The Minutes of the Monthly Meeting held on the 27<sup>th</sup> September, 2004 were approved by the Council and signed by the Deputy Mayor on the proposal of Cllr. McDonagh, seconded by Cllr. Regan.

Arising from the Minutes, Cllr. Fahy asked what the up to date position was on the report on the Landscape Sensitivity Ratings. Mr. Gavin informed the Members that work was progressing on the report and that it would be ready in a few weeks.

In reply to Cllr. Reilly, Mr. Dawson said that no reply had been received from the Department of Communications or the IDA in relation to the Broadband Programme and the inclusion of Tuam in same.

Cllr. Cuddy asked if a reply had been received from the NRA in connection with the proposed Claregalway By-Pass. Mr. Morgan said that he had been informed by the NRA that the Chairman does not attend County Council meetings and that discussions were ongoing with the NRA in relation to issues associated with the Claregalway congestion and the N17. In reply to Cllr. Connolly, Mr. Morgan said that there was a proposal to provide bus corridors on the N17 and he said that he was hopeful that these would be sent to DOEHLG by the end of October and that subject to funding being made available, the work would be carried out as soon as possible. Cllr. Connolly said that he hoped there would be no interference with the N63 in the provision of the bus corridors.

Cllr. Regan referred to the EU Co-Financed Funds and said they should be distributed equally over the whole county. He said that the Loughrea Electoral Area only got 10% of the funding and he proposed that a request be made for further  $\epsilon$ 300,000. He referred especially to the R351 where many accidents occur. Cllr. Regan's proposal was seconded by Cllr. Fahy.

Mr. Kavanagh confirmed that the Department had raised a number of queries in relation to the contract documents and that these would be responded to as soon as possible.

On the proposal of Cllr Hoade, seconded by Cllr. McDonagh, the Community Based Economic Activity Grants as recommended were approved. by the Council.

## TO ENDORSE THE GALWAY COUNTY ELECTORAL AREA PROGRAMME OF ACTIONS. 172

Comh Ni Fhatharta proposed that a Special Meeting be held to discuss the Galway County Electoral Area Programme of Actions and this was seconded by Cllr. Mannion. Following discussion, it was agreed that a special meeting be held to discuss the County Galway Electoral Area Programme of Actions and planning issues and the County Manager undertook to agree a date with representatives of the different groups on the Council. Cllr. Mannion also asked that the Assessment of Needs for Water and Sewerage be circulated again.

Cllr Mullins referred to an Item that had been discussed at a previous Strategic Policy Committee Meeting regarding the old Landfill site at New Inn. He said a commitment was given that this site would be rehabilitated. He said he wanted an assurance that this would happen and that the Council would consult with the Community Council during the process. This proposal was seconded by Cllr. Mannion. Cllr. Joyce said the road at this location is very narrow, and that when the rehabilitation works on the landfill are being undertaken, the Council should consider carrying out road improvement works also. Mr. Kavanagh agreed that the rehabilitation work was needed and that it was included in the Programme of Works for the Environment Section.

Comh. O'Tuairisg said Lough Corrib was under threat from pollution and from Zebra Mussels which is a disease brought by boats from other infested waters to Lough Corrib. He asked that the Council write to the DOEHLG or Department of the Marine asking that legislation be introduced to contain this disease.

Cllr. Keaveney said he wanted to bring to the attention of the Council the issue of threatened Industrial Action by Outdoor Staff. He said he was asking the County Manager to intervene as early as possible in this dispute. Comh O'Cuaig said he also supported this issue, and he said that the Council should look after its workers. Mr Cullen said while this is an Executive Function of the Council, the Council had not been notified of any industrial action being taken and that there was no question of monies not being paid to the Outdoor Staff. He said there was a Code of Practice on Industrial Disputes agreed between Management and Union nationally. Mr. Cullen stated that the Performance Verification Group would determine whether payment under Benchmarking and Sustaining Progress is warranted.

Cllr. Joyce referred to Notices of Motion Numbers 20 and 21 on the agenda and said that the local people had not yet received a reply to the question they asked some weeks ago and this was very unsatisfactory. Cllrs. Mullins and Mannion agreed with Cllr. Joyce. Mr. Kavanagh said that the conditions laid down by an Bórd Pleanála would issue as quickly as possible.

Cllr. Walsh suggested, and it was agreed that get well wishes be sent to Darren Burke, son of the Mayor, Cllr. W. Burke wishing him a speedy recovery. He received injuries

while playing a Rugby Match and was in hospital in Cork. Darren said he also wanted to send get well wishes to Martin Donegan, Glenamaddy who was badly injured while playing for his club.

Cllr. Cannon referred to a Workshop held in Portumna recently organised by the Forward Planning Section on the Draft Portumna Local Area Plan. He said it gave the people of Portumna a feeling of ownership, and complimented Mr. J. O'Donnell and the Staff of the Forward Planning Section on the excellent way in which they dealt with the people. He said his only concern was in relation to the Closing Date of the 29<sup>th</sup> October for submissions, and asked if that date could be extended to 12<sup>th</sup> November. Cllr. Hoade also wanted to congratulate the Forward Planning Staff in relation to the Workshop held in Headford and also asked if the closing date could be extended. Mr. Gavin agreed to extend the closing date to the 12th November in both cases.

Cllr. Canney referred to the panels of Architects for general building projects and housing projects which had been forwarded to him and said he noted that there were no local Architects on these panels. Mr. Gilmore said that these panels had been formed following public advertisements and an interview process. He confirmed that the Council would continue to support local Architects and Engineers where possible.

#### Issues:

Various; Including;

- 1. The Settlement Strategy,
- Western Regional Planning Guidelines and Draft Guidelines on Sustainable Rural Housing,
- 3. Areas liable to flooding and,
- 4. Nature Conservation.

#### D22.1. The Settlement Strategy;

#### Summary:

The Department recommend that the proposed settlement strategy and population projections contained in the Draft LAP should be reviewed to ensure consistency with the County Development Plan and the Galway Transportation and Planning Study (GTPS).

#### Response:

The County Development Plan identifies Claregalway on the third tier of the G.T.P.S. Area Settlement Hierarchy. Within the Plan period, 480 households are allocated collectively to the 6 settlements on this tier. Policy 18 allows for a deviation of the allocated population of between 30% and 50% and states that regard will also be had to the rate of growth for each settlement

There are approximately 79 hectares (195 acres) of land proposed to be zoned residential in the Draft Document. Of that 53 hectares (131 acres) are undeveloped. At 25 houses per hectare, these residential lands could accommodate the development of 1325 houses. On the basis that the average household size in County Galway is 3.11 persons per household, development of these lands could accommodate a possible population increase of 4121 people over the period of the Plan.

It should be remembered that Residential development is also open for consideration by the Planning Authority in Commercial and Community Facility zones.

The Planning and Development Act 2000 clearly states that a Local Area Plan shall be consistent with the County Development Plan. Section 2.6 of the Galway County Development Plan 2003-2009 recommends on average a development of approx. 120 residential units in Claregalway for the period May 2003-May 2009.

However, the Draft Local Area Plan if left unchecked would allow for a potential development of 1325 residential units for 6 years from the date of its adoption. In other words 11 times the recommended growth rate.

The officials must have regard to the advice of the DoEHLG. In this situation it would appear that the amount of land proposed residential is excessive and must be reviewed. Ignoring the advice of the DoEHLG is not an option. 2 options are therefore available as the officials see it;

- 1. Down zoning,
- Phasing of zoning.

These options are described below with the assumption that no additional lands will be zoned for residential purposes before the Plan is adopted.

Option 1 **Down zoning**; No adopted zoning exists in Claregalway at present. Therefore, a change from Residential as it appeared in the Draft to Agriculture (for example) would not evoke any compensation issues, and cannot be accurately be described as down zoning as no current zoning exists. However, this option is unlikely to be acceptable to the public especially when much of this land was zoned previously under the old County Development Plan 1997-2002.

#### Option 2 Phasing of zoning;

The officials consider that this is generally a more acceptable alternative. The following changes could form part of the Material Alterations to the Plan.

It is the opinion of the officials that the format of the County Development Plan settlement strategy as set out in the table attached should be re-examined as part of the review process of the CDP May 2005. In the interim, lands zoned for residential purposes under the Draft Plan should be split up into types of residential zones;

<u>A: Short Term Residential,</u> i.e. lands which can be developed without being unreasonably inconsistent with the County Settlement Strategy; and.

<u>B: Medium Term Residential</u>, i.e. Lands which should remain undeveloped until such time as they can be accommodated by an amendment to the County Development Plan settlement strategy and until such time as the Municipal Wastewater Treatment Plant is in place.

Officials have identified a number of land areas which would be suitable as Medium Term Residential zones by using the following criterion;

- · Lands which are located at the edge of the village,
- Lands which have only recently been proposed as residential zones,
- · Lands which are landlocked.
- Lands which have not been developed nor have entered into the planning application process to date,
- Lands that have an unreasonably high concentration of treatment systems in a localised area.

See Forward Planning Amendments Map (Map 2).

This will result in the 53 hectares (131 acres) of undeveloped proposed residential land being divided up as follows.

Short Term Residential: Approx. 36 hectares or 90 acres Medium Term Residential: Approx. 17 hectares or 41 acres.

This would still allow for development at a reasonable density (10 to the acre) of approx. 900 residential units or a population growth of 2800 persons in the short term.

Once again, no compensation issues should arise from this option. The phasing of zonings has been used effective Planning tool in other Local Authorities in the Republic.

#### Recommendation:

Recommend phasing of approx. 17 hectares or 41 acres of proposed residential land.

#### **Area Committee Recommendation**

Agreed with Planners Recommendation. See FP7 below.

