GALWAY COUNTY COUNCIL.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE ON
ESTIMATES 1927/1928.

The total estimate put before us by the Secretary amounts to £298,718. Of this sum £285,058 represents services which the Finance Committee have no power to reduce, leaving out of the whole Estimate a sum of £13,660 which may or may not be liable to reduction. Of this sum £10,340 represents administrative and other salaries, leaving a sum of £3,320 for our further consideration. This is made up of Law, £1,000; Elections, £400; Pensions, £520; Library Act, £900, and Tourist Advertising, £500. This must further be reduced by Pensions, £520, leaving the other four items amounting to £2,800. Of these four items, the provision for Tourist Advertising and Library Act have been directed by the County Council by resolution, and we are of opinion that the provisions for Law and advance of £400 for Elections, which will have to be made about October next, are reasonable.

With regard to the Road Estimate, the special attention of the Committee is drawn to the Ministry's letter of the 28th Jan., 1927. The difficulty we are in is that the Public Bodies' Order does not provide any machinery for revising a public roads scheme once it has been settled by the County Council. We think, however, that every effort should be made by the County Council to continue the inflow of Road Grants to the County.

There is no provision in the Estimate for the salary and expenses of a County Medical Officer of Health, as the Committee were of opinion that they could not review the decision of the County Council with regard to this matter. There is, however, no financial difficulty so far as the estimate is concerned as, owing to the state of the account, the Committee are not recommending any general rate for Health Charges in the Estimate for 1927-1928.

COUNTY SERVICES:—The Mental Hospital Demand is included in the Estimates in full. The Finance Committee leave to the Mental Hospital Committee the full responsibility for this Demand. The attention of Council is drawn to correspondence re Mental Hospital Demand.

POOR RELIEF:—Tuberculosis and old Union Pensions and Loans are now included under this head as they will henceforth be County-at-Large charges. In the same way the late Rural District Council pensions are included under Health Charges for which, as explained above, there is no rate proposed for this year.

SEPARATE CHARGES:—Owing to abnormal loss of rate occurring in the Loughrea and Clifden districts, due principally to failure to recover rates on Labourers' Cottages in Loughrea, a loss which has extended over several years, and losses arising out of ruined buildings in Clifden and failure to collect rates on Islands, there are considerable debit balances against those districts in the Separate Charge Adjustments Account, and the Committee recommend that the rate required in Loughrea be spread over two years, and the rate in Clifden over three years for these Separate Charges.

The Secretary's estimate proposed a nett general rate of 7/7 in the £ on land, but the Secretary reported to the Committee that this is based on the assumption that the Minister for Finance will provide under the Finance Act the same amount for Agricultural Grant as was provided for the current year, *i.e.*, double the normal amount. This provision has not yet been made by Parliament. It also assumes that no new charges will be placed on the estimates.

The Secretary has asked us to recommend the County Council to restore, if possible, the original County Surveyors' estimates for road work, but we have decided to leave this matter entirely to the County Council.

The Committee again desire to impress on the County Council the serious loss to the ratepayers that is occurring by reason of the failure of Rate Collectors to carry out the terms of their Bond, and they recommend the County Council to adopt the suggestion contained in the last paragraph of the Memorandum issued by the Local Government Department in their letter No. 56951 of the 10th December, 1926.

LAND COMMISSION ANNUITIES.—The efforts made by the County Council on several occasions to obtain a satisfactory account of the actual losses to County Rates arising out of failure of Land Commission to collect Land Purchase Annuities, having quite failed, the Committee have directed the Secretary to ask for—

- (a) a full list of defaulters up to the latest possible date; and
- (b) the amount deducted from County Galway Grants under this head.

We further recommend the County Council to organise with other County Councils with a view to having the Local Taxation Fund released from any liability in respect of Land Purchase Annuities.

I am directed by the Finance Committee to inform you that they notice from Table C of your Form 43, that you estimate that there will be a balance against the Fund of the Mental Hospital on the 31st March next amounting to £12,600. On reference to the corresponding Tables in the Demand for the year ending March 1927, they find that you brought forward a debit balance of £10,800 in the Demand for the current year, being an estimated debit balance on the 31st March, 1926.

The whole of this estimated debit balance plus the whole of your Demand for the year ending March, 1927 will have been paid over to the Mental Hospital Account before the end of the current financial year, and the Finance Committee, therefore, cannot understand how it is estimated that at the end of the current financial year the Mental Hospital Committee will be £12,600 in debt, except upon the assumption that during the current financial year the Committee will have spent £12,600 more than they demand from the two contributing counties.

The Finance Committee would be obliged if you would favour them with an explanation for their meeting to be held on the 29th instant.

SIR,

In reply to your letter of the 25th inst., No. F.C.M. 3718. The estimated debit balance of £12,600 on 31st March, 1927, includes an estimated amount of £5,500 to pay March bills. This amount has been included on the instructions of the Committee of Management so that each financial year may henceforth stand on its own assessment.

With reference to the Estimate for year ending 31st March, 1927. Although there was a debit balance estimated for on 31st March, 1926, the Committee of Management deducted from the items of expenditure of my original estimate £11,000, leaving the amount to be obtained from the County Councils totally inadequate to run the Institution.

From each Annual Estimate submitted large amounts have been deducted by the Committee of Management and the County Councils which always resulted in leaving a large debit balance at the end of the financial year. The Committee of Management when considering the Estimate for year ending 31st March, 1928, on the 10th inst., reduced the estimate by me by £5,888.

The amount estimated as a deficit to occur on 31st March, 1926, was £10,800. The actual deficit as certified by the Auditor *was* £9,167/1/1. This deficit did not include the debts incurred during March and due on the 31st of that month, which amounted to £5,631/5/1, so that the real deficit of 31st March, 1926, was £14,798/6/2, from which, for purposes of accuracy, may be deducted a sum of £300 in the hands of the R.M.S.

It is intended to pay the March bills in future out of the estimate for the year ending 31st March, as was hitherto the custom.
