CO. SURVEYOR'S REPORT.—WESTERN DIVISION.

9th February, 1924.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

The Certificates on Form 22 for the Rural Districts of Galway and Tuam are an indication of the amount of work done by the Road Contractors in these Districts for the Quarter ending December 31st. A considerable quantity of repair work was carried out, and the supply of metal provided was greater than that for the corresponding period in previous years. To cope with the heavy and increasing motor traffic on important roads the manner of spreading and repairing roads has to be radically changed, and while every effort is being made to induce contractors to adopt new methods, many of them still persist in working on the old lines. The new contractors for the District Roads in the Gort District have made fair progress during their first period. All main roads in Clifden, Gort, and Oughterard, have been well repaired during the quarter, and the district roads in Clifden and Oughterard with a few minor exceptions have also been put into fair order.

The following damaged Bridges have been permanently restored: Curraghmore, Cloonmore, Grange, Cahergal, Cloon, Dunkellin, Whistle, Oranmore, Rahoon, Lough Inch, Shindilla and Screeb Road Bridge. Three gangs are presently at work, and, given favourable weather conditions, I hope to have the process of restoration accelerated during the coming months

The steam-rolling of the Tuam-Dunmore road is progressing satisfactorily. About 5 miles of road is now finished, and by the end of May I hope to have this work completed. The preparation of material for rolling part of the Galway-Moycullen Road is well advanced, and rolling could be started if a steam-roller were available. All the Plant at my disposal is engaged on the Dunmore Road.

The Council is aware that the road from Galway to Tuam was recently rolled. This work is showing evidence of wear, owing to the very heavy motor traffic, and I fear that unless a special effort is made to bind the surface that this road will be badly damaged during the coming Spring and Summer. In my opinion an application of tar to the crown of this road will go a long way to preserving the surface, and I have made application for a sum of £1,000 to be granted by the Council for doing this work.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg to report that work has proceeded satisfactorily in my District during the Quarter ended 31st December, 1923.

On the hard main roads under my care, and particularly those subjected to heavy Motor traffic I find that the old method of maintenance of spreading out loose patches of stones is merely a waste of labour and money. It is absolutely essential that some new scheme for the continual patch rolling of those roads be devised immediately. Not like formerly those heavy traffic roads require almost as much attention and repair during the Summer months as they do in Winter, and it is obvious that the results obtained by filling pot-holes with loose stones during dry weather are anything but good, besides being a regular source of annoyance to road users. I am of opinion that if the County Council purchase two Steamrollers complete, and supplied them free of the usual hiring charges I would, with the money available for maintenance be able to keep all the principal roads free from pot-holes and loose stones during the Summer months.

I am paying particular attention to high hedges and overhanging branches, and expect to have them all removed before the expiration of the present quarter.

GLENAMADDY R.D.—All roads have been attended to and are now in excellent condition.

Ballinasloe R.D.—All roads have been sheeted, cleaned and drained. As the balances available are now extremely small, only very little work can be carried out until 1st April.

LOUGHREA R.D.—As maintenance work has not proceeded uniformly in this district, the roads are not up to their usual standard, but I hope by end of the present quarter to have all roads in a good condition before handing over to the new contractors.

MOUNTBELLEW R.D.—Work is proceeding satisfactorily in this District and all roads should be in a good condition for the Summer.

PORTUMNA R.D.—All roads have been thoroughly sheeted, edged, drained and are now in excellent condition.

That Collectors be granted protection subject to the fol-

lowing conditions :-Collectors must give at least seven days' notice to the Command Adjutant at Command Headquarters;

Requisitions for protection must not be sent to Commanders of Local Posts;

Collectors are not to assume that protection will be available at any given place or date until they have a notification in writing to this effect from the Command Adjutant concerned;

Collections must be at definite places. Military will not travel about from place to place.

