Gentlemen

With reference to Sir A. McCullagh's report on his recent inspection of the Cliffair Dispensary, I beg to state that I received a copy of the report from the Clerk of Union which got mislaid. In the beginning of January 1911 I suffered from a severe attack of Neuritis, shoulder and arm which left me practically helpless so far as clerical work was concerned so much so that I could barely write with a pen although well able to attend visiting tickets not one of which was unattended.

In August 1911 I sought the advice of Mr Kennedy Merrion Square who prescribed massage and other treatment which relieved me much. On or about the 20th Decr. while returning at night across the strand from a confinement case at Omev Island the car driver drove myself and the jubilee nurse into a quicksand where we were thrown off the car into a deep pool of water and got thoroughly saturated with salt water. I understand Monsignor McAlpine P.P. met with a similar accident in the same place. Another attack of Neuritis occurred, and in the early part of January 1912 was obliged to go to Dublin for further treatment. As regard the non entries in the attendance and Report book, this book was missing from the Dispensary for over

Briefly I quite agree with the Medical Inspector as to the necessity of sanitary conveniences for the patients but seeing that the Guardians are about to build a residence for the Doctor with a Dispensary attached it is perhaps better to postpone the present construction of a sanitary convenience.

The book could not be found for some time, it was subsequently found discovered amongst a number of other books in the Board Room.

I had a fairly good supply of Drugs sufficient to last for two months and did not think it necessary to order a further quantity, hence I only ordered medicine three times during the year. As regards the Vaccination Acts not being efficiently administered, I must plead continued illness and the intense pain I suffered as my excuse. Had I taken the advice tendered by my friends I would have asked for a prolonged holiday and all the trouble I have given ~~would~~ might have been avoided. I now beg to express my regret for my apparent carelessness in the keeping of the Dispensary records.

In reply to Sir A MacCallagh's report on his last inspection of this District I beg to state as follows—

1. The Dispensary Buildings are quite clean, but some plaster fell off the walls of the waiting room and needs repairing
2. Medicine was ordered when necessary consistent with the demands.
3. The list of Instruments were sent to the Clerk of Union on the 24<sup>th</sup> June 1911, and a copy of same lies at the Dispensary since then.
4. Owing to the existence of whooping cough vaccinations had to be postponed last year in Recross and Cashel since August 1911, to this date I have performed 76 vaccinations in my District.
5. The suggested Dispensary Depot at Recross or Cashel Ballinacree would be a great boon to the people of those localities.
6. The Inspector says:— "The medical officer is practically never sent for in these remote parts of the District" — The fact is as the medical Relief Register shows that in the year 1909 I attended 26 visiting tickets there, in 1910 12 tickets, in 1911 10 tickets and in 1912 8 tickets