On the proposal of Cllr. McDonagh and seconded by Cllr. Healy Eames it was agreed that there would be phasing of approx. 17 hectares or 41 acres of proposed residential land in the Plan

### <u>D22.2: The Western Regional Planning Guidelines and Draft Guidelines on Sustainable Rural Housing:</u>

#### Summary:

The Local Area Plan should refer to both these sets of guidelines, in particular the objectives relating to population projections, regional development and public transport policies.

#### Response:

The preparation of the Draft Local Area Plan had regard to the Draft Regional Planning Guidelines. The adopted Regional Guidelines refers to the 'gateway' of Galway and the 'Hub' of Tuam but makes no specific reference to Claregalway.

However, the proposed settlement strategy, zoning and policy objectives proposed by the Forward Planning Section for the LAP are generally consistent with the Regional policies on public transportation, population projections and balanced regional development.

In relation to the Draft Guidelines on Sustainable Rural Housing, these are of limited relevance within a development Plan area. However, regard could be

given to these guidelines where applications for one off houses occur within agricultural zones.

#### Recommendation:

- Include reference to the Western Regional Planning Guidelines in the Plan.
- Regard to be given to the Draft Guidelines on Sustainable Rural Housing and forthcoming adopted guidelines in the assessment of one off houses in agricultural zones.

#### **Area Committee Recommendation**

Agreed with Planners recommendation.

On the proposal of Cllr. Hoade and seconded by Cllr. Cuddy it was agreed to, (1) include reference to the Western Regional Planning Guidelines in the Plan and (2) regard to be given to the Draft Guidelines on Sustainable Rural Housing and forthcoming adopted guidelines in the assessment of one off houses in agricultural zones.

#### D22.3: Areas liable to flooding

#### Summary

Advises that the Floodplain of the river Clare and any other areas that are liable to seasonal flooding should be identified in the plan. It should be the policy of the plan to protect such areas from inappropriate or insensitive development. Recommend liaison with the OPW who are engaged in the process of mapping areas at risk of flooding.

#### Response

The EPA and the OPW were contacted and the most up to date information relating to the area of the flood plain was collected. The OPW maps are unlikely to be available within the coming year. In the absence of this there has been a lengthy assessment of local Hydrological surveys, Hydrometrical graphs, recent flooding history, original OS maps for the area and arterial drainage maps for the area. Following consultation with the Environment section an Indicative Flood Plain Area has been identified

#### Recommendation

Recommend the inclusion of the Indicative Flood Plain Area as indicated on Map 2 (FP6) with the following policies in the text.

Note: In the event that the OPW Flood Plain maps become available to the public during the lifetime of the Local Area Plan, this area within the Plan boundary shall supersede the Indicative Flood Plain area.

- Development that is located within and directly adjacent to the Indicative Flood Plain Area (See Map 2) which is sensitive to the effects of flooding will generally <u>not</u> be permitted.
- Appropriately designed development, which is not sensitive to the effects of flooding, may be permissible in and adjacent to the Indicative Flood Plain Area provided that it is demonstrated by a suitably qualified person that it does not reduce the flood plain area or otherwise restrict flow across the floodplain.
- Development proposals within Claregalway must so far as is reasonably practicable incorporate the maximum provision to reduce the rate and quantity of runoff. For example,
  - Hard surface areas (car parks etc.) should be constructed in permeable or semi- permeable materials.
  - On site storm water ponds to store and/or attenuate additional runoff from the development should be provided.
  - Soak-aways or french drains should be provided to increase infiltration and minimise additional runoff.
- 4. For developments (including hard landscaping) directly adjacent to the River Clare and associated watercourses of a significant conveyance capacity, must be set back from the edge of the watercourse to allow access for channel clearing/ maintenance.
- Development consisting of construction of embankments, wide bridge piers, or similar structures will not normally be permitted in or across the Indicative Flood Plain or river channels.
- 6. The Planning Authority shall require a Flood Impact Assessment to include Hydrological report and proposals for the storage or attenuation of run off/ discharges (including foul drains) from a suitably qualified person. This requirement shall ensure that new development does not increase the flood risk along the River Clare and associated water courses. It will apply to development proposals exceeding 1 Hectare in area within and directly adjacent to the Indicative Flood Plain Area.
- The developer and the Planning Authority should consult with the National Parks and Wildlife Service of the DoEHLG, in relation to developments which may affect the river or its floodplain directly or indirectly.

8. A certificate from a competent person that the development will not contribute to flooding within the catchment of River Clare and associated watercourses must accompany applications for Planning Permission for development of areas of 1 Hectare or less, within and directly adjacent to the Indicative Flood Plain Area.

#### **Area Committee Recommendation**

On the proposal of Cllr. Healy-Eames which was seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed to include the Indicative Flood Plain Area as indicated on Map 2 (FP6) with the following policies in the text,(as above 1-8).

#### D22.4: Nature Conservation

#### Summary

- Advises that Section 2.0 of the Plan should underline the importance of protecting the river and its floodplain from an environmental/ natural heritage perspective.
- Section 2.6 should recognise the importance of the river Clare for biodiversity.
- There should be a recommendation to consult with the National Parks and Wildlife Service of the DoEHLG, in relation to developments which may affect the river or its floodplain directly or indirectly.
- In relation to the biodiversity policies mentioned in Section 3.9.3 and 3.9.4, these should take into account that planning of trees or other landscaping should not replace existing habitats of ecological value.
- The wording of Policy 3.9.11 which discourages the intrusion of development along the banks of the river Clare, should be altered to read 'along the banks and floodplain of the river Clare.

#### Response

The above proposals should be incorporated into the Plan.

#### Recommendation

Recommend amendment to text of the Plan in order to take on board the amendments suggested by the DoEHLG as outlined above.

Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. Hoade, it was agreed to amend text of the Plan in order to take on board the amendments suggested by the DoEHLG as outlined above.

#### Issues:

<u>Various:</u> Including request for additional Community Facility and Recreation / Amenity Zoning, extension of street lighting / footpaths, bus stops and shelters, under grounding of wiring and the creation of a County Council Area Office in Claregalway.

These issues on various section of the Draft plan shall be responded to one by one. These issues have been labeled **D1.1** to **D1.8** 

#### D1.1: River Clare Recreation and Amenity zone

#### Summary:

Extension of Plan Boundary and creation of a 5m strip of Recreation and Amenity Zone along the northern and eastern bank of the river Clare. See area marked D1.1 on the Public Submissions map (Map 1).

#### Response:

Although it is not considered necessary to amend the Plan boundary in order for a walkway to develop along the northern and eastern bank of the river Clare, the officials do not have any objection to this proposal in principle.

#### Recommendation:

No objection to proposed Recreation/ Amenity zone or to the extension of Plan boundary in this instance. This proposal if adopted should be supplemented with an objective for an Amenity Corridor / Walkway along this area.

#### Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. Healy-Eames it was agree to accept the recommendation as outlined above.

#### D1.2: Recreation and Amenity zone adjacent to the GAA pitch

#### Summary:

The Draft Plan predicts a possible population increase of 4121 people over the period of the Plan. In the light of this increase, it requested that a greater area of land adjacent to the pitch should be zoned for amenity purposes. Amount or exact location of land is not specified in the submission.

#### Response:

A total of approx. 25 hectares or 63 acres are proposed to be zoned Recreation and Amenity in the Draft Plan. This allocation, coupled with the phasing proposals mentioned above, the additional Recreation and Amenity lands along the northern and eastern banks of the river Clare should satisfy the demand for such lands over the period of the Plan.

#### Recommendation:

No change recommended

#### **Area Committee Recommendation**

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. Healy-Eames it was agreed that land adjacent to the pitch should be zoned for amenity purposes as appeared on the Draft Plan. Therefore, no change to the plan required

#### D1.3: Zoning of lands adjacent to Catholic Church and school

#### Summary:

Request rezoning of these institutional lands from Commercial to **Recreation** and **Amenity**. See lands marked D1.3 on attached map.

#### Response:

The lands in question consist of part of the Catholic Church car park to the north and green traffic islands left over from the re-alignment of the N18. A small block of land in this submission has been proposed residential in the Draft. Having considered the submission, the Draft zoning Plan and following a site inspection it is considered that the Car park are should be zoned Community Facility and

the this narrow strip of land adjacent to the Church and school should more appropriately be zoned Recreation and Amenity.

#### Recommendation:

Zone lands referred to in this submission partly **Community Facilities** to the north and Recreation **and Amenity** to the south; see FP13 & FP14 on map 2.

#### D1.4: Extension of street lighting and footpaths

#### Summary:

Request that there should be a written objective in the Transport and Road Infrastructure Section to extend street lighting and footpaths in the village out to the 40mph limits.

#### Response:

This submission was commented upon by the Roads Section, who state that the developers can provide this infrastructure. The Area Engineer agrees that the provision of such infrastructure would be desirable and would be subject to NRA sanction.

#### Recommendation:

Include objective 'to require developers to extend street lighting and footpaths in areas within their control with the aim of extending this infrastructure to the 40mph limits. Council to provide footpaths and streetlights in those areas inside the 40 mph limits where new developments are not permissible, where funds permit and shall be subject to NRA sanction.'

#### D1.5: Bus Shelters

#### Summary:

Transport and Infrastructure Policy 3.4.9 of the Draft should be expanded to include for the provision of Bus Shelters.

#### Response:

This submission was commented upon by the Roads Section, who state that the provision of Bus Shelters is a CIE requirement.

#### Recommendation:

Section 3.4.9 should be amended to mention co-operation with the Public Transport Authorities in the provision of Bus Shelters.

#### D1.6: Bus Stops

#### Summary:

Requests that there should be an Objective in the Transport and Roads Infrastructure Section that the unofficial bus stop beside the Church be made permanent and the existing stop beside the Nine Arches be maintained.