The Addresses of Command Adjutants are:

Command Adjutant, Command Headquarters, Limerick. Command Adjutant, Command Headquarters, Claremorris. Command Adjutant, Command Headquarters, Athlone. Collectors must use motor transport where the military use motor transport. The military will supply their own transport but will not convey the Collectors.

Money will be lodged in Bank by Collectors when possible. If it is not possible, money must be handed over to the O/C Post who will give a receipt for the amount.

The O/C Post will hold the money until it is possible for the Collector to lodge it under Escort; when O/C Post transfers money the Collector will endorse and return the receipt.

Overlapping of Commands:

Troops supplying protection to a Collector may, if necessary, travel outside their own Command Area if the work necessary, sitates so doing.

As Collector will require protection for at least a month this will necessitate the setting up of a temporary Military Post there. Collector will proceed as soon as Military arrangements complete.

I am directed by the Minister for Local Government to state for the information of the Galway County Council that a sum of £32,220 has been provisionally allocated to the Council out of the above-mentioned grant for the improvement of Trunk Roads. In addition, the Minister is prepared to meet the loan charges payable over a period of ten years in respect of a sum not exceeding £8,880, if raised by the Council by loan from their Treasurer with the Minister's sanction for the purchase of road machinery. In the event of the Council being satisfied that it is not necessary for them to purchase additional road plant or if they themselves decide to bear the loan charges the sum of £8,880 will be added to the grant and will be available for road improvement.

On the question of central purchasing the County Surveyor should communicate with the Trade Department of this Ministry (50 Upper Mount Street, Dublin), as to the Council's requirements as soon as details have been settled with the Roads Department.

The following further grants over and above those mentioned have been provisionally allocated to the Urban Districts in the County for road improvement and will be payable to the Councils of these districts through the County Council, viz:—

The Urban Districts of Ballinasloe, £1,000. Galway, £3,400.

A separate notification is being sent to the Urban District Councils concerned. It is open to the County Council to supplement the amounts allocated to the Urban Districts out of the grant allocated to the County Council.

The following are the conditions governing the grant :-

- (1) The Grant shall be for Trunk Roads only. The grant shall not be conditional on any contribution from the County Rates but shall not be taken as relieving the County Council from responsibility from reasonable and economical road maintenance.
- (2) The selection of road lengths to be improved, specifications and methods by which it is proposed to carry out the works shall be approved by the Chief Engineer or such other Engineer as may be designated by the Minister. Inspections shall be carried out by him or his assistants as the work proceeds, and in all cases before final payments are made. The Minister shall take such steps as he may deem proper either by way of withholding further payment or refusing to sanction payment or otherwise in case of unsatisfactory work.
- (3) The portions of road selected must not be too numerous.
- (4) Payments shall be made on requisition Form No. 97, certified by the County Surveyor:—
- (a) On commencement of work an amount estimated to provide for the payments by the Authority during the next following two months.

- (b) During the second month after commencement of work an amount estimated to provide for the payments by the Authority during the third month, and so on from month to month until eighty per cent. of the Grant has been paid, after which the Authority will submit through the County Surveyor to the Minister a statement showing their expenditure up to date, and the Minister will then determine what further instalments should be paid under the Grant.
- (c) On completion of the work the Authority will supply the Minister with a certificate of their Surveyor stating that the works have been completed, and stating (with such particulars as may be required by the forms then in use by the Ministry) the total expenditure incurred on the works described in this Grant.
- (5) Contract agreements with the County Surveyor which may be arrived at by accepting tenders or by fixing piece work rates will be best for quarrying, breaking and carting of stone; piece work rates may even be arranged for rolling. No hard and fast rules thereon will be insisted upon. In some cases haulage will de done by tractors. On that point the Minister directs that as far as practicable horse haulage should be encouraged. In all cases of piece work arrangements should be such as to give labourers or men of small means an opportunity of undertaking work.
- (6) The County Surveyor, who will be entrusted with the carrying through of the work, must have reasonable office accommodation clerical and technical assistance and travelling expenses. Substantial provision is already made by many County Councils in these matters but in others such facilities are not adequate. Councils should therefore review the position of their Survey Staff as no useful progress can be made unless the County Surveyor can call on the full time of the Assistant Surveyors.

