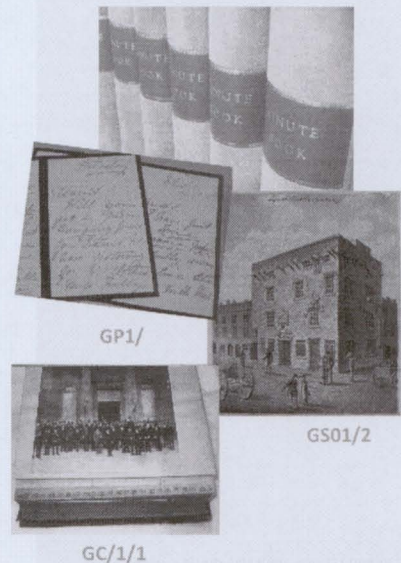

Dear Captain Downie,

Referring to your letter re the manufacture of horse shoes by local Smithies, could you give me any information as to -

- (1) The extent of the order that would be placed say for County Galway.
- (2) The price which would be paid.
- (3) Where the shoes would be finally accepted.
- (4) Will delivery be taken at a Railway Station in the County of Galway.
- (5) Would the Government, if necessary, give facilities for the supply of materials.

Before starting on an elaborate attempt to organize local smithies it would be necessary to have some general information on these points. As a rule the local smithy is a "small" man who is not in a position to subject himself to serious commitments. If properly organized there is no doubt that the labour of these men could be turned to considerable advantage by the State, but somebody will have to undertake all the work of organization.

I can, if necessary, obtain a list showing the location of every smithy in the County with the nearest Railway Station and the distance from same, but I do not want to look for work unless there is some prospect of good resulting from it.