#### Response:

This submission was commented upon by the Roads Section, who state that the Nine Arches Bus Stop location is not acceptable. New location should be along the southern edge of the N17 directly west of the junction with the N18.

#### Recommendation:

Refine Transport and Road Infrastructure TR5 to state 'Make provision for a more frequent bus service with a bus pick up and set down point in the village, preferably, along the southern edge of the N17 directly west of the junction with the N18.

#### D1.7: Under grounding of overhead wires

#### Summary:

Requests that there should be an objective in the Industry, Employment and Telecommunications section of the plan to put all existing overhead wires and cables underground.

#### Response:

Owing to exorbitant costs this would not be possible for the Council to undertake these works.

#### Recommendation:

No change recommended.

On the proposal of Cllr. Healy Eames and Cllr. Hoade it was agreed that no change to the plan is required

#### D1.8: County Council Local Area Office

#### Summary:

Requests that there should be an objective in the Plan to locate Community Offices and Local Area Offices for Galway County Council in Claregalway.

#### Response:

Having consulted with the Director of Service for the Oranmore Electoral Area, it has already been agreed that Claregalway will become the regional centre for the Oranmore Electoral area. The Council are in the process of identifying appropriate sites for its location.

#### Recommendation:

Include objective in the Plan to provide an Area Office in Claregalway. Location to be consistent with the zoning objectives and requirements of the LAP.

On the proposal of Cllr. Healy Eames and Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed not to include the objective in the Plan to provide an Area Office in Claregalway

#### Issue

Request to zone parcel of land from proposed Agricultural to Residential.

#### Location

Lands consist of are located to the north of the village and are bounded by the N17 to the east, the plan boundary to the north and a local county road (the Cloonbigeen road) to the south.

#### Summary:

At present the parcel of land contains the family home, with attached farmyard and outbuildings and has a new dwelling under construction. It is considered that these lands should be zoned residential for the following reasons:

- Lands are located within the village boundary and there is no use for agriculturally zoned lands at this location,
- Zoning would improve the visual appearance of the existing farmyard and outbuildings within proximity of the village centre,
- Zoning would improve the possibility of road widening and improved sight lines at the junction of the county road and the N17,

#### Response:

There are adequate lands proposed to be zoned residential in the Draft Plan. Notwithstanding the phasing proposals mentioned above, an extension of Residential land bank would result in an unacceptable breach of the provisions of the County Settlement Strategy. Furthermore, the zoning of these lands at the northern end of the village would result in an isolated Residential zone and a haphazard zoning plan for the area.

#### Recommendation:

No change recommended.

#### **Area Committee Recommendation**

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed to add the lands in question to the existing medium term phasing of lands in the plan.

<u>Various:</u> Including request for a recycling centre, under grounding of wiring, provision of broadband technology, extension of street lighting / footpaths, provision of bus stops and shelters, traffic management at the school, additional Recreation / Amenity Zoning, extension of plan boundary, the creation of a County Council Area Office in Claregalway, stonewalls and amendments to text.

Mr. Lyons is generally satisfied with the content of the Draft LAP but has made 14 observations on its content. These shall be summarised and responded to individually.

#### D3.1: Recycling centre

#### Summary:

Plan should make specific reference to the provision of this facility in the Waste Management Section.

#### Response:

This submission was commented upon by the Environment section. This section states that due to the abuse of a bring bank facility it had to be removed in 2003. The Environment Section have set out numerous additions and amendments to Environmental policies, these shall be discussed in the Forward Planning Submissions section of this report.

#### Recommendation:

Include objective to 'Relocate bring banks at an appropriate location in Claregalway that will have enhanced supervision/ monitoring measures including the use of CCTV as necessary.'

#### Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. Healy-Eames it was agreed to include an objective to "Relocate bring banks at an appropriate location in Claregalway that will have enhanced supervision/monitoring measures including the use of CCTV as necessary."

#### D3.2: Under grounding of overhead wires

Summary: Requests that there should be an objective in the Industry, Employment and Telecommunications section of the plan to put all existing overhead wires and cables underground.

#### Response:

Owing the exorbitant costs involved, it would not be possible for the Council to undertake these works.

#### Recommendation:

No Change Recommended.

#### **Area Committee Recommendation**

On the proposal of Cllr. Healy Eames and which was seconded by Cllr. Hoade it was agreed not to change the plan.

#### D3.3: Broadband Technology

#### Summary:

Plan should make specific reference to the provision of these facilities. It is considered that Section 3.3.5 of the Draft LAP merely talks about broadband information.

#### Response:

The Council is not a provider of Broadband Technology, therefore there cannot be a specific objective to provide it. The broadband policy mentioned in this section is taken from the County Development Plan.

#### Recommendation:

No change recommended.

#### Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Healy Eames which was seconded by Cllr. Hoade it was agreed not to change the Plan.

#### D3.4: Extension of street lighting and footpaths.

#### Summary:

Request that there should be a written objective in the Transport and Road Infrastructure Section to extend street lighting and footpaths in the village out to the 40mph limits.

#### Response:

This submission was commented upon by the Roads Section, who state that the developers can provide this infrastructure. The Area Engineer agrees that the provision of such infrastructure would be desirable and would be subject to NRA sanction.

#### Recommendation:

Include objective 'to require developers "to extend street lighting and footpaths in areas within their control with the aim of extending this infrastructure to the 40mph limits. Council to provide footpaths and streetlights in those areas inside the 40 mph limits where new developments are not permissible, where funds permit and shall be subject to NRA sanction."

#### Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. Healy-Eames it was agreed to include the objective.

On the proposal of Cllr. Healy Eames and Cllr. Hoade it was agreed to include the above objective.

#### D3.5: Bus Shelters

**Summary:** Transport and Infrastructure Policy 3.4.9 of the Draft should be expanded to include for the provision of Bus Shelters.

#### Response:

This submission was commented upon by the Roads Section, who state that the provision of Bus Shelters is a CIE requirement.

#### Recommendation:

Section 3.4.9 should be amended to mention co-operation with the Public Transport Authorities in the provision of Bus Shelters.

#### Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed that Section 3.4.9 should be amended.

On the proposal of Cllr. Healy Eames and Cllr. Hoade it was agreed that Section 3.4.9 should be amended to mention co-operation with the Public Transport Authorities in the provision of Bus Shelters.

#### D3.6: Traffic Management at the School

#### Summary:

Requests that there is an objective to mark out the area in front of the school for disabled parking, staff parking and a safe pick up and drop off point for the school bus as an interim until off road parking is made available.

#### Response:

This submission was commented upon by the Roads section, who state that it is the responsibility of the School to provide proper facilities and proposals.

#### Recommendation:

No change recommended.

#### Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed that no change to the plan was required

## On the proposal of Cllr. Healy Eames and Cllr. Hoade it was agreed that no change to the plan is required

#### D3.7: Bus Stops

#### Summary:

Requests that there should be an Objective in the Transport and Roads Infrastructure Section that the unofficial bus stop beside the Church be made permanent and the existing stop beside the Nine Arches be maintained.

#### Response:

This submission was commented upon by the Roads Section, who state that the Nine Arches Bus Stop location is not acceptable. New location should be along the southern edge of the N17 directly west of the junction with the N18.

#### Recommendation:

Refine Transport and Road Infrastructure TR5 to state 'Make provision for a more frequent bus service with a bus pick up and set down point in the village, preferably, along the southern edge of the N17 directly west of the junction with the N18.

#### Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed\_ to Refine Transport and Road Infrastructure TR5 to state 'Make provision for a more frequent bus service with a bus pick up and set down point in the village, preferably, along the southern edge of the N17 directly west of the junction with the N18.

On the proposal of Cllr. Healy Eames and Cllr. Hoade it was agreed to refine Transport and Road Infrastructure TR5 to state 'Make provision for a more frequent bus service with a bus pick up and set down point in the village, preferably, along the southern edge of the N17 directly west of the junction with the N18'.

#### D3.8: Recreation and Amenity zone adjacent to the GAA pitch

#### Summary:

The Draft Plan predicts a possible population increase of 4121 people over the period of the Plan. In the light of this increase, it requested that a greater area of land adjacent to the pitch should be zoned for amenity purposes. Amount or exact location of land is not specified in the submission.

#### Response:

A total of approx. 25 hectares or 63 acres are proposed to be zoned Recreation and Amenity in the Draft Plan. This allocation, coupled with the phasing proposals mentioned above, the additional Recreation and Amenity lands along the northern and eastern banks of the river Clare should satisfy the demand for such lands over the period of the Plan.

#### Recommendation:

No change recommended

#### **Area Committee Recommendation**

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was accepted that there would be no change to the Plan..

#### D3.9: County Council Local Area Office

Summary: Requests that there should be an objective in the Plan to locate Community Offices and Local Area Offices for Galway County Council in Claregalway.

#### Response:

Having consulted with the Director of Service for the Oranmore Electoral area, it has already been agreed that Claregalway will become the regional centre for the Oranmore Electoral area. The Council are in the process of identifying appropriate sites for its location.

#### Recommendation:

Include objective in the Plan to provide an Area Office in Claregalway. Location to be consistent with the zoning objectives and requirements of the LAP.

#### Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. Healy-Eames it was agreed that the Area Office remain in Lackagh. therefore, no change.

On the proposal of Cllr. Healy Eames and Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed not to change the Plan.

#### D3.10: River Clare Recreation and Amenity zone

#### Summary:

Extension of Plan Boundary and creation of a 5m strip of Recreation and Amenity Zone along the northern and eastern bank of the river Clare. See area marked D1.1 on the Public Submissions map (Map 1).

#### Response:

Although it is not considered necessary to amend the Plan boundary in order for a walkway to develop along the northern and eastern bank of the river Clare, the officials do not have any objection to this proposal in principle.