(7) The maximum rate of wages which can be paid to labourers employed on work in non-Urban areas in the County under the grant is 27 shillings per week for the period ending October next. The rate will be subject to revision as from 1st November, 1924.

(8) Preference is to be given to demoblised men of the National Army suitable and willing to undertake road work. Lists of such men will be obtainable by the County Surveyor (or his Deputy) from the local office of the Ministry of Industry and Commerce, and the Officer-in-Charge of the Local Office should be notified of the names of the men selected.

In view of the urgency of road improvement and of the necessity for relieving unemployment the Council should take steps forhwith to expedite the inauguration of a suitable road scheme.

Councillor Walsh proposed, The Chairman seconded: -" That agreat many of these cases refer to Wardsmaids and Wardsmen, and other domestic officers, and that the status of such servants appears to have been the subject of considerable doubt. The Council find that in November, 1921, the view that Wardsmaids or Wardsmen are not deemed to be entitled to either pension or gratuity obtained official approval. Eventually the Board decided to give three months salary in such cases, and finally decided on one year's compensation. They appear to have been led to this decision both having regard to the conditions governing domestic service generally and to the fact that many of these servants started as inmates of the workhouses. There may be, here and there, a case calling for special treatment, but the Council consider that such treatment should be ex gratia, and that in the first instance the decisions of the Board of Health should be upheld. The position of the ratepayers in regard to Gratuities granted by the Guardians is very serious having regard to the provisions of Section 11. Nearly all the cases now at issue were really decided and accepted by all parites, the amounts paid, and no questions raised until the parties were set going by the unfortunate draughtmanship of Section 11. For the ultimate financial effect of this situation neither the Board of Health nor the County Council can accept any responsibility for. They can now only express their regret that the authorities on the spot responsible for the framing, development and working of the scheme through two very troublesome years were not consulted before these very serious provisions were adopted. That the views of the Council on the individual cases are as set out on the foregoing Minute."-Passed.

1. We have been appointed by a Joint Committee of the Central Hospital and Sanatorium Committees to report upon the existing accommodation in each Institution and to suggest means whereby a satisfactory solution of the accommodation difficulty can be arrived at.

2. We find that, even with full staff and full bed space in Renmore Sanatorium, the needs of the County as regards tuberculous patients will not be met.

3. We recommend, therefore, that to make Renmore effective as a centre for the treatment and isolation of T.B. patients, there should be an extension of existing accommodation in the form of an additional pavillion to house at least thirty beds.

4. The Galway Central Hospitals. Obviously it could not, in addition, eater satisfactorily for the needs of tuberculous patients of the County. Even with the added wards and better accommodation that the new Central Hospital will afford, the old objection of mixing T.B. with other patients will, to a large extent relieve, if not obviate, the difficulty.

5. As regards the accommodation of T.B. patients in the Central Hospital prior to the addition such as has been suggested at Remmore we suggest that, as the latter cannot deal with the County's requirements at the moment, the Central

Hospital must continue to accommodate some of the T.B. patients. We hope to effect an arrangement whereby the T.B. patients in the latter Institution will not over flow beyond the wards hitherto allotted to them and that, therefore, there will be no mixing of T.B. with other patients as has been the case up to now.

