RESOLUTION UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE CITY AND COUNTY MANAGEMENT (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1955 - PLANNING APPLICATION NO. 68419 - APPLICANT - ENDA HALL.

The resolution as set out in the Agenda was proposed by Councillor McHugh and seconded by Senator

Councillor McHugh informed the Meeting that Planning Permission was previously granted on this site, but that the road was upgraded and realligned since the issue of that planning permission. Councillor McHugh stated that the road is now much safer and that, even though the road has been upgraded, the level of traffic has not increased. Councillor McHugh also informed the Members that the applicant bought the site with Planning Permission, emigrated to Australia, has now returned and requires a house.

The County Engineer read the following report which had been circulated to each Member prior to the Meeting.

LOCATION:

The proposed site is located on the Galway/Headford National Secondary Route circa two miles south of Headford.

PLANNING HISTORY.

Outline Planning Permission granted to Mr. P. Fallon for one dwellinghouse in 1970.

The permission has since expired.

PLANNING CONSIDERATION.

The previous outline permission on this site was granted in 1970 before the route was designated to be a National Route and when restrictions to development on this route were not as severe. The permission has long since lapsed.

The various County Development Plans since that time have set out restrictions against developments along National Routes such as this one, based on the established co-relation between accident occurrences and number of access points. Such a policy has been expressed by the Department of the Environment and has been repeatedly upheld by An Bord Pleanala.

This applicant has made no special claim by which he might be considered to be among the categories of housing need which are allowed to be located on the route. It should be pointed out that the depth of the site is only approximately 29 metres whereas the County Development Plan requires a building line of at least 23 metres from the existing front boundary. This would leave only 6 metres deep in which to build his house. He has not indicated on the maps submitted the exact location of the proposed house, septic tank or percolation area.

RECOMMENDATION.

- 1. The proposed development would endanger public safety by reason of a traffic hazard because the site is located on a heavily trafficked section of the National Secondary Road where the maximum speed limit applies and the traffic movements generated by the development would interfere with the safety and free flow of traffic on the road. In addition, the development would militate against the objectives of the Planning Authority to:
 - (a) preserve the level of service and carrying capacity of the road so that it can fulfill its function as a through road for heavy traffic.

- (b) protect the public investment in the National Road network.
- 2. The proposed development would contravene the County Development Plan (Chapter 8, Table 8B) which limits development along this road to those where essential family housing need exists, a category of development which does not apply in this case.

Mr. Flood stated that it is not true to say that the road is now safer as realignment of a road results in higher speed of traffic. The County Engineer informed the Meeting that the volume of traffic on this road, according to the latest available figures is approximately 4,500 vehicles per day of which 10% constitutes heavy goods vehicles. The County Engineer also stated that this road is the main road to Castlebar, referred to the fact that openings along National Routes and right turning movements cause accidents, and that approximately 50% of all accidents occur on National Roads. The County Engineer informed the Meeting that land along National Routes should not be used for housing developments.

The County Engineer referred to the above item which was discussed at the Council's Monthly Meeting of the 28th June, 1993 held in New Inn, and informed the Members that it was claimed at that Meeting that the site was within the 40 m.p.h. speed limit. The County Engineer stated that the site is outside all speed limits and will be outside the new proposed 30 m.p.h. speed limits.

It was agreed that the July Monthly Meeting be held at 2.30 p.m. on the 26th July, 1993. ADVANCE NOTICE - PLANNING REF. NO. 68145. Deputy McCormack informed the Meeting that he considered it difficult to justify to the applicant why this application was refused, and that the

The Manager informed the Meeting that the application has been decided, that the site is in an area of outstanding scenic amenity, that there are possible public health problems and that the planning authority would favourably consider an application on an alternative site which is available to the applicant.

PLANNING PROCEDURES . 1634

The Manager infomed the Meeting, that in future, developments which require a decision regarding exemption will be dealt with within the normal timescale for dealing with planning permissions. The Manager also stated that new planning application forms have been prepared and that applications should compley with the guidelines and give full details to speed up the processing of applications.

In reply to Councillor Loughnane, the Manager stated that the extension of time limits for dealing with planning applications is a facility which is offered to applicants in particular cases, and in exceptional circumstances, the Council has to operate within a very limited timeframe.

MAKING OF TOWN PLAN FOR LOUGHREA AND ENVIRONS OF OF LOUGHREA

Mr. Kavanagh informed the meeting that the Draft Town Plan for Loughrea and the Environs of Loughrea had been on public display for the 3 month period from 12th February, 1993 to the 20th May, 1993. He stated that 3 No. submissions had been received and a copy of the submissions, the report on an oral hearing together with the observations of the Planning Officer was circulated to each member of the Council. He advised that the Council was required to consider same before making the Development Plans. He also referred to a draft re-wording of Paragraph 2.8 Roads & Parking of Part 2 which was circulated to the members in reference to the proposed by-pass.

Procedure for appointment to Council Committees and other Bodies

Section 27 of the Local Government (Re-Organisation) Act, 1985, provides that the procedure set out in the 5th Schedule to the Act will apply when appointments are being made by local authorities to Committees and to the other Bodies listed in Sub-Section 2 (copy attached). In particular, it should be noted that the procedures apply to all Committees and Joint Committees of a Local Authority.

The procedures outlined in the 5th Schedule to the Act apply by virtue of Section 27(1) to all persons appointed by a local authority to any of the listed bodies including persons who are not members of the local authority subject in the case of such persons to the two exceptions as provided for in Sub-Section 4 (a) whereby the new procedure will not apply to appointments of persons who are not Members of the Local Authority as in the case of such appointments to Vocational Education Committees or to School Attendance Committees.

Sub-Section 4.(b) provides that when any special qualification, knowledge or experience is required by Law for appointment, then that requirement will continue to apply notwithstanding anything contained in this Section.

Where a Member of a Local Authority is appointed to a Body by virtue of his particular office, (e.g., Mayor or Chairman), then the new procedure will not apply to such appointments - see Sub-Section 4.(c). This will arise in the case of nomination of Chairman to Sub-Regional Review Committee.

Part 11 of the 5th Schedule sets out the procedures which apply in relation to appointments. Where only one appointment is to be made, it is made by majority vote. Where more than one appointment is to be made, any "group" of Members may nominate a person and that person is then appointed without a vote. The number of persons necessary to form a "group" is obtained by dividing the number of Members present at the meeting at the time when the business of making the appointments is reached by the number of appointments to be made. If the number so appointed is not a whole number, then the next highest whole number applies. A person can only be a Member of one "group". When any "group" or "groups" have made their appointments, the appointments then remaining are next made successively by those Members who did not form part of any of the "groups". These appointments are made by majority vote.