#### Recommendation:

No objection to proposed Recreation/ Amenity zone or to the extension of Plan boundary in this instance. This proposal if adopted should be supplemented with an objective for an Amenity Corridor / Walkway along this area.

#### **Area Committee Recommendation**

#### D3.11: Zoning of Catholic Church lands

#### Summary:

Request rezoning of these institutional lands from Commercial to Recreation and Amenity. See lands marked D1.3 on attached map.

#### Response:

The lands in question consist of part of the Catholic Church car park to the north and green traffic islands left over from the re-alignment of the N18. A small block of land in this submission has been proposed residential in the Draft. Having considered the submission, the Draft zoning Plan and following a site inspection

it is considered that the Car park are should be zoned Community Facility and the this narrow strip of land adjacent to the Church and school should more appropriately be zoned Recreation and Amenity, see FP13 & FP14 on map 2. Recommendation:

Zone lands referred to in this submission partly **Community Facilities** to the north and Recreation **and Amenity** to the south.

Requests that Objective UD9 be strengthened to ensure that the destruction of stone walls is prohibited. Argument is made that if these walls are deemed to be unsafe they should be rebuilt in a safe location using natural methods so that they retain their unique character.

#### Response:

This submission was commented upon by the Roads Section, who state that the NRA won't accept unplastered stone walls along road edges.

#### Recommendation:

No change to wording of Objective UD9 'Where unplastered stone walls exist on site these should be preserved in situ. However, consideration will be given to safety audits where these stone walls exist along public road edges'

#### Recommendation:

Recommend an alteration to the Plan boundary as proposed in this submission.

#### Area Committee Recommendation

Agreed with Planners recommendation. See FP1.

<u>D3.14 & D315</u>: Request for extension of Plan boundary and zoning of lands for recreation and amenity.

#### Summary:

This area is between the proposed Industrial zone and the existing N18, which was left over the realignment of the old N18. It is overgrown with natural vegetation and should be retained as a wildlife habitat.

#### Response:

This submission was commented on by the Roads section who state that this proposal should be resisted as it would interfere with possible road improvements for the area. The lands are currently owned by the Council.

#### Recommendation:

No change recommended.

Submission welcomes the Plan in general, in particular the extension of Community and Recreational Facilities. However, the two issues listed above shall be summarised and responded to individually.

## D9.1: The location of the Industrial Zone adjacent to a residential area.

## Summary:

Submission has concern over the location of the Industrial zone within the village centre within close proximity to an existing and growing residential area.

### Response:

The Officials must have regard to the economic growth of the village over the period of the Plan. The Industrial lands as identified in the Draft Plan are situated at a strategic location along the N18 at the edge of the village. There are no existing residences located within this proposed zone. There are approx. 9 no. residences located along the edge of this zone. Development standards for Industrial development is set out in section 5.8.4 of the Draft Plan. The following provisions protect residential amenity;

- The hours of industrial operation will be controlled where they are likely to result in harm to environmental amenities including residential amenity,
- Noise levels shall not exceed 55dB (a) Leq when measured at the boundary of the site.
- The layout, planning and design may be subject of a detailed Action Plan to be approved by the Planning Authority.

#### Recommendation:

No change recommended.

## Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Healy-Eames which was seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed that the Development Standards section on Industry, Wholesale and Warehousing in the Plan, contains the following design and layout consideration; 'a minimum open space requirement of 15% shall be provided such that it may function as an effective amenity area. Where industrial proposals are located adjacent to existing and proposed residential areas, the Open Space provision shall be designed in such a way as to act as a buffer zone between the proposed industrial units and residential areas. Additional landscaping will also be required in these areas.'

Where industrial proposals are located adjacent to existing and proposed residential areas, the Open Space provision shall be designed in such a way as to act as a buffer zone between the proposed industrial

units and residential areas. Additional landscaping will also be required in these areas.'

# D9.2: The location of the proposed by-pass so close to the existing village.

## Summary:

Submission has concern over the location of the by-pass. States that it is in close proximity to the existing village and does not take account of the expanding boundaries of the village. Suggested that the city side of the by-pass be moved back approx. 0.5miles. Argued that this would allow for further expansion of the village in the future and would not need to cross neighbours houses and gardens. Land suggested involves Wasteland/ Commonage and would be more suitable for road development.

## Response:

This submission was commented upon by the Roads Section, who state that the road as indicated on the Draft Plan is for a relief road and the by pass will be included as part of the new N17. The Roads section will finalise the exact details of the route in due course.

Reduction in the amount of land proposed to be zoned in the Draft for Community Facilities. Requests increase in land zoned **residential**. **Location:** Lands are located to the rear (east) of the existing national school.

## Summary:

States that amount of land proposed in the Draft LAP for Community Facilities

(approx. 5 hectares or 13 acres) is excessive for the following reasons:

- States that a more suitable parcel of land for Community Facilities exists to the north of the school. Argued that this is nearer to the school, is more appropriate in size.
- States that Zoning to Residential would be a more appropriate link up to the area proposed Recreation and Amenity.
- Considering the need for a School drop off point, if this was to be provided to the rear (east) of the school, it would render three sides of the school, at certain hours, liable to traffic.
- Quotes the minimum site size requirement for schools set out in Section 5.9.2 of the Draft. This section states that 'for primary schools a minimum size of 0.6 hectares of school land must be provided with up to three class units and increasing in line with an increase in class units.' Using this base figure the land area of the existing National School is over this minimum site size requirement. The additional land proposed for Community Facilities in the area is therefore excessive
- The amount of land to the rear of the School which is currently used as a sports field is far less than the amount of land proposed Community Facility in the Draft at this location.
- Concern that this large expanse of land proposed Community Facility in the Draft which would be occupied solely during the day could lead to a no go area in the evening times.
- Propose that approx. 2 acres or 0.8 hectares of land owned by Garrets is zoned Community Facilities with the remainder be zoned Residential.

## Response:

There are adequate lands proposed to be zoned residential in the Draft Plan. Notwithstanding the phasing proposals mentioned above, an extension of Residential land bank would result in an unacceptable breach of the provisions of the County Settlement Strategy. Furthermore, there is a need in Claregalway for adequate lands for future Educational use. These lands to the rear of the existing school and in close proximity to the Village Centre, Church and GAA pitch are ideal for Community Facility use. Submission has quoted the minimum site requirement for a school of three class units, but the Community Facility zone also provides for the development of health, welfare, religious, childcare and recycling facilities.

It is therefore not considered that there is an excessive amount of lands zoned Community Facility in the Plan. Landowner should bear in mind that residential development is 'Open for consideration' in a Community Facility zone.

#### Recommendation:

No change recommended.

Area Committee Recommendation

Agreed. No change recommended.

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy and seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed not to change the Plan.

**Submission D11** 

Submitted by: John Geraghty

#### Issue:

Zoning of land from proposed Recreation / Amenity to Village Centre

Location: Lands are located along the south bank of the river Clare directly east of the N17.

## Summary:

Mr. Geraghty states that his is the only landholding which is zoned 100% Recreation & Amenity in the area. Lands are located in the centre of the Plan area and could be developed for Village centre use without detracting from the overall objective of creating a riverside park.

The Amenity area/linear park is much wider on lands in question than on adjoining lands and could be reduced to line up with the Recreation/ Amenity zoning to the west of the N17. Mr. Geraghty states that this could create a streetscape while at the same time bringing the riverside park into the village.

## Response:

Submission seeks to zone proposed recreation and amenity zone to the most intensive development zone along the banks of the river Clare. This is not acceptable to the officials for a number of reasons;

- Residential development is permitted in principle in a Village Centre zone.
  Over and above this, there are adequate lands proposed to be zoned
  residential in the Draft Plan. Notwithstanding the phasing proposals
  mentioned above, an extension of lands for residential use would result in
  an unacceptable breach of the provisions of the County Settlement
  Strategy.
- The zoning of these lands at the northern end of the village would seriously interrupt the proposed riverside recreation and amenity area and result in a haphazard zoning plan.
- Lands are situated along the original course of the River Clare. There has been a lengthy assessment of Hydrological surveys, Hydrometrical graphs, recent flooding history, original OS maps for the area and arterial drainage maps for the area. Following consultation with the Environment

section the entirety of the lands in this submission would appear to be liable to flooding. In the absence of any scientific evidence to the contrary the zoning of this land for development purposes should be avoided.

#### Recommendation:

No change recommended.

# Area Committee Recommendation Recommendation deferred.

Cllr. Healy Eames stated that discussion took place at length at Area Committee Meetings in relation to this submission and that she proposed that an area, as identified by her at the meeting, outside of the zone of archaeological potential and set back 30m from the bank of the River Clare, be zoned residential and that the Urban Design Framework accommodate the proposed residential lands

Mr. O'Donnell stated that the Planning Authority's position on the overall submission was that this area was inappropriate for development due to its archaeological and heritage impact. This area would also be a potential traffic hazard due to it's restricted access onto the N17. It is also an area liable to flooding and would pose an unacceptable risk to public health. He stressed that it was also an unacceptable breach of the County Plan Settlement Strategy.

Cllr Healy Eames stated that they had considered all points raised and that they have been taken into account, she proposed; that an area, as identified by her at the meeting, outside of the zone of archaeological potential and set back 30m from the bank of the River Clare, be zoned residential and that the Urban Design Framework accommodate the proposed residential lands. This was seconded by Cllr Cuddy.

Vote taken: 18 for new zoning proposals set out above, none against.

Cllr.Cuddy requested an amendment to Cllr.Healy Eames's proposal, that a field within the zone of archaeological potential on the map presented by Cllr.Healy Eames be amended to show it as an agricultural zone in line with it's current use and that a strip 30m from the edge of the River Clare be zoned Recreational and Amenity in this area.

Mr. Gavin stressed that the Planning Authority's proposal is for the lands in this submission to remain zoned as recreational and amenity.

