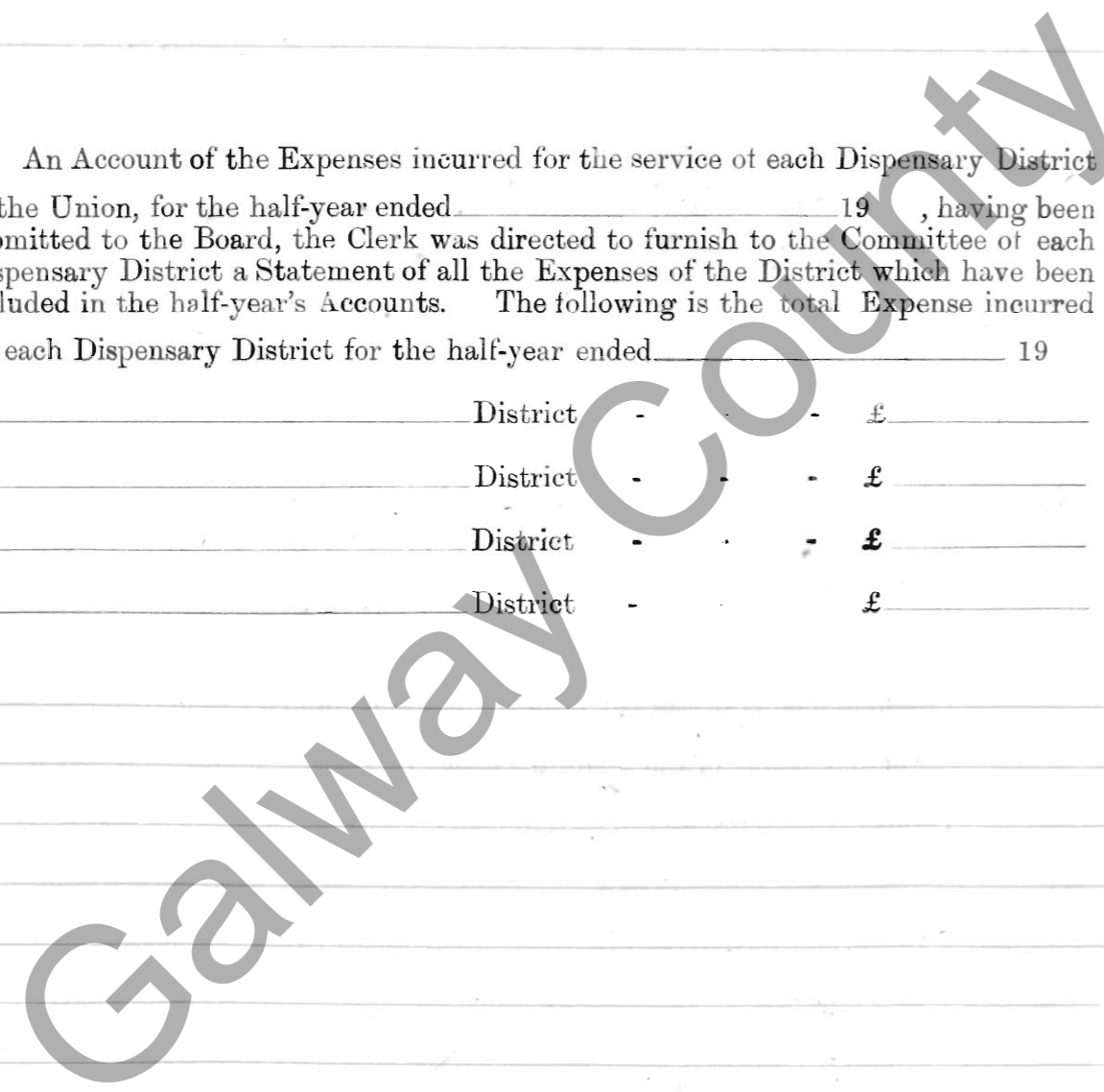

Half Year ended 30th Sept 1915

I hereby charge McHaville late Master of the Biddyden Workhouse with the sum of eight Pounds, four Shillings and seven pence (£8:4:7) and I certify the said sum of eight Pounds, four Shillings, and seven pence (£8:4:7) to be due and payable by him the said McHaville.

My reason for making this charge is, that the amount in question represents a loss owing to the negligence of the Master in calculating the amount of Fish Sauce to be Consumed, in the following manner:— For fourteen weeks during the half-year ended Sept 30-1915 he gave out sixteen times as much butter, milk and flour for the making of Fish Sauce as the quantity authorised by the Scale with the result that instead

of charging $\frac{1}{8}$ for butter he charged £3:17:7²⁰
 For milk he charged £4:2:0 instead of 5/4
 and for flour he charged 16/3 instead of
 1/3 making a total loss of £8:4:7 the
 amount now charged against him. In
 the previous half year the loss amounted to
 £19:1:2 which amount has since been paid,
 and the amount now surcharged represents
 the loss from April 1 to July 6-1915, the date
 of his departure from Clifden
