MINUTES OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE MEETING held at the County Buildings, Prospect Hill, Galway, at 12 o'clock noon, on Tuesday, the 24th day of January,

Councillor E. Corbett, Chairman of the Council presided with Deputy Beegan, Chairman of the County Board of Health and Public Assistance.

The other members of the Committee present were :-Representing Galway County Council:—Councillors Killilea, C.D., M. W. Cahill, P. Colleran, T. Burke, H. C. O'Toole and M. Ashe.

Representing Galway County Board of Health and Public Assistance: Councillors J. Keane, P. Lambert, P. Concannon and T. Mannion.

The Officials in attendance were :- Mr. T. C. Courtney, M.E., M.I.C.E.I., Chief Engineering Advisor to Department of Local Government and Public Health.

Mr. J. Gallagher, Secretary of the County Board of Health and Public Assistance and Mr. C. I. O'Flynn, Secretary of the Galway County Council.

Mr. Geo. Lee, B.E., M.I.C.E.I., County Surveyor of the South Eastern Division of the County, and Acting County Surveyor of the North Western Division.

Messrs. M. Sweeney, A.M.I.C.E.I., M. Martyn, B.E., Collins, B.E., E. Lynch, B.E., and M. O'Keeffe, B.E., Assistant County Surveyors, with Mr. J. Dunne, Town Surveyor, Ballinasloe, (Mr. R. W. Powell, B.E., Assistant Co. Surveyor, was not in attendance).

The County Secretary explained that the meeting had been summoned on the direction of the Galway County Council to consider a letter received from the Department of Local Government and Public Health, and to submit for the approval of the County Council and County Board of Health recommendations for a County Engineering Scheme.

The County Secretary then read the letter (Ref. RS/11, dated 11th January, 1939) received from the Department of Local Government and Public Health, and Mr. Courtney explained the objects of the Re-organisation Scheme outlined in the letter.

Irish Language: The County Secretary stated that he had received communications from three branches of the Gaelic League requesting the Council to see that the County Surveyor appointed be a person with a competent knowledge of Irish.

Appointment of one County Surveyor for the entire County: On a proposal made by Councillor Ashe and seconded by Councillor P. Lambert, it was unanimously decided to recommend that one County Surveyor be appointed for the entire County, as a whole time officer; that he be appointed at an inclusive salary; that he be responsible for all engineering work for the County Council, and that he act in an advisory capacity to the Board of Health whenever required to do so, and that Mr. Geo. Lee, B.E., County Surveyor, be appointed to the position.

Appointment of Board of Health Engineer and two Senior Assistant Engineers: On a proposal made by Councillor Keane and seconded by Councillor Ashe it was unanimously decided to recommend the appointment of a Board of Health Engineer, and two Senior Assistant Engineers who would act as Senior Assistants to the County Surveyor, and that the three appointees be appointed as whole time Officers at an inclusive salary.

Appointment of Mr. Maurice Sweeney, A.M.I.C.E.I., as Board of Health Engineer: A proposal made by Councillor Ashe and seconded by Councillor Killilea recommending the appointment of Mr. Maurice Sweeney as Board of Health Engineer was adopted unanimously.

Assistant to Board of Health Engineer: It was decided that the question of appointing any permanent assistant to the Board of Health Engineer could be deferred and that temporary assistance could be made available whenever required, on such terms as the Board of Health might decide with the approval of the Minister.

Appointment of Assistant County Surveyors: It was unanimously decided on a proposal made by Councillor P. Lambert and seconded by Councillor M. W. Cahill that the number of Assistant County Surveyors be six, including Mr. J. Dunne of Ballinasloe; that they be whole time officers appointed at inclusive salaries, and that they be responsible for County Council engineering work under the County Surveyor, and Board of Health maintenance works under the Board of Health engineer, and that each Assistant Surveyor should have his County Council work and Board of Health work in the same area.

It was also decided to leave the allocation of areas to be fixed on the recommendations of the County Surveyor.

A proposal for the appointment of a seventh Assistant County Surveyor was deferred pending receipt of the recommendations of the County Surveyor as it was considered that he might find that six would suffice.