The County Manager stressed the significance of this as an important archaeological area.

Mr. Gavin stated that it was necessary that these lands remained zoned as recreational/amenity so as to give maximum protection this area of archaeological interest.

As the amendment to Clir Healy Eames's proposal was not seconded no vote was taken on the amendment.

Result of vote therefore upheld.

#### Issue:

Zoning of land (approx 0.93 acres or 0.37 hectares) from proposed Recreation / Amenity to **Commercial** to the west of the N17 on the south bank of the river Clare.

**Location:** Lands are situated opposite the Nine Arches Bridge along the western edge of the N17 on the south bank of the river Clare.

## Summary:

Detailed 59 page submission argues for an extension to the Commercial zoning further northwards along the western edge of the N17. The submission includes cover letter, a description of the site, a proposed zoning map, archaeological reports, site photographs, pre-planning sketches and a site layout plan of the existing permitted development on the site to the south.

# Reasons for Rezoning

- Existing buildings on the site comprise of a mixture of Agricultural Storage Sheds and the shell of a former two storey stone farmhouse. States that this is an eyesore and its proposed zoning as Recreation and Amenity is a gross underuse of a village centre site.
- The site is within an Area of Archaeological interest, archaeological monitoring of the site immediately to the south did not reveal any artefacts or any signs of previous settlement.
- Proposed as Recreation and Amenity under Draft LAP, whilst adjoining lands are zoned for various types of development; lands immediately to the south are being developed as mix use offices,

retail, apartments, housing and a hotel. Lands to the south east on the opposite side of the N17 are proposed to be zoned residential. Therefore it is argued that the site in question is surrounded by proposed development zones and existing development.

Submission states that rezoning of the site for commercial purposes would be important to the success of the existing Dunleavy mixed use

development immediately to the south (named Cois Chlair).

Although Riverside Recreation and Amenity zone is considered sound, this site is more suitable for development as it is located along the northern end of the village.

Owners have a right to a viable and economic development of their

land.

Submission states that the proposed zoning is a balanced approach between the aspirations for a Riverside Recreation and Amenity buffer zone and a logical end point for a Commercial/ Residential development strip in this part of Claregalway.

Photos of existing buildings,

- Archaeological Monitoring report on Dunleavy mixed use development site being to the south, this study was not conditioned in the Planning Permission but was requested by Duchas- the Heritage Service. The study contains information pertaining to the site of this submission. This report was completed in July 2003. Report concluded that there were no features of archaeological significance on the site.
- Archaeological Impact assessment report prepared as part of the Dunleavy Mixed use development Planning Application. The study contains information pertaining to the site of this submission. This report was completed In April 1999.

 Site layout of existing Dunleavy development under construction – relevance uncertain.

## Response:

The Forward Planning section are strongly opposed to the extension of the Commercial zone at this location for the following reasons;

- Proposed zoning would interrupt and devalue the objective for a continuous riverside Recreation / Amenity zone and Amenity Corridor, which is unique to the Claregalway Local Area Plan.
- The construction of further developments of similar scale, mass, height, bulk, design and materials as that of the commercial development nearing completion to the south would be entirely inappropriate at this sensitive riverside location in close proximity to the Abbey.
- Observations made by the Conservation Officer support this argument.
   The latter states that new development both adjacent to and at a distance from protected structures can affect their character and special interest.

The site is located within close proximity to the Abbey, Claregalway Castle and the Nine Arches Bridge (all are protected structures). Intensive development could alter the historic skyline and setting of these structures.

However, the Forward Planning Section acknowledges that the existing condition of buildings at a prominent location close to the village centre requires visual improvement. Therefore, it is considered that the proposed zoning of the site be revised so as to revitalise this underutilised site without compromising the Amenity and Conservation objectives of the Draft Local Area Plan. See Forward Planning Proposed Amendments map (Map 2). These can be summarised as follows;

- The southern portion of the site which includes the old two storey stone farmhouse building and agricultural sheds to be zoned Community Facilities and supported by a number Urban Design Objectives to control the scale, mass, height, bulk, design and materials of any proposed development on site. The latter zoning and design objectives would allow for a transitional zone to be created between an intensive commercial zone to the south and a passive riverside recreation and amenity zone to the north. See FP11 on Map 2.
- The northern portion of the site in front of the graveyard and which
  includes the handball alley to remain as a proposed Recreation and
  Amenity zone. This should be supported with Urban Design Objectives to
  retain the urban enclosure of the handball Alley see FP10 on Map 2.

## Recommendation:

- 1. Zone southern portion of site from proposed Recreation and Amenity to Community Facilities, with urban design objectives to control the scale, mass, height, bulk, design and materials of any proposed development on site.
- 2. Retain the proposed **Recreation and Amenity** zone on the northern portion of the site with Urban Design Objectives to retain the enclosure of the handball alley.

#### Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. McDonagh which was seconded by Cllr. Cuddy it was agreed to;

- Substitute "Commercial" instead of suggested Community facilities in the southern portion of the site and include a site specific objective to control the Scale, Height, Mass, Bulk, Design, Siting and Materials of any proposed structure on this site.
- Retain the proposed Recreation and Amenity zone on the northern portion of the site with Urban Design Objectives to retain the enclosure of the handball alley.

On the proposal of Cllr Healy Eames and seconded by Cllr. Cuddy it was agreed to(1) zone the southern portion of the site Commercial and include a site specific objective to control the Scale, Height, Mass, Bulk, Design, Siting and Materials of any proposed structure on this site.

(2) Retain the proposed Recreation and Amenity zone in the northern portion of the site with an objective to retain the enclosure of the handball alley.

Location: Lands are adjacent to the western boundary of the Plan, south of the N17 and west of the N18.

## D13.1 & D13.2: Extension of Plan boundary and zoning to Residential

## Summary:

- An existing housing estate is situated directly to the east (named Sli an Bradan). The housing layout, entrance position, open space and sewage treatment plant detail were all prepared to allow for the development of the lands in this submission. Site layout plan of this application has been submitted.
- A second housing estate to east has also been permitted alongside to the east of the lands in question. Provision has also been made for access from The N18 through the permitted housing estate to the lands in question.
- As a result of the development of Sli an Bradan, a wastewater treatment works was constructed on the lands in question. Submission claims that it is recommended by Galway County Council that treatment plants be located in areas zoned residential.
- The inclusion of these lands as part of the Residential zone for Claregalway would allow an efficient development of family lands to occur.

The proximity of these lands to local amenities and services encourages the inclusion of this submission into the adopted Claregalway Local Area Plan.

## Response:

There are adequate lands proposed to be zoned residential in the Draft Plan. Notwithstanding the phasing proposals mentioned above, an extension of Residential land bank would result in an unacceptable breach of the provisions of the County Settlement Strategy. Furthermore, a site inspection and Planning History search on the site revealed that a large treatment plant exists in the middle of the site. Therefore, if the lands were to be zoned it would be unlikely that many residential units could be accommodated on site as they would be required to meet EPA minimum distance requirements between proposed residential units and existing treatment works. See P39 of the Draft LAP.

### Recommendation:

No change recommended.

## Summary:

States that the current configuration of the residential zoning on the land is not conducive to development purposes e.g. the northeastern point of the site is only 40m wide.

- Zoning of the whole of the lands in question would allow an efficient development of these lands to occur.
- The proximity of these lands to local amenities and services encourages the inclusion of these lands as part of the Residential zoning.

## Response:

There are adequate lands proposed to be zoned residential in the Draft Plan. Notwithstanding the phasing proposals mentioned above, an extension of Residential land bank would result in an unacceptable breach of the provisions of the County Settlement Strategy. Furthermore, the zoning of these lands at the northern end of the village would result in an isolated Residential zone and a haphazard zoning plan for the area.

An examination of the minutes of meetings on the preparation of the Draft Development Plan for Claregalway revealed that the Council agreed to maintain the agricultural zoning on these lands.

- Stated that if the lands in this submission were to be zoned it would allow the relocation of the treatment works to the rear (west) and would result in an efficient and phased development of the whole of these lands.

## Response:

There is currently a Planning Application in on this site for the construction of 26 dwellinghouses, 8 apartments and temporary wastewater treatment works with associated site works and services (gross floor space 3793.5sqm). Decision is due the 6<sup>th</sup> October 2004.

It is considered by the officials that there are more than adequate lands proposed to be zoned residential in the Draft Plan. Notwithstanding the phasing proposals mentioned above, an extension of Residential land bank would result in an unacceptable breach of the provisions of the County Settlement Strategy.

#### Recommendation:

No change recommended.

# D15.3: Proposed By-Pass:

# Summary:

- States that proposed by-pass as indicated is entirely inappropriate, argues that if this by-pass were to be constructed the build up of traffic would simply be relocated from the outskirts of Claregalway to the outskirts of Galway city.
- States that interests of commuters would be better served by the construction of the proposed new N17 route. This would allow for a more efficient and planned development of the village.

# Response:

 This submission was commented upon by the Roads Section. In relation to the proposed by pass, it has been stated that this will act as a relief road once the new N17 route is complete.

#### Recommendation:

No change recommended

## Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Healy Eames which was seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed not to change the Plan

QBC's are being investigated by the roads section. Section 3.4.8 of the Draft LAP sets out the Councils policy line in relation to QBC's. However, a Park and Ride facility would be expected to be provided from a private developer at a suitable location.

# D15.5: A Traffic Management System:

## Summary:

Further consideration should be given to the configuration of the traffic management system in the village, for example the junction of the N17 and N18, the pedestrian crossing and various entrances within the village.

## Response:

Section 3.4.15 sets out to consider the objectives of a forthcoming Traffic Management Plan for Claregalway. Roads section states that traffic lights are being installed at the N17/ N18 junction. However, it is the opinion of the Roads Sections that with up to 25,000 vehicles per day on an inadequate road no traffic management system will work without a relief road.

