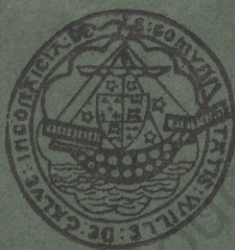

The advance of the scheme in County Galway (as in the other counties of Ireland) in using to the full the peculiar opportunities open to it by placing itself in close communication with the public school system, and with the influences continually at work in industrial and artistic development are among the most striking phenomena of the time. The popularity of the County Library is due in no small degree to the services, co-operation and influence of the members of the Committee.

Co-operation.

The church, the school and the library are institutions which naturally constitute a triple alliance. Co-operation between the library and the school is being rapidly developed. School libraries have increased from 68 to 96 in the year. The increased help, both direct and indirect, of the clergy by recommending books and guiding library taste, has been responsible for increasing the use of the library. Rural centres now number 194, as compared with 161 last year. Among organisations, parish and temperance clubs have played a large part in assisting library interests. This is especially marked in Galway, Tuam, Portumna and Ballinasloe, where the library gives the clubs all possible encouragement and help. The active co-operation between the library and the County Vocational Education Committee has resulted in increased issues of books required in carrying out the programme of the classes, and represents over 1,000 additional issues of works in the Irish language, Irish literature, technology, and domestic economy. The help given under this head by the Ministry's Inspector, Mr. Sheridan, and by the Chief Executive Officer, Mr. S. O'Baoighill, and his staff must be recorded. Acknowledgment of the unstinted interest shown by the public Press—in particular by "The Connacht Tribune" and its allied paper, "The Connacht Sentinel," in giving space to the many matters which bring the library to the attention of the public and informing readers of progress in library interests.

Lectures.

The difficulties met with in organising lecture courses under the library's auspices have been twofold: (a) the expense of securing the best talent; and (b) the lack of public appreciation as shown by the very poor attendances. The results of three years' experience have shown that the cost has not been justified, and the scheme has been abandoned.

Library Exhibitions.

The exhibits of posters, books, pamphlets, manuscripts, photographs, illustrations and objects of antiquarian interest at the county feiseanna during the year created in many places interest in books in general, and in the library in particular. Their effectiveness, as attested by actual book demands, has shown that the exhibitions are a most economical investment, both as to time and cash outlay.

Carnegie Trust Grants.

The Carnegie Trustees, fully realising that the development of the Galway Library Scheme has led to the need for suitable headquarters on a far more considerable scale than was required for the inception of the library, have made a grant of £400 out of their allocation towards the cost of the new County Library Headquarters. This amount is payable on the completion of the new County Council offices in accordance with the plans (which

includes a library designed on modern and up-to-date lines) prepared by the County Surveyor, Mr. M. J. Kennedy. The Trustees have also granted the sum of £600 for the purchase of additional books.

Branches.

It is easier to secure a new and adequate branch building in a community which has been served by a temporary branch than to raise funds for a building in a neighbourhood without previous library service. Thanks to the Vocational Education Committee, the Chief Executive Officer and Principal of the local school, a section of the Ballinasloe Vocational Education Centre has been placed *gratis* at the disposal of the library for use as a Branch Library. Although only in operation six weeks it may be seen by the statistical appendix that the project promises to be a success.

The Loughrea Temperance Club Committee has offered a portion of the Club's premises for use as a Branch Library at a nominal rent. It is hoped to open this branch in October next.

Statistics.

The large increase in the total number of books issued during the past year naturally means that all classes of literature show individual increases. The most considerable of these increases are, of course, in fiction (which accounts for practically a half of the year's total) and juvenile works, with a relatively substantial increase in books in the Irish language and Irish literature respectively.

The second portion of the statistical appendix shows the percentage of issues in each class of literature. It will be seen that the percentage of fiction read has decreased in the rural areas and increased in the urban areas (rural -3.50% and urban +.06%). In passing, it may be noted that "reading seasons" are no longer so concentrated as they were, but are now spread more evenly over the whole year.

