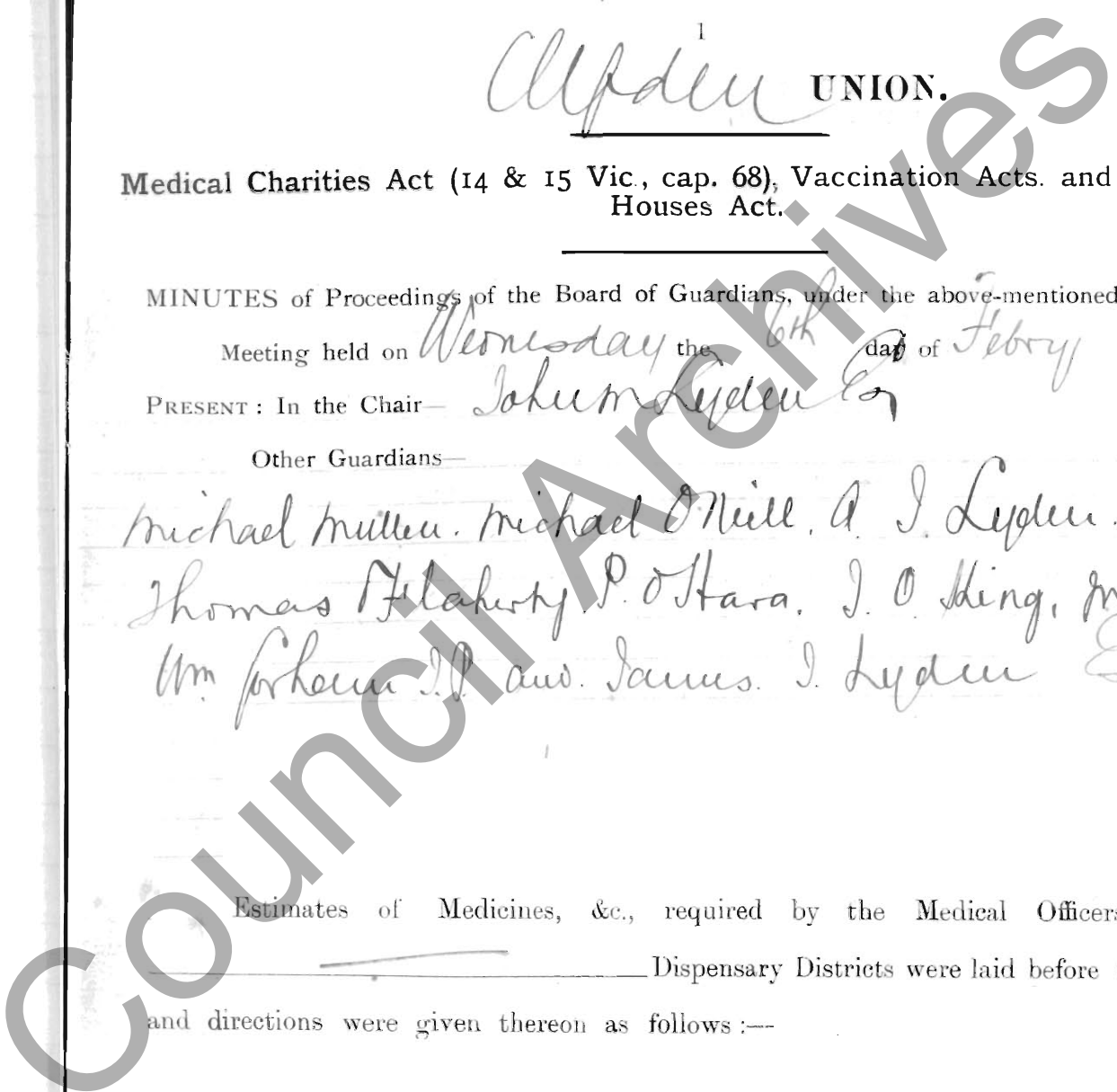

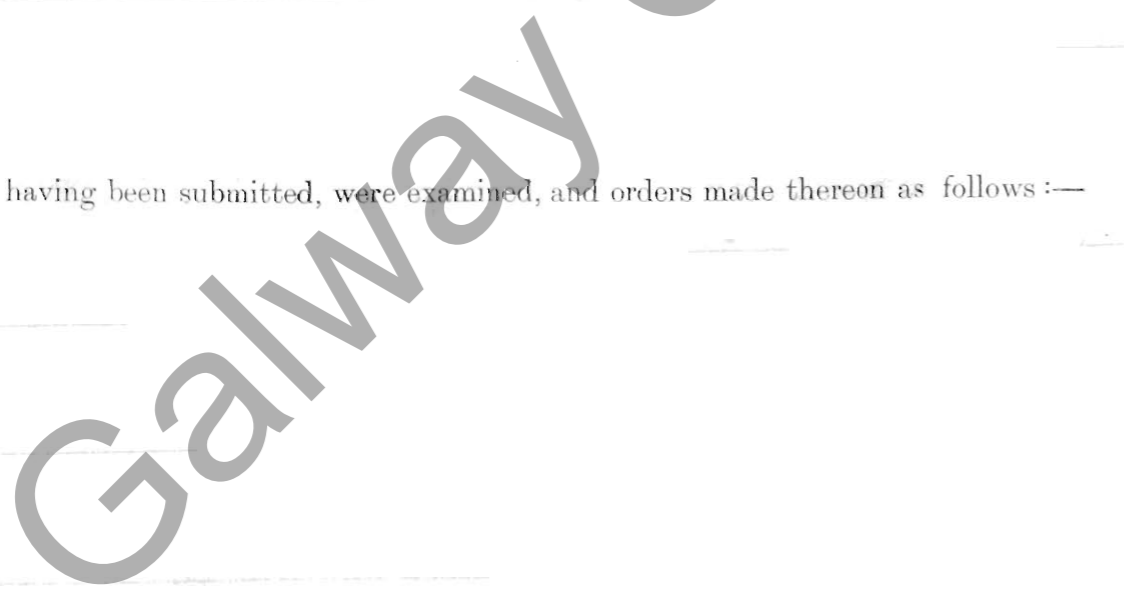