Remuneration of Engineers: On a proposal made by Councillor Killilea and seconded by Councillor H. C. O'Toole it was unanimously decided to recommend the adoption of the following scales of remuneration:—

County Surveyor, £850 p.a. by annual increments of £25 p.a. to a maximum of £1,000 p.a.

Board of Health Engineer, £650 p.a. by £20 p.a. to a maximum of £800 p.a.

Senior Assistants, £500 p.a. by £20 p.a. to a maximum of £650 p.a.

Assistant Surveyors, £300 p.a. by £15 p.a. to a maximum of £450, with the exception in the case of Mr. J. Dunne of Ballinasloe for whom a fixed salary of £300 was recommended subject to his being permitted to retain his position as Engineer to Ballinasloe Urban District Council.

It was decided, however, that in the case of the appointment of an existing officer to any of the foregoing positions, credit be given, in arriving at the appropriate salary, for any completed years of service prior to the adoption of this reorganisation scheme.

In fixing the scales of remuneration the Committee had regard to (a) the necessity of providing the necessary and efficient supervisory organisation for the effective working of the reorganised scheme, and (b) the total remuneration of which existing officers were in receipt from the County Council and the County Board of Health.

Travelling Expenses and Subsistence Allowance: it was decided to recommend the allowance of travelling expenses to the engineers appointed in pursuance of these recommendations at the following rates:—

For car of 10 h.p. or over—6d. per mile. For car under 10 h.p.—5d. per mile.

and that refunds of motor tax be granted as hitherto.

In the cases of Assistant Surveyors the refund of travelling expenses to be made at the foregoing rates only in respect of travelling within their appropriate areas or when required to visit headquarters.

In the cases of the County Surveyor, Board of Health Engineer and Senior Assistant Engineers travelling expenses

to be recouped at the foregoing rates only in respect of travelling within the County on official business.

It was further decided that subsistence allowances be granted at the existing rates and subject to existing regulations.

Wholetime Service: It was decided that the term "wholetime service" should be interpreted as meaning that officers appointed as whole time officials should not be permitted to carry on any private practice or work for remuneration, and that they should not be entitled to work for any other public body without the prior consent of the County Council or, in the case of the Board of Health Engineer, the consent of the County Board of Health and Public Assistance.

Inclusive Salaries: Inclusive salaries were defined as covering all maintenance and constructional works, including the preparation of the necessary preliminary plans, specifications and estimates, undertaken for the County Council or the Board of Health.

Authorised Fees: It was agreed that the inclusive salaries fixed should not deprive the Surveyor or his Assistants of any fees receivable in respect of Employment Relief Schemes and Minor Relief Schemes, such fees being chargeable to the grants allocated. It was likewise agreed that the Surveyor and his Assistants should be entitled to receive and retain the bonus payable out of the Road Fund by the Department of Local Government and Public Health.

Consulting Engineers and Architects: It was agreed that only with the permission of the Council, or of the Board of Health, Consulting Engineers or Architects should be employed in future, for works of a special nature or for works presenting special difficulties, or in circumstances in which owing to the magnitude of the work involved the County Surveyor or Board of Health Engneer might consider it necessary to recommend the appointment of a Consulting Engineer or Architect.

Ballinasloe Urban Roads: The Committee recommended that £44 be charged to the Ballinasloe Urban District Council each year as heretofore in respect of the engineering services provided by the Council for the roads in the Ballinasloe Urban District.

Galway Borough Roads: The Committee likewise recommended that of the County Surveyor's total remuneration of £1000, the sum of £100 p.a. be charged to the Galway

Borough Council, as hitherto, in respect of the engineering services provided by the County Council for roads in the Galway Borough Area.

Councillor McKeigue proposed, Councillor Canning seconded:—"That the Minutes of the Committee be approved, and that the recommendations contained therein be adopted. On a proposal made by Councillor T. The Secretary read Circular Letter No. 31/39 dated 15th March, 1939, received from the Department of Local Government and Public Health with reference to a Seed Supply

Councillor Beegan proposed, Co. Nestor seconded :-"That an appropriate Scheme for the granting of facilities for the purchase of Seed Oats and Seed Potatoes be adopted.' This proposal was passed unanimously.

