Orders for the supply of turf have been issued half yearly but the vendors pay no attention to such advertisements with the result that the Workhouse master has been authorised to take in a supply provided the cost does not exceed $1\frac{1}{4}$ per box which arrangement up to the present has worked satisfactorily. Turf is supplied from only one particular district the owners who arrange between themselves not to supply under a fixed price. This year as well as on former occasions an attempt was made to increase the price to $1\frac{1}{6}$ per box but the guardians have always refused to allow more than $1\frac{1}{4}$. Some years ago turf was supplied at 8^d per box but owing to the increase wages for labour now and for years back $1\frac{1}{4}$ is the prevailing price and at this figure the guardians consider turf more economic than coal. Mr. Walsh has no grievance his turf was taken at the same price as that paid to his neighbours.
