We visited the house to day, and beg to make the following remarks.

Re the Congestion in the female wards, we recommend the transfer of six inmates (the worst cases) from these wards to the hospital, we consider this a more economical way to meet the Congestion than opening a new ward and appointing an additional wards maid as there is sufficient accommodation there for them.

Re Clothing. The Guardians as a rule only accept the best articles tendered,

There are four Chimney shafts defective, and the roofing of the Closet off Board Room requires Overhauling, we recommend the Board to deal with these items.

We also recommend the doing of the Avenue from the entrance gate to the porters hall, the wood of the windows along the avenue require to be repaired and painted. We recommend the wire mattresses to be returned and replaced by a better quality

We do not recommend further expense presently. On our inspection we found every thing in fairly good order.

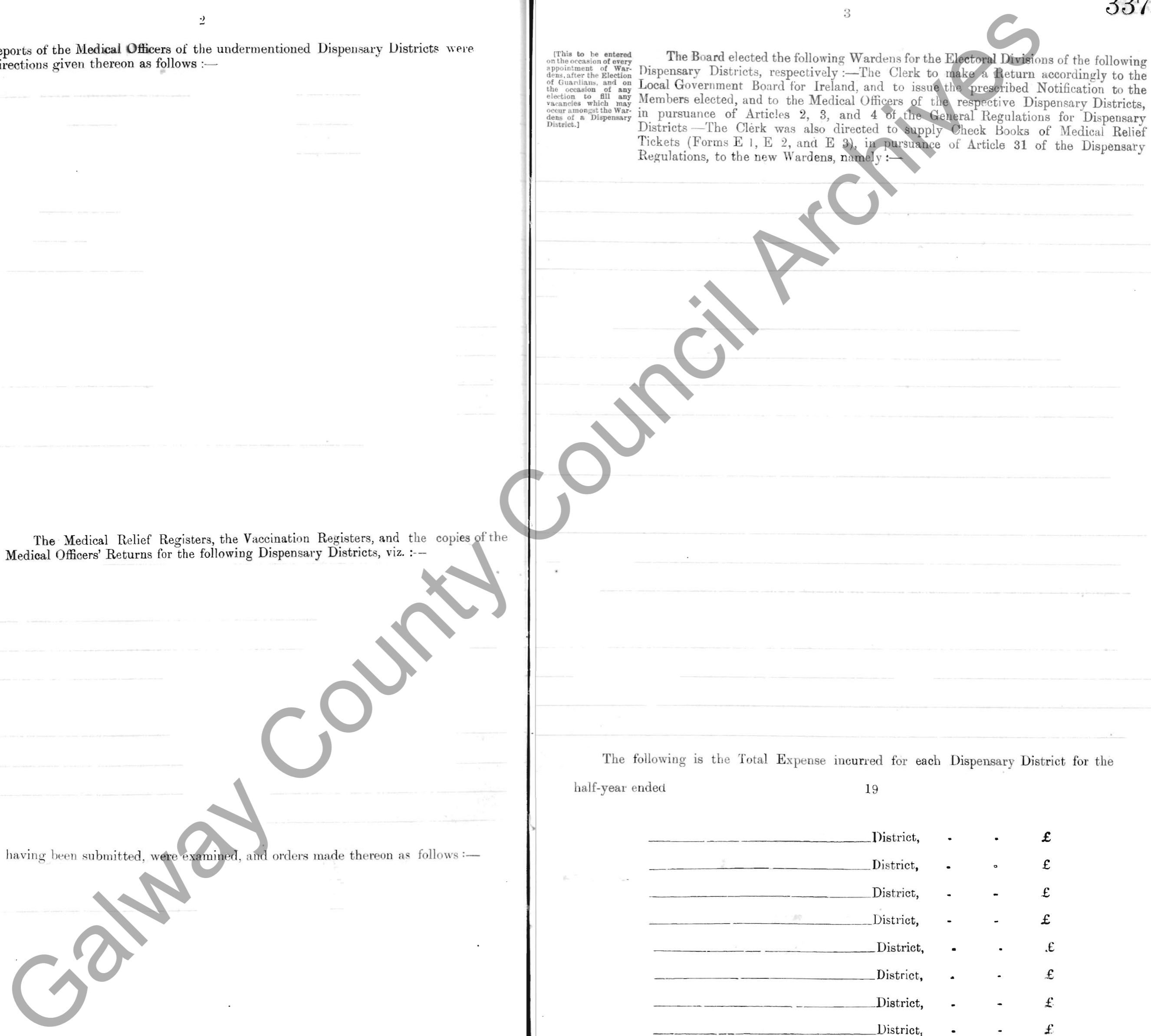