Councillor Beegan then submitted a copy of a Scheme adopted by the Wexford County Council, and dated 24th March, 1939.

It was decided that in the case of the Galway County Council's Scheme the Council should not pay for the Seeds when supplied by the Merchant or Seed Supplier, but that the Council should guarantee payment of the cost of the Seed to the Merchants, subject to a maximum of £12 in the case of any individual recipient of seed. It was also decided that the Council's guarantee should become operative only on the production of a nulla bona decree by the Merchant to prove that he found it impossible to recover the debt from the recipient of the Seed. The Council further decided to recoup to the Merchant or Seed Supplier the reasonable legal expenses of obtaining the decree and having it executed.

It was agreed that each applicant for facilities should be required to provide two sureties, being persons of not less than £5 Poor Law Valuation, each to guarantee repayment of any sum paid by the Council in pursuance of any guarantee given by the Council to the Merchant or Seed Supplier.

The Guarantee signed by the sureties and the recipient of the seeds should be completed by the sureties and the person to whom the seeds were supplied in the presence of the Merchant or Seed Supplier.

Merchants or Seed Suppliers should be required to furnish their claims for payment in pursuance of the Council's guarantee by a prescribed date to be fixed in the Scheme, and the Council should not be responsible for payment of any sums in respect of claims received after the prescribed date or in respect of claims not vouched by the production of a nulla bona decree.

It was left to the Secretary to draft the details of the Scheme in conjunction with the County Solicitor, and to submit the Scheme to the Department of Local Government and Public Health for the Minister's approval.

On a proposal made by Councillor McKeigue and seconded by Co. Canning it was decided to issue an advertisement inviting tenders from Merchants or Seed Suppliers who would be willing to supply seed in pursuance of the Scheme. The advertisement should indicate that seed supplied under the Scheme must have been subject to test for purity and germination, and that it must be generally up to approved standard. Persons submitting tenders should state the varieties of seed which they are prepared to supply and the price.

On a proposal made by Councillor Killilea and seconded by Councillor Keane—The following Air Raid Precautions Scheme was adopted :-

AIR. RAID PRECAUTION SCHEME GALWAY COUNTY.

The following shall be the Air-Raid Precaution Scheme for the County of Galway :-

There shall be an Advisory Committee, consisting of the Chairman of the Galway County Council, the Chairman of the County Board of Health and Public Assistance, the Chairman of the Finance Committee of the Galway County Council, the

Mayor of Galway, the Chairman of the Ballinasloe Urban District Council, the Chief Superintendent of the Civic Guard at Galway and Ballinasloe, the Officer commanding the Troops at Renmore Barracks, Galway, Chairman of Tuam Town Commissioners and the Chairman of Loughrea Town Commissioners.

The Secretary of the County Council shall act as Secretary to the Advisory Committee, and shall be appointed to the position of Air-Raid Precaution Controller. His position will be that of Chief Executive and Co-ordinating Officer. He shall have the assistance of the Secretary of the County Board of Health and Public Assistance as Deputy A.R.P. Controller.

The County Medical Officer of Health shall be responsible for the organising and equipment of first-aid posts and ambulance units. He shall also be in control of the base hospital and clearing hospitals. He shall arrange for the training and equipment of the first-aid and ambulance units, both in regard to the treatment of gas casualties and in the case of units located at coastal towns the carrying out of artificial respiration and general treatment of survivors rescued from any vessels that may be sunk off the coast.

The County Medical Officer of Health shall have the assistance of the Assistant County Medical Officer of Health and of the Dispensary Doctors throughout the County, who will presumably give voluntary service and assist in the organisation of the first-aid units which may be required at the principal centres. The County Medical Officer of Health may also make use of the voluntary services of medical practitioners, existing ambulance brigades and nursing organisations. The County Medical Officer of Health shall prepare and submit to the Committee a schedule of his requirements in connection with the carrying out of this scheme, and an estimate of the cost involved, and he shall submit such estimate as soon as possible to the A.R.P. Controller for submission to the Advisory Committee.

