I was obliged to continue the services of Mrs Dowd attendant in the Fever Hospital till the 27th inst

Attached is a letter sent to nurse Kearney on the 3/6/11 relative to patients and attendants in Hospital leaving the House and going to town without permission.

Notwithstanding this letter having been sent to the nurse, there seems to be no notice taken of it, as the attendants still continue to go out without permission.

Patients also leave the Hospital evidently discharged without acquainting me and on this account it is impossible for me to keep my books straight

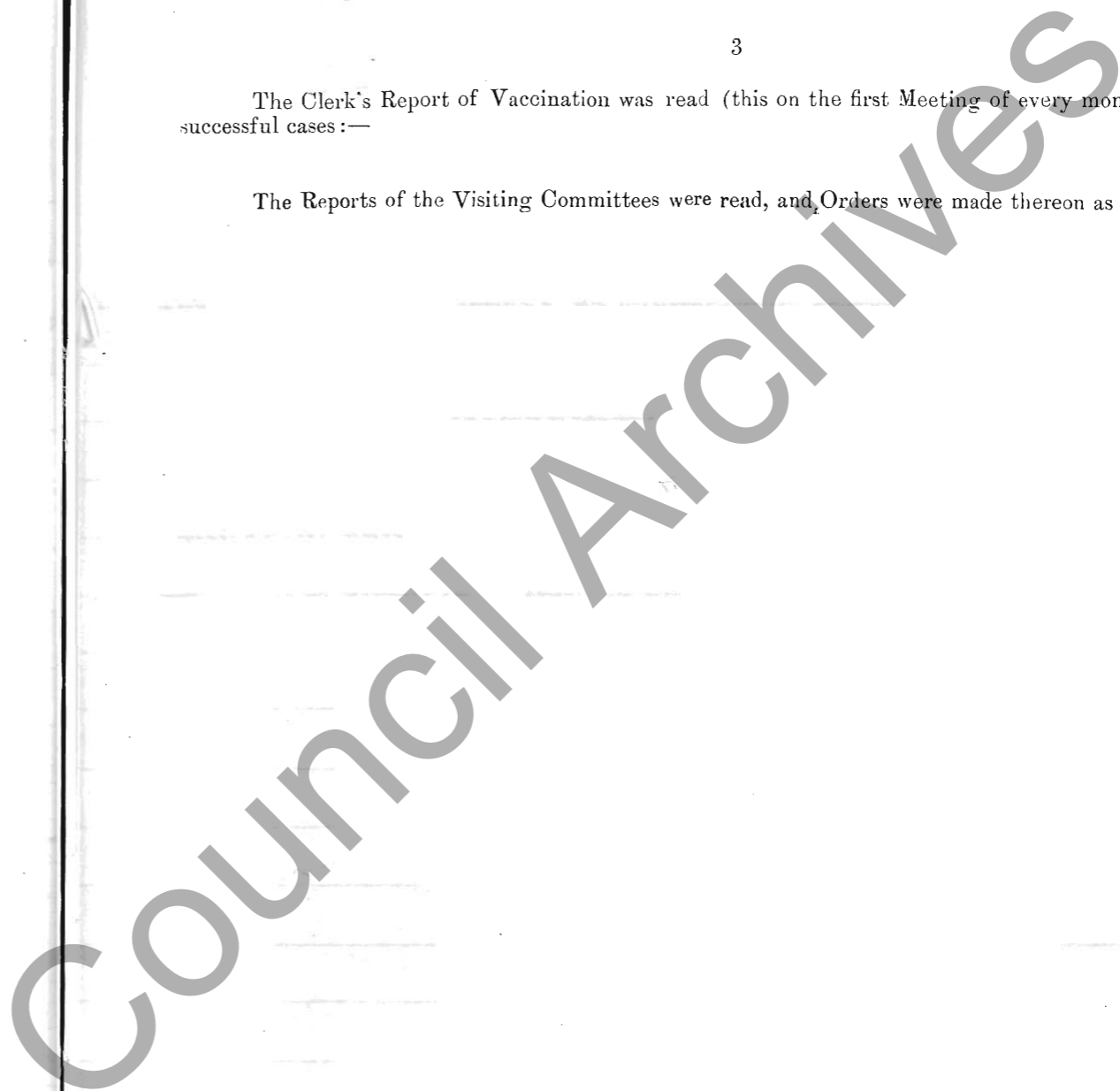

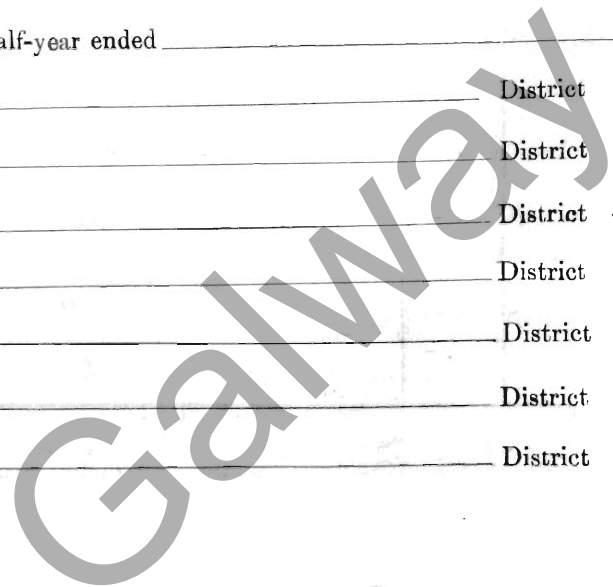

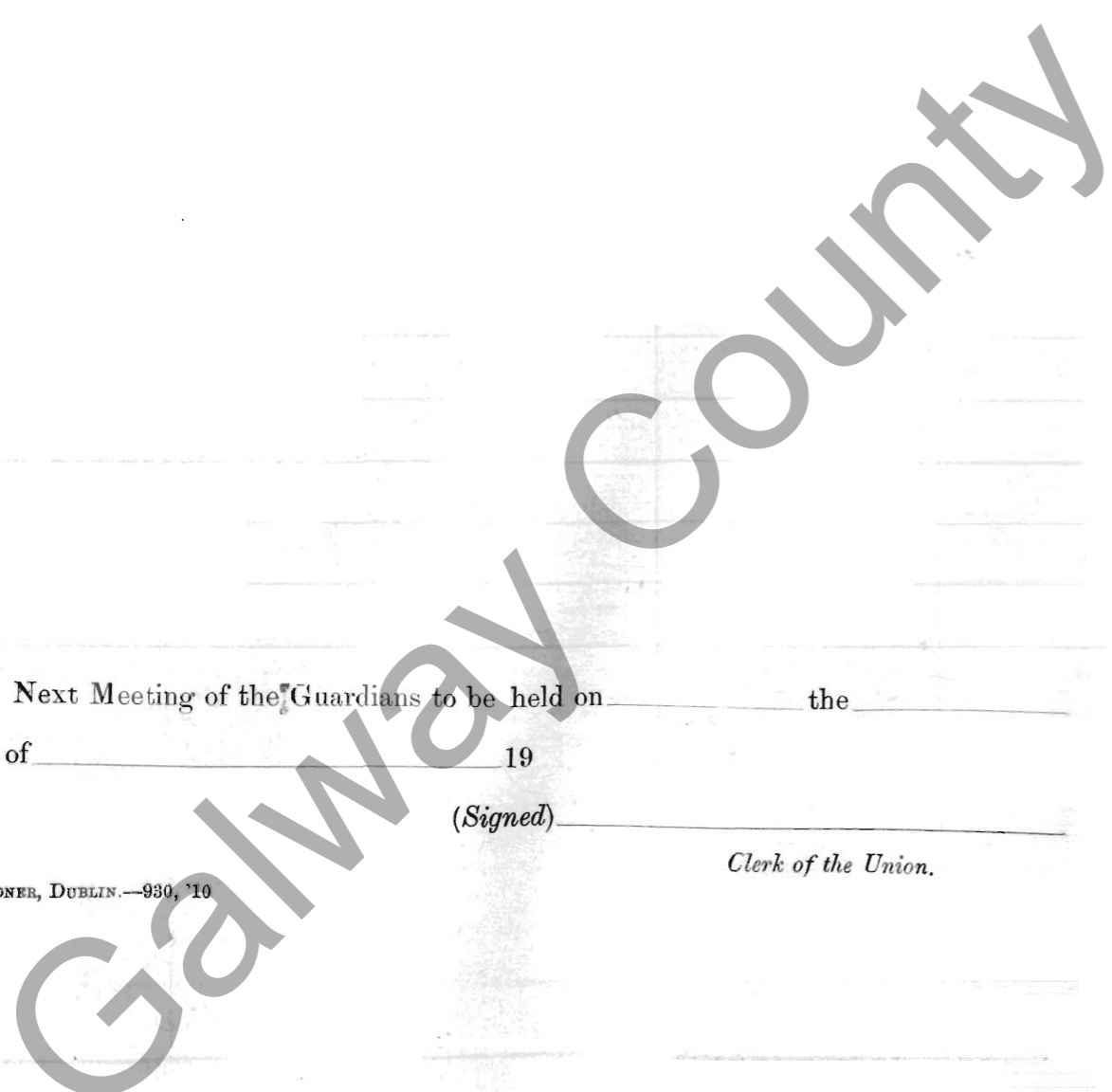