## Recommendation:

No change recommended.

#### Issues:

- 1. Support for Landscape and Amenity objectives for new developments.
- Objection to Amenity Corridor which is proposed through the existing Lakeview Estate.
- 3. Proposed design and capacity of new Wastewater Treatment scheme.

# D16.1: Support for Landscape and Amenity objectives for new developments.

## Summary:

Residents have voiced their support for the policies specified in 3.9.4 of the Draft relating to conservation of local landscapes. The native trees and hedgerows are important features in terms of their ecological value, and are highly valued for their screening of noise from the N17 and N18 roads. Residents state that they support the objectives the riverside walk and amenity corridors to new developments only.

## Response:

The Officials wish to uphold these objectives as contained within the Draft Plan. However, it is proposed that this objective be worded as follows.

UD8 Existing Landscape Objectives; Removal of existing healthy mature trees shall be strongly resisted. A tree survey shall be normally required and healthy specimens shall be preserved. Where other trees need to be removed these

shall be replaced with three semi-mature trees of similar species for each one removed.

#### Recommendation:

Include amendment to Objective UD8 Existing Landscape Objectives as outlined above.

## Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr Healy-Eames which was seconded by Cllr. Cuddy it was agreed to include an amendment to the Objective on Existing Landscape Objectives as outlined above.

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy and seconded by Cllr Healy Eames it was agreed to include amendment to Objective UD8 Existing Landscape Objectives as outlined above.

## D16.2: Objection to Amenity Corridor through the existing Lakeview Estate.

## Summary:

Object to proposed amenity corridor through the Lakeview estate on the grounds that it would interfere with existing residents amenity and privacy, would interfere with a private right of way and would therefore be contrary to the original planning permission. Residents suggest an alternative amenity corridor on the southern side of the Church where an existing footpath and public space is in place.

## Response:

The Amenity Corridor or walkway is an important objective at this location as it would link up future Community Facility and Amenity lands to the village centre. If this Amenity Corridor / Walkway were to be removed, it is likely that the estate road would continue to be used by members of the public as it the most direct 'desire line' between the village and future Recreational/ Community Facility lands.

However if this proposal is deemed to be completely unacceptable the Council would consider running the Amenity Corridor/ Walkway south of the Lakeview Estate on an East-West axis to meet the old N18 road. See FP15 on Map 2.

#### Recommendation:

No Change recommended. However, consideration may be given to an alternative Amenity Corridor route.

#### Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Healy-Eames which was seconded by Cllr Cuddy it was agreed to only consider the Alternative Amenity corridor route as outlined above.

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy and seconded by Cllr Healy Eames it was agreed to only consider the Alternative Amenity corridor route as outlined above.

## D16.3: Proposed design and capacity of new Wastewater Treatment scheme.

## Summary:

Support the plans for a new sewerage treatment plant. However, the design figure for a population equivalent of 3000 should be increased in the context of Clareagalways future status as a satellite town of Galway City.

## Response:

This submission was commented upon by the Water Services Section who state that the sizing of the Municipal treatment plant is up for review before the design of the proposed treatment works is finalised.

## Recommendation:

Insert statement in the Plan which states that the sizing of the treatment plant has yet to be finalised.

#### Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Healy-Eames which was seconded by Cllr. Hoade it was agreed to insert statement in the Plan which states that the sizing of the treatment plant has yet to be finalised.

### Issue:

Designation of lands for Educational use in Claregalway.

## Summary:

Educate Together is the **national** representative body for educational use in Ireland and a registered patron body with the Dept. of Education & Science. It is requested that land zoned for Education use for the following reasons;

- The proposed growth in population in the Claregalway / Ardaun and surrounding areas will require additional educational facilities. This is set out on Page 18 of the County Development Plan (Table 2.2 Projected Populations/ Households for GTPS Area). See appendix attached.
- There is a need for multi-denominational schools which provide a greater choice in primary education facilities and best reflects the beliefs of families.
- The group welcome Policy 214 of the County Development Plan which is to 'Facilitate the provision of Schools where necessary'. Considered that Educational Facilities are best provided in partnership between the Local Authority, Dept. of Education and Science and Patron bodies,
- Advocate a multi-campus approach where various complementary needs catered for on the one site.
- Confident that an Educate Together School will open within the next 2 years in the area. This should therefore be catered for in the Plan.

## Response:

A total of approx. 5 hectares or 13 acres is proposed to be zoned Community Facilities which are currently undeveloped. This is adequate to cater for population demands over the period of the Plan. This zone is described p78 of the draft Plan as providing for 'health, welfare, religious, **educational** and recycling facilities.' Therefore, if a proposal for a multi-denominational school were to be proposed, it would be acceptable in principle in a Community Facility zone. However, it would be premature for the Council to identify a specific site for such a facility at this stage.

#### Recommendation:

Include an objective to support the provision of a Multi-denominational school at an appropriate location in Claregalway, which meets the requirements of the Local Area Plan.

## Issue:

<u>Various:</u> Including the proposed Amenity Corridor through the Lakeview Estate, the proposed new treatment plant, traffic problems surrounding Lakeview Estate and support for the Landscape Objectives in the plan.

## Summary:

- Object to the proposed Amenity Corridor through the Lakeview Estate on the grounds that the proposal would interfere with the resident's privacy and security.
- State that the design capacity for a 3000 population equivalent for the new treatment plant is inadequate as there is close to that number already in the area at present.
- 2. State that residents of Lakeview experience traffic problems. Residents have difficulty entering and exiting the estate. This problem is exacerbated at Mass times (seven days a week) as the estate road is used by church goers to enter the Church car park, and during funerals as it is used to enter the Mortuary Chapel and meeting room.
- Support for the Landscape Objectives which refer to the conservation of hedges and stone walls.

## Summary:

However if this proposal is deemed to be completely unacceptable the Council would consider running the Amenity Corridor/ Walkway south of the Lakeview Estate on an East-West axis to meet the old N18 road. See FP15 Map 2.

#### Recommendation:

No Change recommended. However, consideration may be given to an alternative Amenity Corridor route.

# Area Committee Recommendation Dealt with earlier

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy and seconded by Cllr Healy Eames it was agreed to only consider the alternative amenity corridor route as outlined above.

## D18.2: Proposed design and capacity of new Wastewater Treatment scheme.

## Summary:

#### Issue:

<u>Various</u>; Including the proposed Amenity Corridor through the Lakeview Estate, traffic problems surrounding Lakeview Estate and the proposed new treatment plant.

## D19.1 Objection to the proposed Amenity Corridor through the Lakeview Estate

## Summary:

Objection on the grounds that the proposal would interfere with the resident's privacy and amenity.

## Response:

The Amenity Corridor or walkway is an important objective at this location as it would link up future Community Facility and Amenity lands to the village centre. If this Amenity Corridor / Walkway were to be removed, it is likely that the estate road would continue to be used by members of the public as it the most direct 'desire line' between the village and future Recreational/ Community Facility lands.

However if this proposal is deemed to be completely unacceptable the Council would consider running the Amenity Corridor/ Walkway south of the Lakeview Estate on an East-West axis to meet the old N18 road. See FP15 Map 2.

#### Recommendation:

No Change recommended. However, consideration may be given to an alternative Amenity Corridor route.

Area Committee Recommendation

Dealt with earlier.

#### Issue:

Objection to proposed tertiary access roads. in the townland of Lakeview.

## Summary:

Express concern that the proposed Tertiary Access Objectives as set out in the Urban Design Framework map on the grounds that;

- It would be used as a 'rat run' by traffic wishing to gain access from the N17 to the N18 or vice versa,
- Would result in through access for both commuter and industrial traffic thereby causing danger to children as well as major air and noise pollution into a residential area.

## Response:

These access routes appeared on the Urban Design Framework Objectives Map as part of the Draft LAP. Having examined this submission and following a site inspection, it is considered that the proposed Tertiary Access road to the east of the GAA pitch be omitted as it is unlikely that sight line requirements could be achieved onto the county road.

However, the tertiary access routes to the south east of the Plan area should be down graded to Local Access routes and should not be interconnected. This will have the effect of disabling 'rat run' though traffic from and to the N17/ N18 whilst facilitating access to future development lands. See FP8 & FP9 on Map 2.

Recommendation:

- 1. Omit Tertiary Access route to east of GAA pitch- see FP8 on Map 2.
- 2. Replace proposed tertiary access with non connected local access objectives. See FP9 on Map 2.

## Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. Healy-Eames it was agreed to;

- 1. Omit Tertiary Access route to east of GAA pitch- see FP8 on Map 2.
- 2. Replace proposed tertiary access with non connected local access objectives. See FP9 on Map 2.

On the proposal of Cllr. Hoade and seconded by Cllr. Healy Eames it was agreed to (1) Omit Tertiary Access route to east of GAA pitch-see FP8 on Map 2. and

(2) Replace proposed tertiary access with non connected local access objectives. See FP9 on Map 2.

#### Issue:

Consultants are preparing a detailed masterplan for a significant portion of residential lands to the south of the N17 and to the east of the N18. The aim of the masterplan is to create a high quality living environment with an emphasis on the most up to date urban design criterion and guidelines. Although the Masterplan is based on the Urban Design Framework Objectives set out in the draft, a number of Objectives in the Draft LAP may conflict with the Masterplan approach.

Issues raised on Objectives in the Plan.

D21.1 Refers to Section 4.2 - UD3 Neighbourhood centre objective;

## Summary

The inclusion of this objective is supported, however it is suggested that the LAP should allow for flexibility in the precise location/ boundaries and overall area of this neighbourhood centre.

