Presumably the gross receipts are larger than they were before the increases in rates and fares which now obtain and under the Working Agreement the Working Company is bound to pay a proportion of the gross receipts to the owning Company. The effect of the provision, therefore, of which the County Council complain is to allow the working Company to get out of its bargain at the expense of the Guaranteeing ratepayers. The practical course is, as suggested, that the Deputies for Co. of Galway in the Dail should be induced to press the Government (with the aid of any other influence, which may be made available) to bring to an end a state of affairs whereby the ratepayers are being prejudiced.

carried. and it was ordered:—That the appointments be adjourned for a week: Secretary to communicate with the applicants: Personal attendance necessary, and proof of age and knowledge of Irish also necessary.

Subsequently Mr. Conroy, Solicitor, appaered before the Council on behalf of the Inspectors whose services were dispensed with in 1921, and claimed that they had a right to reappointmnt, and the Council instructed the Secretary and the County Solicitor to go into the matter and inform Mr. Conroy as to the position the matter stands in.