The following brief explanation is necessary for the proper understanding of the information supplied by the analytical tables. First of all, the tables represent the books issued for home reading only. They do not represent the encyclopædais, guide books, dictionaries, etc., consulted in the library headquarters. If the figures showing these consultations were to be included, the totals would attain astronomical proportions, but they would hardly represent the principal work of the library. Again, the figures shown are those compiled from the issues and records kept at the centres and at headquarters, and do not include the issues at the few centres where the records are not properly kept.

The arrangement of the analysis is based on the Dewey Decimal System of classification—a system in use in all Irish county libraries—and this enables the County Galway Library Scheme to be compared with that of every other county issuing statistics.

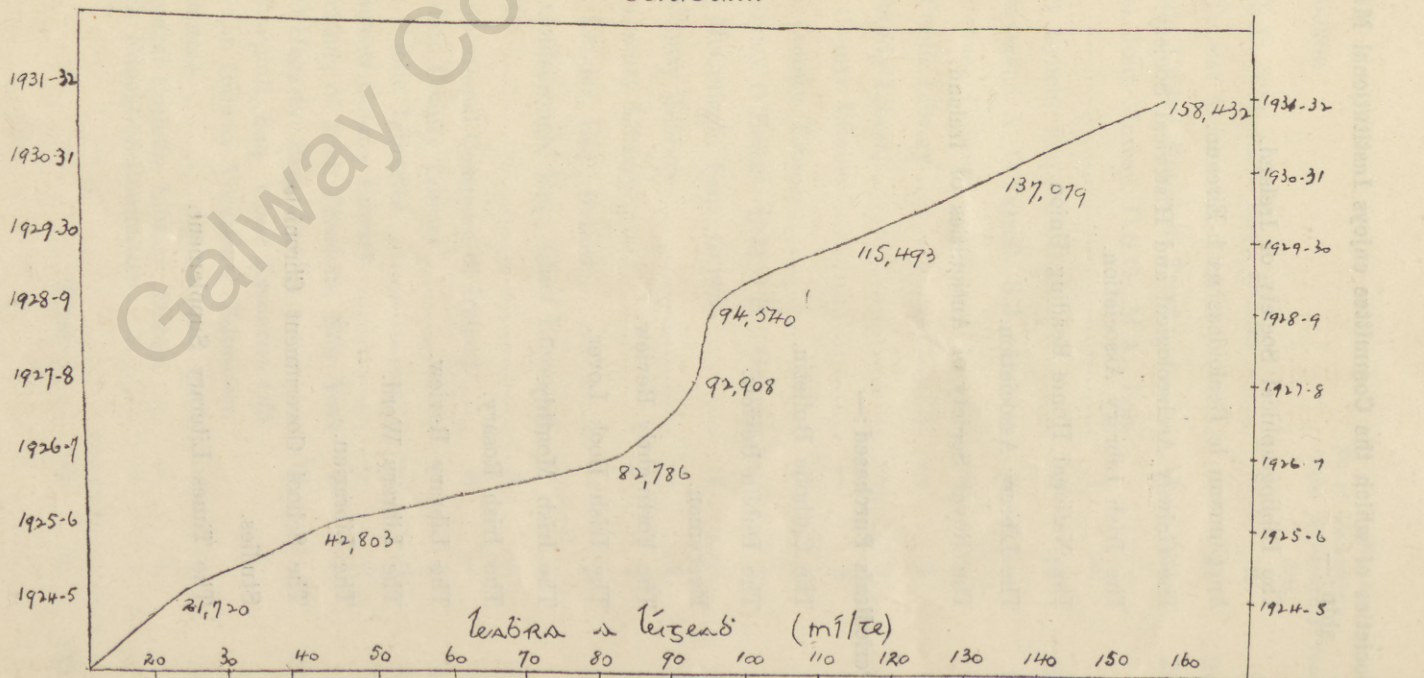
