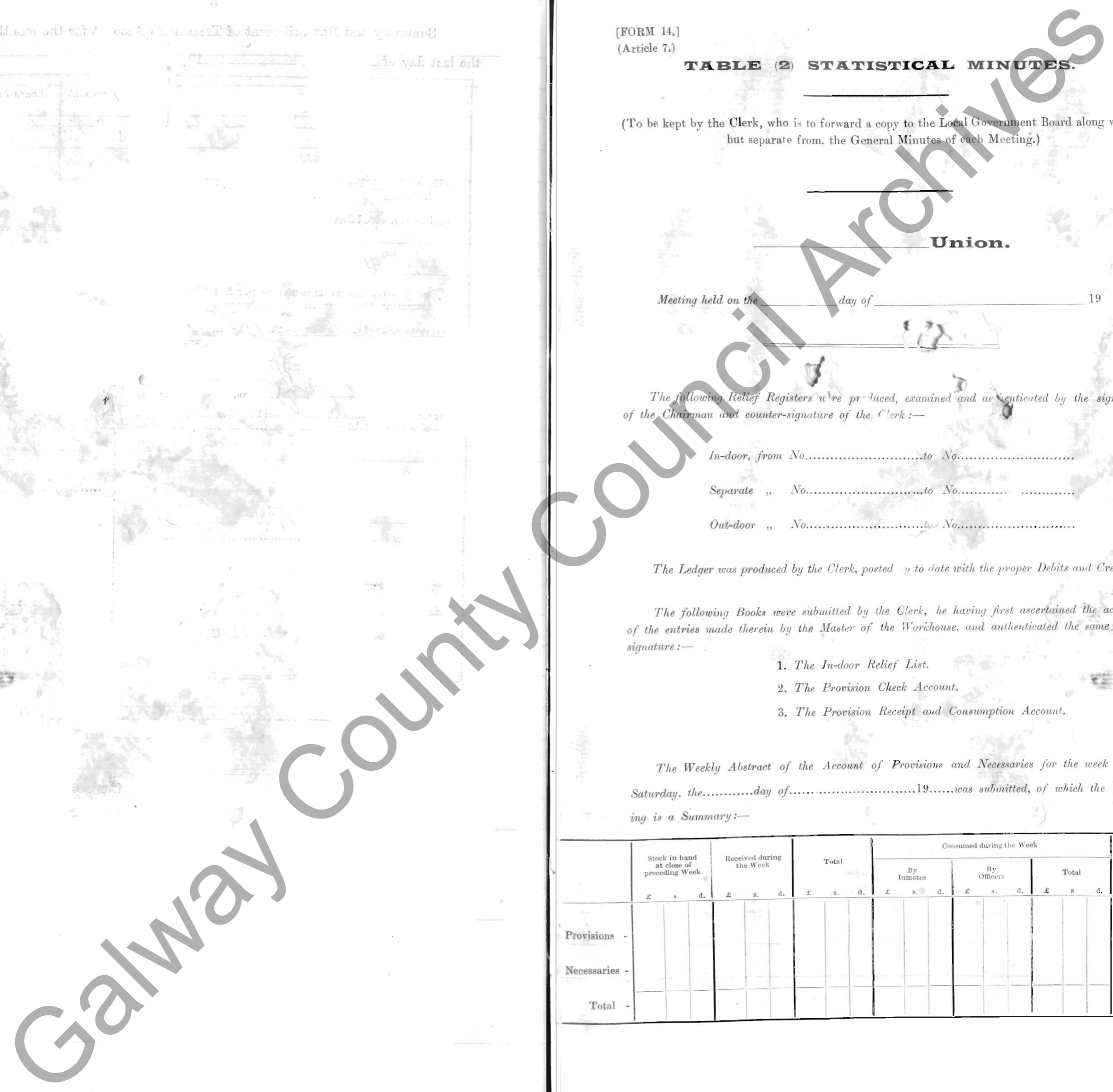

I beg to bring under your notice that there is a Doctor much needed here there are several important cases requiring medical attendance. I phoned attended here last week all the patients with the greatest attention. Dr. Joseph McDonnell had been appointed to do temporary duty here he came once remained for some time. - The next day there were several urgent ~~cases~~ calls for a Doctor, I wired to Dr. McDonnell to attend these cases and got no reply until next day saying to provide another Doctor I wired to Dr. J. J. MacDonnell of Letterfrack he could not come as he had too many urgent cases in his district - There was no doctor available that I could find.

Within the past week another urgent case occurred a boy 2 1/2 years old got a Paralytic stroke from which he died in a few days afterwards.

I see there is a permanent Doctor required here there are at present several important cases of sickness requiring medical attendance