The County Surveyor shall be responsible for the provision of fire fighting appliances at the principal centres in the County and for the enrolment and training of voluntary fire brigades. He shall also be responsible for all demolition and rescue work as well as for the decontamination of highways and public places. He shall further assume responsibility for the control of gas, water, and electricity supplies. He may delegate his authority in relation to the Galway Borough Area to the Galway Borough Surveyor, and in relation to other areas in the County to his Assistant Surveyors, but he shall be responsible for the general supervision of the work done by those officials. He shall arange as soon as possible for the submission of a schedule of his requirements in connection with the carrying out of this scheme, and an estimate of the cost involved, and the estimate and schedule shall be forwarded to the A.R.P. Controller for submission to the Advisory Committee. He shall in particular make provision for electric sirens to be used in connection with the giving of air-raid warnings at the principal centres in the County.

Storage of Equipment. The County Medical Officer of Health and the County Surveyor shall be responsible for the storage and safe custody of any equipment supplied for the carrying out of this Scheme, and shall account for such equipment when the necessity for the Scheme shall cease to exist.

Finances. The finances for the carrying out of this Scheme shall be provided out of County funds as a County-at-Large charge, but shall be recouped so far as possible out of State funds. The Council shall place at the disposal of the A.R.P. Advisory Committee for the purposes of the Scheme such sum as the Council may decide upon. Payment shall be made out of the Council's Subsidiary Account, and a record of the payments shall be kept in the usual manner, and the Account shall be audited by the Local Government Auditor as part of the Accounts of the Galway County Council.

The A.R.P. Controller may on the advise of the Advisory Committee appoint Air Wardens to act as his Deputies at the principal centres in the County.

Instructions to the Public. The public shall be called upon to carry out such instructions as may be issued from time to time by the Minister for Defence, particularly with regard to the restriction of lighting. The public shall also be advised to provide themselves in their homes, so far as possible, with sand and fire extinguishers which should be ready for use in case of an emergency.

It was decided that the Secretary should obtain from the County Medical Officer of Health and from the County Surveyor a detailed outline of their proposals to give effect to the Scheme together with a schedule of their requirements and an estimate of the cost involved.

It was further decided that the A.R.P. Advisory Committee should have power to amend the Scheme as it might think fit by adding any further necessary provisions to it, but that no expense should be incurred without the authority of the Finance Committee.

1940 Scheme.

To facilitate the supply of seed oats, seed potatoes, and/ or Fertilisers, Galway County Council is prepared to guarantee to Merchants and recognised Suppliers, payment of the cost of the goods up to a maximum of £12 in the case of any one applicant.

Applicants will be required to furnish a guarantee of a surety for the repayment of the cost of the goods at the end of this year's harvest, and in any case not later than the 31st day of December, 1940. The surety must be a person in possession of land of not lesss than £5 Poor Law Valuation.

Certificates will be required on the Application Forms from Rate Collectors that the surety has discharged all rates due by him or her to the 31st March, 1940. The Certificates referred to must be obtained by the applicant before sending the Application Form to the Secretary of the County Council. Applicants may post their Application Forms to the Rate Collector with a request that the Collector shall forward them to the Secretary of the Council when certified by him.

Sureties who, as stated, must be ratepayers, and who must be resident in the County of Galway cannot themselves benefit under the scheme.

The County Council guarantee will become operative only when satisfactory evidence is received from Merchants and Suppliers that it has been found impossible to collect the amount due from the persons supplied with the goods. The evidence required will be a "Nulla Bona" decree against the debtor in respect of the goods supplied. The Council will refund to the Merchant or Supplier the reasonable costs and expenses of obtaining the decree including costs of execution. The costs allowable will be those allowed in the decree and the execution costs certified by the Sheriff. No Solicitor and client costs will be paid by the Council.

No legal proceedings shall be instituted by a Merchant or Supplier against a recipient of seed and/or fertilisers for the recovery of the cost thereof before the 31st day of December, 1940, and in the event of such proceedings being instituted prior to the said date, the guarantee by the Council shall be void.

Particulars of amounts unpaid by selected applicants vouched by "Nulla Bona" decrees are to be furnished by Merchants and Suppliers to the Secretary, Galway County Council, as soon as possible after the 31st day of December, 1940, and not later than the 1st day of March, 1941, after which date the Council's guarantee shall become inoperative and

Applications will be dealt with by the Finance Committee of the Council in rotation.