6. In suggesting this new addition to Renmore Sanatorium, we feel that we are not acting contrary to the interests of either ratepayers or the T.B. patients of County Galway. Treated in the Central Hospital the cost of each poor patient's maintenance is borne entirely by the rates. In the past two years there have been seldom at any time less than twenty-five tuberculous patients in the Hospital. This means that we have always with us in this Institution a large number of patients who can be looked upon as a continual charge. The T.B. patient is admittedly the most expensive type of patient to provide for owing to the fact that special and high-priced foods are required for his upkeep. If treated in Renmore, for every penny expended upon him or her, one half-penny is refunded by the Treasury. In addition, ratepayers must pay for the upkeep in the Central Hospital of insured patients, whereas in Renmore, the Insurance Committee pay at the rate of £2 2s. 0d., per week per case, irrespective of the stage of disease, and this money does not come out of the County rates.

7. We suggest the borrowing of £4,000, subject to the

rates.

7. We suggest the borrowing of £4,000, subject to the approval of your architect for the proposed addition. The interest on this sum would, we imagine, be possibly borne in equal shares by the Treasury and the local body.

8. We feel that any suggestion that will involve increased expenditure must be made and received with caution. On the other hand, the state of County Galway as regards the tuberculous population is sufficiently desperate as to warrant us in asking the County Council to advance one step further in the path they have already trod. The unfortunate victims of the White Scourge have no one to speak for them authoritatively save the Doctors who are in close touch with their desperate situation and it is because of their plight and because of the fact that for years no effort has been made effectively to meet this problem, that we ask you to go the whole way in this matter and complete the arrangements for their isolation and effective treatment.



#### Re Drainage Maintenance Act, 1924.

Sir,

The above Act will not affect County Councils or existing Drainage Boards unless the Commissioners of Public Works after receipt of a Report from their Engineer, consider that the Drainage Works in any drainage district are not in a fit and proper condition. They may then improve and repair such drainage works and may, without the consent of the existing Drainage Board or Trustees transfer the business of such Drainage Board or Trustees, to the County Council of the County in which the drainage works are situate or to two or more County Councils if the works extend into any adjoining Counties.

The cost of the execution of such drainage work and all incidental expenses shall be borne as follows:-

1.—The Minister of Finance shall contribute such sum not exceeding one half of the entire cost as he shall think proper out of monies to be provided by the Oireachtas.

2.—The County Council or County Councils affected shall contribute such sum, not exceeding one half of the total cost as such Council or Councils, with the approval of the Minister for Local Government and Public Health shall think proper.

3.—The balance of such cost shall be provided by the Com-

missioners of Public Works.

The County Council may borrow this money and the cost of the loan and the monies required for repayment shall be raised by means of the Poor Rate and shall be a County at large charge, unless the County Council resolves that it be levied off any district specially benefited by the works, but such resolution must be confirmed by the Minister for Local Government, and he shall not approve unless he is satisfied that notice of resolution was sent by the County Council within one week after the passing thereof to the Council of every County District affected by the resolution, and after consideration of any representations that such District Council shall submit to the Minister within one month after receipt of such notice, or the Minister may hold an inquiry as to the proper area of

The proportion of the cost of the Drainage works payable by the Commissioners of Public Works shall be advanced by the Commissioners to the County Council by way of loan, and shall be repayable to the Commissioners by the County Council with such interest as the Minister of Finance shall direct. The Commissioners shall however, charge this loan on the lands of the district in favour of the County Council who shall be obliged to collect such charges, and they shall have the same powers of collecting same, but if the Council shall be unable to collect the full amount payable under such Charging Order by the Occupiers of the lands they must pay the deficiency out of Poor Rate and this deficiency shall be made a County at large charge, and the Commissioners have power to recover the full amount from the County Council or Councils by action at law.

If those provisions of the Act therefore are put in force it will impose a great responsibility on the County Council affected, because apart from the fact that they will be expected to make a voluntary contribution towards the cost of the improvements they will be responsible for repayment of the amount, the Commissioners of Public Works shall provide whether or not they collect the amount, and they will also be responsible for the future maintenance of the works, and the Council will have no check on the initial expenditure as the works shall not be transferred to them until the new improvements shall be completed by the Board of Works.