## Response:

A large area has been zoned for Neighbourhood centre uses even though only a limited amount of local community and / or small commercial retail uses will be considered at this location. Secondly, the mapped objectives as appeared on the Urban Design Framework map have been marked as being indicative only. Therefore, the large amount of Neighbourhood centre land combined with the indicative layout on the Urban Design Objectives map allows for sufficient flexibility for any development proposal in this area.

#### Recommendation:

Amendment to UD3: Neighbourhood Centre Objective: 'Any neighbourhood centre proposal shall be confined to the Neighbourhood centre zone as indicated on Map 2 of the LAP, however, the precise location and extent of this centre shall be at the discretion of the Planning Authority.'

#### Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed to make an amendment to UD3: Neighbourhood Centre Objective as outlined above.

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy and seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed to make Amendment to UD3: Neighbourhood Centre Objective:

'Any neighbourhood centre proposal shall be confined to the Neighbourhood centre zone as indicated on Map 2 of the LAP, however, the precise location and extent of this centre shall be at the discretion of the Planning Authority.'

# D21.2 Refers to Section 5.2.1 - Road Standards:

## Summary

The last paragraph of this section states the following;

"In the case of development fronting district and local distributor roads, larger sites with greater building lines and detached houses will normally be required. In such cases grass/planted verges (of native species) in addition to footpaths will also be required. Building lines of 10-12m in such instances are recommended with site frontages of 15m and grass verges of 2m."

States that this requirement is in conflict with best practice and design guidelines. E.g. the "Traffic Management Guidelines 2003" published by the DoEHLG/Department of Transport. Requests that the above paragraph to be omitted from the Plan.

## Response:

Having examined this proposal vis-a-vis the Traffic Management Guidelines and other up to date design guidance documents, it is considered that the paragraph referred to is omitted from the plan. It is intended to add to the list of design documents referred to in section 5.2.1 of the Draft.

## Recommendation:

Omit paragraph in question from plan and add to the list of design documents referred to in the draft.

## Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. McDonagh, it was agreed to omit paragraph in question from plan and add to the list of design documents referred to in the draft.

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy and seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed to omit paragraph in question from plan and add to the list of design documents referred to in the draft.

D21.3 Refers to Table 5.3 - Crèche Parking Standards.

## Summary

Table 5.3 containing car parking standards has a requirement of 1 space per employee plus 0.25 spaces per child. This is considered unreasonable as in practice parents set down rather than park at the crèche. It is suggested that this requirement be re-examined.

## Response:

Using a typical example for an application for 75 houses. A number of guidelines / requirements govern the calculation of car parking spaces.

- The Childcare Facilities guidelines for Planning Authorities suggest that a Childcare facility should be provided to cater for minimum of 20 childcare spaces for every 75 houses.
- The Draft Local Area Plan Table 5.3 Car Parking Standards requires 1 space per employee plus 0.25 spaces per child.
- The development contributions scheme charges at the rate of €3600 for each space which cannot be provided on site.

Therefore, using the above example at the rate of **0.25** car parking spaces per child a crèche for 20 children, would require 5 spaces for the children and 3 spaces for each of say 3 employees i.e. a total of 8 spaces.

If 4 spaces could not be provided on site a development contribution of €14400 would be required.

## Recommendation:

Following the above examination, it is recommended that the requirement be "1 space per employee, plus 0.2 car parking spaces per child or adequate set down / collection area to service the facility which meets road safety requirements". This is considered more reasonable requirement for an adequate level of parking to service a proposed crèche. Furthermore, it its recommended that Section 5.9.3 Crèches/ Playschools shall have regard to suggested Adult to Child ratios as recommended under the Pre-School Regulations 1996 (Amended 1997).

## Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Hoade which was seconded by Cllr. Cuddy, the recommendation outlined above was agreed with.

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy and seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed to accept the requirement of "1 space per employee, plus 0.2 car parking spaces per child or adequate set down / collection area to service the facility which meets road safety requirements". This is considered more reasonable requirement for an adequate level of parking to service a proposed crèche. Furthermore, it its accepted that Section

5.9.3 Crèches/ Playschools shall have regard to suggested Adult to Child ratios as recommended under the Pre-School Regulations 1996 (Amended 1997).

## D21.4 Urban Design Framework- Objectives

## Summary

Requested that objectives which are set out in Map no. 2 would not be rigidly applied as this would impose significant constraints on the preparation of the masterplan.

## Response

The principle of each of these objectives shall be maintained. However, each of the Urban Design Framework Objectives have been mapped as being indicative only.

Furthermore, the following additional sentences to various Objectives in this section should allow for greater flexibility in their implementation.

UD3: Neighbourhood Centre Objective: Any neighbourhood centre proposal shall be confined to the Neighbourhood centre zone as indicated on Map 2 of the LAP, however, the precise location and extent of this centre shall be at the discretion of the Planning Authority.

UD4, UD5, UD6 & UD7: Access objectives: While the routes indicated on map 2 are indicative only, the principle of these routes shall be upheld. The precise course and trajectory of these access routes shall be agreed between the Council and the developer.

\*\*UD8 Amenity Corridors and Civic Open Space Objectives; The routes for these Amenity corridors indicated on map 2 are indicative only. Where it is not possible to maintain the precise course and trajectory of these Amenity Corridors alternative routes shall be designed by the developer for the agreement of the Planning Authority.

UD8 Existing Landscape Objectives; Removal of existing healthy mature trees shall be strongly resisted. A tree survey shall be normally required and healthy specimens shall be preserved. Where other trees need to be removed these shall be replaced with two semi-mature trees for each one removed

#### Recommendation:

Amend Urban Design Framework Objectives as outlined above.

## **Area Committee Recommendation**

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed to amend the recommendation outlined above.

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy and seconded by Cllr. McDonagh it was agreed to amend the Urban Design Framework Objectives as outlined above.

FP5: Proposal to extend Plan boundary 5m to the north of the river Clare and zone these lands Recreation and Amenity (See Map 2).

Dealt with earlier and agreed.

FP6: Propose to Show Indicative Flood Plain Area as part of the Local Area Plan. See Map 2

#### **Area Committee Recommendation**

On the proposal of Cllr. Cuddy which was seconded by Cllr. Healy-Eames, this was agreed.

FP7: Phase proposed residential lands as indicated on map 2.

## Area Committee Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. Healy-Eames which was seconded by Cllr. Cuddy, this was agreed.

FP8: Omit Tertiary Access Objective at this location.

Agreed

FP9: Replace Tertiary Access Objectives at this location with non-connected Local Access Objectives.

FP10: Retain Recreation Amenity zone directly to the front of the Old Graveyard on the south bank of the river Clare, with Objectives to preserve the enclosure of the Handball alley and create an Amenity corridor link with the property to the south.

FP11: Proposal to zone lands between the Old Graveyard and the new Commercial development (Cois Chlair) Community Facilities, with Objective to pull forward the building line, with objectives to ensure appropriate form, scale, height, use of on site stone materials and vernacular design.

FP12: Remove zonings from public roads including the N17, N18 Cloonbiggeen road etc. within the Plan boundary.

FP15: Indicate 2 new Amenity Corridor Objective, one south of the Lakeview estate with an East- West axis linking up with the old N18. The second to link proposed neighbourhood centre with Amenity lands/ Community facility lands and school to the west.

# Area Committee Recommendation Agreed.

FP16: Incorporate new Tertiary Access objective directly south of the school in order to facilitate future Community Facility land.

# Area Committee Recommendation Agreed.

# FP 17 :Incorporate the following amendments to the text of the Plan,

These have been proposed by the Environment Section and are agreeable to the Forward Planning section. Page numbers refer to the Draft Plan. Each should read as proposals.

## • p11 Introduction

The first paragraph mentions the importance of protecting archaeological potential and architectural heritage. This sentence should be amended as follows:

The importance of protecting the zones of archaeological potential, the architectural heritage (Abbey, Nine Arches Bridge and Castle), the groundwater and the River Clare is underlined....'

In the fourth paragraph the first sentence should be amended as follows:

'Other strategic considerations taken into account in this Plan include the availability of adequate wastewater treatment facilities and waste management facilities...'

## p11 Residential Areas

An extra sentence should be added as follows:

'All housing and commercial development to date is served by individual septic tank systems or by one of six privately operated wastewater treatment plants which discharge treated effluent to groundwater.'

## p12 Strategy

Addition of one more item to the list of considerations:

- 'Adequate protection of the vulnerable groundwater from treated effluent discharges.'
- p14 Context: Wastewater

Amend first sentence as follows:

There is no existing municipal wastewater treatment plant in Claregalway and a new sewerage network and treatment plant is required.'

Replace the second paragraph with the following:

'At present wastewater treatment is provided by septic tank systems for individual dwellings or premises and by six privately operated wastewater treatment plants serving larger developments.'

# • p14 Environment [and Natural Heritage] Context

First paragraph to be rewritten as follows:

'In Claregalway, the principal water bodies requiring protection are the groundwater and the River Clare - Abhainn an Chláir. There is also a short stream which rises at the back of the 'Cois Chlair' development and flows into the adjacent River Clare. The River Clare which runs along the north and east of the Plan area has been classified by the Western Regional Fisheries Board as an important salmonid river. This river is an important part of the natural heritage of

Claregalway. The provision of a linear park along the banks of the river would create a buffer zone that would reduce pollution risk to the river '

#### p15 Waste Management- Context

Replace this paragraph with the following:

To achieve the recycling targets set out in the Connacht Regional Waste Management Plan 2001, a fully separated waste collection system must be in place in the towns and villages. Currently, Claregalway is provided with a 2-way segregated collection system by a major collector and an occasional collection service from another operator based on further segregation of dry recyclables. These collectors do not collect glass packaging waste from households. It is Council policy to ensure that a bring bank for the recycling of household glass is provided in every village with a population greater than 500. Due to abuse of the facility, the bring banks in Claregalway had to be temporarily removed in 2003. Any relocated bring banks will have enhanced supervision/monitoring measures including the use of CCTV as necessary.'