The latest date for the receipt of completed applications

is the 5th April, 1940. Accepted Applicants will be notified from the County Council Offices after the meeting of the Committee.

Applicants are requested to note that the County Council will not pay for seeds and/or fertilisers as supplied. These must be paid for by the applicant to the Merchant or Supplier as soon as possible after the 31st day of October, 1940, and at latest by the 31st day of December, 1940. The Council merely guarantees payment to the Merchant or Supplier up to a maximum of £12 in cases in which the Supplier or Merchant fails to recover the amount from the recipient of the goods.

Councillor E. Corbett, Chairman of the Council, presided at the Meeting, and the following additional members were in attendance: -Councillors Beegan, Burke, Cahill, Colleran, P. Concannon, Conroy, Cooke, Finnerty, Fury, J.J. Cunningham, Keane, Killilea, Lambert, Manni, T. King, McKeigue, Murphy, Mylotte, Nee, Newell, H.O'Toole, Martin Quine, Michael Quinn, O'Regan, Stankard.

Mr. Hugo Fl. in, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Finance, attended the Reeting, together with Mr. Andrews, Chairman of the Turf Development Board.

The Secretary submitted Circular Letter, Ref. No. G. 7976/41, of the 29th Larch, 1941, received from the Department of Local Government and Public Health, together with the copy of the Emergency Powers (No.73) Order, 1941. The Sccretary also submitted Circular Letter, Ref.No. C.L.36/2/41, dated 3rd April, 1941, from the Department of Local Government and Public Health.

The Turf requirements of the principal towns in the County were then considered with a view to ascertaining what steps could be taken to satisfy those requirements.

Town of Gort. Co. P. Lambert intimated that turf would be produced by private enterprise at Derrybrien and Derreen if the County Surveyor would provide the necessary accommodation roads at Derreen, and arrange for the carrying out of any necessary drainage work. The County Surveyor intimated that he would have the bog surveyed with a view to having the necessary works carried out if the expenditure would be justified.

Town of Tuam. Councillor Michael Cahill intimated that the requirements of the town of Tuan could be provided from Cloonascragh and Barnacurra bogs. He stated that the Town Commissioners would undertake the cutting of turn on these bogs if the bogs were acquired by the County Surveyor. The County Surveyor intimated that the two bogs referred to were being examined by him, and that while he might retain portion of Clochastragh bog to work it by direct labour, he will be prepared to consider recommending the transfer of the remaining portion of the bog to the Tuam Town Commissioners on terms to be agreed upon.

Town of the foolea. Councillor H. O'Regan intimated that the most urgent required was the repair of the Black Road, which, if repaired, would be up a large area of bogland where turf would be cut by private effterprise. The County Surveyor intimated that he was making arrangements to have the necessary repairs carried out. Councillor O'Regan also intimated that turf would be cut extensively by private enterprise at Carra bog. The Town Commissioners and the Parish Council were endeavouring to make arrangements to obtain turf

banks for suitable applicants on reasonable terms. If their efforts were not successful it might be necessary to apply to the County Council to take over certain boglands under their powers of compulsory acquisition.

Town of Galway. His Worship, the Mayor of Galway, who attended the Meeting with the Borough Surveyor and the Town Clerk, intimated that the turf requirements of Galway City were estimated to be 100,000 tons annually. It was suggested that the County Surveyor should provide for the requirements of Galway Corporation, and the County Surveyor agreed that it would probably be possible for him to do so.

Councillor P.D. Conroy suggested that Invermore bog at Rosmuck should be acquired and operated for the purpose of providing turf for sale in Galway City, to which the turf could be brought by boat from Rosmuck. He stated that there are approximately fifty boats available in the Rosmuck area for the transport of turf, and that each boat could carry 5/6 tons of turf. He estimated that the transport charges by boat would be about 6/- per ton from Rosmuck to Galway.

The Secretary intimated that at a recent meeting of the Parish Councils in Galway the coal merchants in the town had been requested to make arrangements for the purchase of turf by placing contracts now.

Town of Ballinasloe. It was intimated by Councillor P. Beegan, T.D. that so far as Ballinasloe town was concerned the needs of the locality could be amply met by the Turf Societies in the locality with the cooperation of the coal merchants. The Urban District Council in Ballinasloe and the Parish Council were endeavouring to secure the cooperation of all parties concerned.

