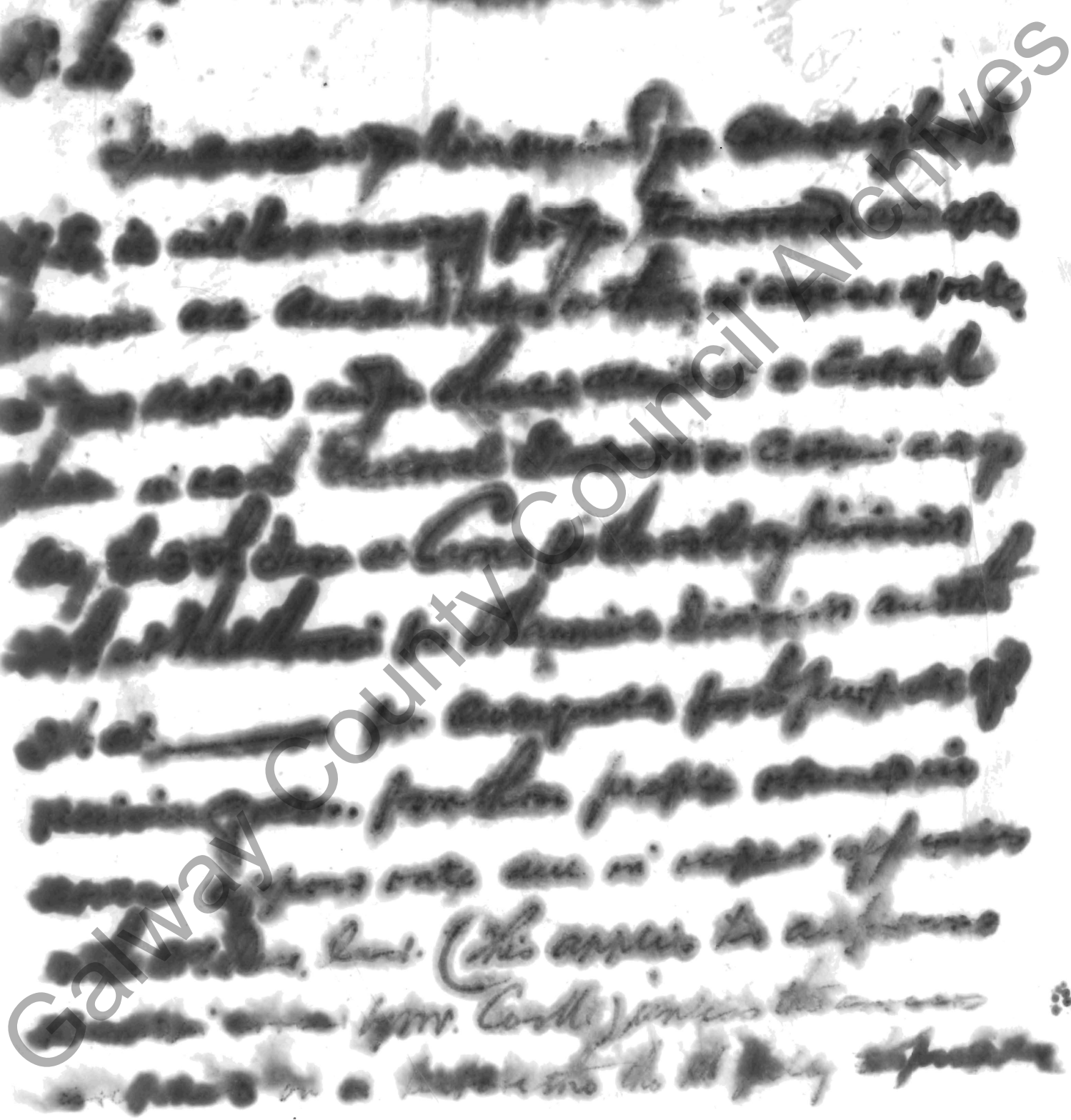

Referring to the Reports furnished you on the 25th of May and 6th day of July last with respect of your house to house inspection of your district, of which you state that certain houses in the town of Alfden are deficient in "Water, Open arrangements and are not connected with the town Water Supply"; I am directed by the Rural District Council to request that you will be good enough to state specifically whether the absence of such Sanitary Conveniences constitutes a nuisance and as such is dangerous to the public health and particularly to the inhabitants of such premises.

You are also requested to report on the number of Hogsties in the town of Alfden in which pigs, Cattle & horses are kept, and furnish the names of the occupiers of such premises and also state if the keeping of such animals in dwelling or in close proximity thereto constitutes a nuisance and whether the meaning of the Public Health Act.
