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
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

4957. Galway Harbour Development:

Heard Messrs. P. O'Gorman, T. J. W. Kenny, and T. C. McDonogh, representing the Galway Harbour Commissioners and the Galway Urban Council, and the Very Rev. Canon Nestor, P.P.

After discussion

Councillor Corbett proposed, Councillor O'Carroll seconded:—"That a Committee consisting of four members of the Council and four members of the Deputation be formed to confer for the purpose of arriving at a solution to the question of the constitution of Board of Commissioners or Trustees to be established by or in pursuance of the proposed Act, for the Development of Galway Harbour and report to the Council."—Passed.

The following were appointed on the Committee:—
Councillors Corbett, Dowling, McKeigue, and Cooke, representing the County Council, and Messrs. P. O'Gorman, T. C. McDonogh, T. J. W. Kenny, and M. Hynes, representing the Galway Harbour Commissioners and the Galway Urban Council.

The Committee adjourned to an adjoining office, and having submitted their recommendations to the County Council.

Councillor Corbett proposed, Councillor Dowling seconded:—

1. "That the Board of Commissioners or Trustees to be established by, or in pursuance of, the proposed Act for the Development of Galway Harbour consist of the following members:—

(a) Ex-Officio Members-3.

The Chairman for the time being of Galway County Council.

The Chairman for the time being of the Finance Committee of the Galway County Council. The Chairman of Galway Urban Council.

(b) Nominated Members—8.

Five persons to be nominated by the Galway County Council in such a manner as to give one representative to each of the five County Electoral Areas.

One person to be nominated by Galway Urban Council.

Two to be nominated by the Minister for Industry and Commerce.

(c) Elected Members-12.

Twelve persons to be elected on the franchise and membership qualification prescribed for the election of Harbour Commissioners by the Galway Harbour and Port Act, 1853, subject to review by the Ministry for Industry and Commerce.

Provided always, that any person elected or appointed in any one of the manners prescribed by the proposed Act for the Development of Galway Harbour shall while so elected or appointed be incligible to be appointed or elected a member of the Board in any other manner.

II. "That the first Board of Commissioners shall be appointed in accordance with the foregoing so soon as practicable after the passing of the Act, and that thereafter the nomination and election of members shall take place in every third successive year.

III. "That the previous resolution of the Council regarding the conditions of its guarantee be amended accordingly on receipt of the written assent of the Galway Urban Council and Galway Harbour Board to the foregoing proposals, but that failing the consent of both of these bodies, within a reasonable time, the former resolution of the Council shall remain unaltered subject to any subsequent decision of the Council."—Passed.
