RESOLUTION UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE CITY AND COUNTY MANAGEMENT (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1955 - PLANNING APPLICATION NO. 68245 - APPLICANT - MARTIN MULLINS.

The resolution as set out on the Agenda was proposed by Councillor Fahy and seconded by Councillor Cunningham.

The County Engineer read the following report which had been circulated to each Member prior to the Meeting.

LOCATION: The proposed site is located on the main Galway to Limerick National Primary Route on the outskirts of Gort town, at a point where the maximum speed limit applies.

PLANNING HISTORY:

There is a long history of planning applications to the Planning Authority in respect of this and adjoining sites by Mr. Mullins. These are summarized as follows;

Ref. No. 19553 - permission was granted to Mr. Mullins in August 1975 for two dwellinghouses on sites to west of current sites with frontage onto the main Road.

On land which included the current site, permission was refused on three previous occasions by the Planning Authority (Ref. 20819, 24936 and 39234) and the decision on 20819 was upheld by the Minister for Local Government on appeal. The reasons for refusal were (a) because of traffic hazard due to a sub-standard access to the site and because the turning movements would interfere with the free flow and safety of traffic on the National Primary Route and (b) because the backlands development would interfere with the privacy and residential amenity of

existing dwellinghouses on the main road.

Ref. No. 40159 - A Section 4 Motion was passed in September, 1981 directing the County Manager to grant Outline Permission for three dwellinghouses on a slightly larger site than the current site. Local residents had objected to the development and an appeal was lodged to An Bord Pleanala but was invalid because it was not made within 21 days of the decision to grant.

Ref. No. 44009 - Permission was refused for a dwellinghouse on a site to the west of the current site fronting onto the main road in March, 1983. This site adjoined the access road to the current site. However permission (Ref 46459) was later granted for a dwellinghouse on this site with site boundaries extended to rear to include part of the current site in order to accommodation the septic tank percolation area. This house has not been built.

PLANNING CONSIDERATIONS:

- 1. The proposed development is located on a site to the rear of existing dwellinghouses with access via an access road onto the National Primary Route (N18). It is the objective of the Planing Authority to restrict development along the National Routes in the interests of traffic safety and in order to reserve the design capacity and level of service of these routes as major routes for long distance and heavy traffic. The proposed three number dwellinghouses would generate additional traffic onto the National Route at a point where the maximum speed limit applies. Traffic turning movements associated with the development would interfere with the safety and free flow of traffic along this heavily trafficked national route. Therefore, it would contravene the stated policy objective of the Planing Authority.
- 2. The proposed development is located adjacent to the N18 National Primary Route. This is designated a restricted route subject to Class 1 control, under Table 8A of the County Development Plan. It is the policy of the Planning Authority as set out in the above Table 8A to restrict housing development along this route to the substantiated housing needs of local farmholders and their immediate family member. No such need exists in this case and this proposal would therefore contravene the provisions of the County Development Plan.
- 3. The proposed development would constitute an undesirable development of backland site to the rear of existing houses and would interfere with the privacy and residential amenity of the adjoining houses.

It is the policy of the Planing Authority as set out in paragraph 7.2.8 (ii) to restrict his type of backland development particularly in locations where such development would (a) reduce the residential amenity of adjoining development (b) create additional traffic volumes.

RECOMMENDATION:

Refusal is recommended as follows;

- 1. The proposed development would endanger public safety by reason of a traffic hazard because the site takes its access from a heavily trafficked section of the National Primary Road where the maximum speed limit applies and the traffic movements generated by the development would interfere with the safety and free flow of traffic on the road. In addition, the development would militate against the objectives of the Planning Authority to:
- (a) preserve the level of service and carrying capacity of the road so that it can fulfill its function as a through road for heavy traffic.
- (b) protect the public investment in national road network.
- 2. The proposed development would contravene the County Development Plan (Chapter 8, Table 8A) which limits development along this road to those where essential family housing need exists, a category of development which does not apply in this case.
- 3. The proposed development located to the rear of existing development would be liable to interfere with the privacy and residential amenity of the adjacent properties. In addition, the proposed development would constitute the undesirable development of a backland site in contravention of the stated policy of the Planning Authority as expressed in paragraph 7.2.8(ii) of the County Development Plan. Therefore, it would be contrary to the proper planning and development of the area.

The County Engineer informed the Meeting that the average daily traffic at this location is 4.500 vehicles with a H.G.V. content of 12%. The County Engineer also informed the Members that, according to the Road Accident Statistics 1992 approximately 50% of fatal accidents occur on National Routes, and that this development would be particularly serious as there would 3 houses and one service avenue, constituting a serious risk of death or injury.

Councillor Fahy stated that there is already an existing dwellinghouse adjacent to the site of the proposed development, that the 3 houses proposed would be exiting on to the existing entrance and, therefore, no new exit/entrance would be created. Councillor Fahy informed the Meeting that the site is an eyesore and that the development would enhance the area. Councillor Fahy also stated that the 30 m.p.h speed limit is being extended and that the site will, therefore, be within the speed limit. Councillor Fahy informed the Meeting that the development will not interfere with existing privacy, that there is adequate room for trees and shrubs, and that when the new road is taken over by Notice of Motion, the development will be a boost to the area, as the proposed houses are vital for development.

Councillor Cunningham welcomed the application, and stated that the maximum speed limit does not apply as the proposed development is within the 40 m.p.h. limit. Councillor Cunningham stated that the speed limit will have to be extended before the houses are built.

Councillor T. Byrne stated that the applicant was previously granted planning permission for one house, and subsequently for two houses which he did not build. Councillor Byrne informed the Meeting that the site will, in future, be within the By-Pass for Gort and that traffic will not be as substantial as at present. Councillor Byrne also stated that the applicant is a builder, that he had to emigrate in the past to make money, and that he has now come home and wants to put something back into the locality. Clr. Byrne questioned the number of fatalities due to traffic coming out of houses onto main roads, and stated that the majority of accidents occurred in the early hours of the morning.

The County Engineer informed the Meeting that a number of reports had been prepared which demonstrate a relationship between right turning movements and accidents. The County Engineer also stated that there is sufficient land within the boundary of the town already designated for housing, that the Gort By Pass will not be constructed for a number of year, and that the Council cannot maintain existing roads and cannot guarantee that the proposed road will be taken over. Mr. Flood stated that the fact that a house already exists at this location does not enhance the proposed development as the number of houses would be increasing from one to four. The County Engineer also informed the Meeting that people living at the back of the proposed development were aggrieved by the proposal, that the site is not within the 30 m.p.h. speed limit at present, that there is very fast moving traffic at this location, and in response to Councillor Byrne, confirmed that
