Resolved: — That in future when Medical Officers make Requisitions for medical and surgical Appliances to replace Instruments in stock, immediately the fresh supply is received the condemned Instruments are to be lodged with the Clerk of the Union.

The price of the new supply will be deducted from the Salary of Medical Officers failing to comply with this resolution; and in future also a record of medical and surgical Appliances when given to patients in receipt of Medical Relief shall appear in the Medical Relief Register opposite the name of such patient and dates when delivered or returned as the case may be shall be inserted in the Register.

The blocks of requisitions form of giving particulars of notice should be returned to me by you within the coming week.

Every householder in each Electoral Division should appear. No such persons should be omitted from your supplemental lists unless they already appear on the Register.

You might also circulate that unless Form 22 is returned within the required time no copy form date of notice summoners may be issued against persons failing to comply and in addition they run the risk of being disfranchised.

I shall be glad if you could let me have the supplemental lists not later than the 20th instant to quote with the printed lists. I have nothing more to say except to express a hope that we shall have a complete list for each Division and that intervening candidates for the position of County or District Councillors will have no complaints so far as our work is concerned.