Delegation of powers to County Surveyor. On a proposal made by Councillor P.D. Conroy and seconded by Councillor P. Lambert the County Council delegated to the County Surveyor all of the Council's powers, duties and functions under the Emergency Powers (No.73) Order, 1941, other than the powers in relation to the raising of any rate, borrowing, and payment of compensation. The form of delegation which was sealed and signed was as follows:-

HEREAS by the Emergency Powers (No.73) Order, 1941, being an Order made by the Government in pursuance of the Emergency Powers Act, 1939, provision was made for the acquisition on behalf of the State by county councils, amongst other local authorities, of bog-land and the exercise of turbary rights:

AND THEREAS in prusuance of section 73 of the Local Government Act, 1925, the Thinister for Local Government and Public Health has by order under his official seal bearing date the Tenth day of April, 1941, consented to the delegation by the county council of any county, not being a county borough, to the county surveyor of that county whom the said Hinister did thereby appoint for the purpose, of all their powers, duties and functions under the said Emergency Powers (No.73) Order, 1941, other than the powers, duties and functions of the county council in relation to the following matters, namely:-

- (1) the raising of any rate for the purposes of the said Order;
- (2) the borrowing of any money for the purposes of the said Order; and
- (3) the payment but not including the determination of any compensation payable under the provisions of the said Order.

NOW We the County Council of the County of Galway in pursuance of mection 73 of the Local Government Act, 1925, do hereby delegate to

the County Surveyor of the County of Galway all our powers, duties and functions under the said Emergency Powers (No.73) Order, 1941, to the delegation of which the Minister for Local Government and Public Health has consented by his said Order of the Tenth day of April, 1941, as hereinbefore recited.

Appointment of Fuel Committee. It was suggested by the Secretary that the Council should appoint a Fuel Committee which would act in an advisory capacity to the County Surveyor whenever he might wish to consult the Committee. On a proposal made by Councillor Conroy and seconded by Councillor McKeigue it was decided that the Committee should consist of the Chairman of the County Council and ten other Members of the Council to be nominated by the County Surveyor.

- In. Hugo Flinn, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Finance, then addressed the Meeting, and explained the necessity for the increased production of turf, having regard to the fact that it was probable that very little, if any, coal would be available during the coming year. He intimated that it would be necessary to produce in Eire this year at least three million tons of turf, and that if circumstances were not altered next year double that quantity of turf would have to be produced. He also dealt with the following points:
- (1) Financing of Turf Cutting Schemes: Turf cutting schemes would have to be financed by local authorities so far as possible out of funds obtainable by them from their rate revenues or borrowed from their Treasurers. It was expected that in the majority of cases the local authorities would recoup any expenditure incurred out of the proceeds of the sale of the turf produced, but any losses would have to be provided in accordance with the terms of Section 12 of the Emergency Powers (No.73) Order, 1941.
- (2) Harketing of Turf. It was expected that private owners of turf banks would make their own arrangements so far as possible for the marketing of turf produced by them. The County Surveyor would produce turf for the requirements of the Council and its subsidiary bodies, and would thereafter continue to provide turf to be disposed of either through coal merchants or for large purchasers. Any turf which could not otherwise be disposed of would be marketed by the Turf Development Board.

Mr. Andrews, Chairman of the Turf Development Board, intimated that there was a guaranteed market for all turn that could be produced, and that turf which could not expersise be disposed of would be taken over by the Turf Development Board provided that it was made available on the sides of maintroads, county roads, or other roads suitable for the carriage of turf by motor lorry, or in the vicinity of railway communications. On a question of the price of turf, it was intimated that there could not be any guaranteed price fixed as costs of production varied very considerably between different districts, as also did the quality of the turf produced. Turf producers could, however, rest assured that having regard to the shortage of coal and the demand for fuel, there would be no difficulty about obtaining a reasonable price for any turf they would cut.

On a proposal made by the Chairman of the Council, a vote of thanks was passed thanking the Parliamentary Secretary to the linister for Finance, and the Chairman of the Turf Development Board for their attendance at the meeting.