#### p15 Waste Management -Strategy

Replace the first paragraph as follows:

The strategy of the Council in relation to Waste Management for Claregalway is as follows:

- 1. To provide a bring bank facility in a suitable location in Claregalway together with any ancillary measures required to prevent abuse of the facility.
- 2. To ensure that all commercial premises producing packaging glass waste make suitable arrangements for the collection of that glass waste for reuse or recycling.
- 3. To facilitate the provision of a segregated waste collection system for each household.'

#### p18 Context and Strategy-Summary

An additional bullet point as follows:

Claregalway has a large number of septic tanks and private wastewater treatment plants situated on a regional aquifer of high vulnerability. It is paramount that a village sewerage network and municipal wastewater treatment plant is provided so as to reduce the risk to groundwater and facilitate any further development.'

#### • p24 Water and Wastewater Services -Objectives WI

Suggest the following rewording:

'Construct a new municipal wastewater treatment plant to meet the medium- to long-term needs of the village, together with a sewerage network and pumping stations at appropriate locations where need arises.'

#### • p24 Environment Policies

In 3.6.1 refer to Western River Basin District catchment management plan

In 3.6.3 omit reference to an IPC license (we have no authority over IPC licenses)

Reduce 3.6.6 to the following: 'Ensure the protection of the aquifer (with a rating of high vulnerability) from the risk of environmental pollution'

#### • p25 Environment Objectives

Add in new objectives as follows:

EN 2 To require all relevant applications in which the proposed development would entail removal or reduction of the overburden in locations where a source of pollution exists or is likely to exist to submit measures to reduce and prevent pollution of the groundwater.. Developers may wish to consult with the Environment Section, Galway County Council.

EN 3 To support the creation of a new linear park along the banks of the River Clare that will include riverside protection and enhancement measures.

#### • p25 Waste management Polices

3.7.1 reword as '<u>Encourage the</u> provision of waste management infrastructure to manage solid waste in an environmentally sustainable manner.'

3.7.2 reword as 'Implement <u>the provisions</u> of the Connacht Regional Waste Management Plan 2001 (under review)...

#### • p25 Waste management Objectives

Add another objective as follows:

WM 4 Provide a bring bank facility at a suitable location in Claregalway together with any supervision/monitoring facilities to prevent abuse.'

• p26 3.8.10 Community Facility Objectives

Please omit 'refuse disposal facilities' from this list of community facilities.

• p50 Shopping Centres and permitted locations for shopping Add in after the sentence on Retail Impact assessment:

The Planning Authority may require the provision of a bring bank facility at a shopping centre or large food/grocery chain development.'

• p55 5.9.1 Standards for Community Use Facilities

Add in 'segregated waste collection' to the list of standards in the first paragraph.

• p79 Amendments to the Zoning Matrix:

Item 5 from bottom should read 'Civic Recycling Centre'

p80 Hazardous Waste Depot should be 'open for consideration' under Agriculture. This would give e.g. a battery collection depot more flexibility that being confined to Industrial. There have been problems in the past with the managing authorities for industrial estates not allowing certain waste infrastructure businesses to take up available space on that estate.

This comment applies also to Scrapyards/car dismantlers on page 81.

p81 Omit reference to 'Private Tip', if it is unlicensed it would be illegal. If it is licensed it would be called a landfill. Amend 'Refuse landfill/tip' to 'Refuse landfill'

Finally the Forward Planning section proposes to make the following alterations.

#### Area Committee Recommendation

### FP18: Change name of proposed indicative by pass to Indicative Relief Road.

Elements of repetition shall be removed from the Plan, spell checks, updating and reordering of some paragraphs will form part of the Material alterations and the Final Local Area Plan document

PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT: Permission for the erection of town centre mixed use development including a shopping centre, creche, retail, commercial, hotel, bar, restaurant, office development (13,438 sqm), a museum (2,874 sqm), 310 residential units comprising 102 No. townhouses, 83 apartments 25 duplex units in 18 blocks varying from 2 to 3 and 4 storey with penthouse level and basement or part basement with ancillary carparking, stores, plant and binstores, a school (1,418 sqm), gallery with retail crafts studio's (1,264 sqm) single to two storey in height. Change of use from residential to office of dwelling at Main Street/Kelly's Lane corner. The demolition of and construction of new two storey extension to McDonaghs pub (protected structure). Demolition and alterations and extension to include a change of use to 18 bedroom hotel and ancillary bar, restaurant and service areas at Oranmore House (protected structure).

The demolition of a dwellinghouse at Main Street. Ancillary civil engineering water front promenade, re-routing of existing drainage, roadworks with new roundabout south of bridge, ancillary carparking, site and external works.

**LOCATION:** The site is located in the townlands of Innplot and Oranmore in Oranmore village.

#### PLANNING HISTORY:

03/3575 – To re-thatch the existing thatched roof on McDonaghs Pub. Granted. 04/4004 – Under consideration.

ASSESSMENT: The proposed development is an acceptable extension of the commercial, amenity and residential development in Oranmore. The site is zoned partially for Amenity-Environment and Amenity-Civic and Recreational in the current Development Plan for Oranmore. The major part of the site is zoned for Village Centre/Commercial purposes. The site is serviceable by the public sewer, surface water drains and a public water supply is available. The site is a natural extension of the village centre of Oranmore. The proposed plot ratio of approximately 0.57 is acceptable in light of the fact that upper limit for plot ratio in a Town Centre zoned site is 1.26. The layout, proportion and location of private and public open space is also acceptable. The proposals for the treatment of the Protected Structures which are on the site are also considered acceptable.

**ZONING:** The site is partially zoned for Village Centre/Commercial purposes and partially zoned for Amenity (Recreational and Environmental) purposes in the current Development Plan for Oranmore. The major part of the site is zoned for Village Centre/Commercial purposes.

<u>SUBMISSIONS:</u> Submissions were accepted up to and including 02/09/04. There are a total of 6 submissions to the proposed material contravention of the Oranmore Development Plan. (See attached list)

**RECOMMENDATION:** The development as proposed is generally acceptable in terms of layout and density and is compatible with the existing mix of land uses in the vicinity. The creation of a new civic space and boardwalk / promenade along the coastal zone (partially zoned for Amenity purposes) is also generally acceptable. The proposed development would materially contravene the Oranmore Development Plan, but it is recommended that permission be granted for the reasons already stated.

It is recommended to grant with conditions.

**STATUTORY CONSIDERATION:** A decision to grant permission cannot be made unless a resolution is passed by the members requiring that such a decision be made in accordance with Section 34(6) of the Planning and Development Act 2000.

Public notice of the Council's intention to consider deciding to grant permission was given on 06<sup>th</sup> August 2004 and the notice invited members of the public to submit representations or objections.

If a resolution is passed requiring that a decision to grant permission be made, such a decision will issue with suitable conditions, otherwise a decision to refuse permission must issue.

The latest date for a decision on this application is 30/09/2004".

Mr. Comer stated that six submissions had been received on foot of the public notice. The Council examined each submission and would make a decision based on those submissions.

Cllr. Hynes stated that a number of people from the Oranmore area had expressed their concerns to him regarding the preservation of land near the sea and asked if these concerns had been addressed. Mr. Comer stated that every submission on file would be taken into account by the Council when making their decision.

Cllr. Cuddy asked would the development, if permitted, cause flooding and if it were to occur, who would be responsible. Mr. Comer stated that an Environmental Impact Study was submitted detailing that a survey had been carried out and the results indicated that there was likely to be no material damage. If flooding were to occur, it would be a civil matter between the parties involved.

Cllr. Cuddy asked if the Special Area of Conservation had been taken into account. Mr. Comer stated that the S.A.C had been considered.

Cllr. Cuddy asked if the wildlife would be affected. Mr. Comer stated that the E.I.S indicated that no material damage would be caused to the wildlife.

Cllr. Cuddy asked how much of the area involved the material contravention. Mr. Comer stated that the total area was 8.5 hectares and that the material contravention involved approx. 1/5 of the total area.

Cllr. Healy Eames stated that Oranmore House was a protected structure. She stated that discussions had taken place at local level regarding the material contravention and the locals were generally in favour of it.

Cllr. Healy-Eames proposed that, having considered the Planning Application made by White Cedar Developments Ltd. and having considered the Report dated 21<sup>st</sup> September, 2004, Galway County Council, in accordance with the provisions of Section 26 (3) of the Local Government (Planning & Development) Act 1976, as amended by Section 45 of the Local Government Act 1991 hereby require that a decision to grant permission be made in the case of this application.

Cllr. J. McDonagh seconded this proposal.

Comh. O'Cuaig proposed that Dana Rosemary Scallon be nominated as a Presidential Candidate. Cllr. Hynes seconded this proposal.

Dúirt an Comh. Cllr. Hynes stated that Dana's right to go forward for election should be facilitated. He stated that this was not a reflection on President McAleese and that she had stated that she would welcome a contest for the Presidency. He stated that he would be concerned if the Irish people were not given the opportunity to vote in a Presidential election.

Cllr. Mannion stated that President McAleese had originally got the nomination of the Fianna Fail party seven years ago and that the party still felt that she was their candidate and therefore it would be hypocritical to support any other candidate.

Cllr. McDonagh stated that Dana had great drive and initiative but that the Fine Gael Councillors did not feel that it made political sense to support another candidate as the Fine Gael leader, had expressed the party's support for President McAleese.

Cllr. Cannon stated that it would be immoral to spend approximately €15m of taxpayers money on an election. He also stated that in a recent poll, 82% of those questioned stated that they didn't want a Presidential election.

Mr. Murphy confirmed that Dana – Rosemary Scallon had indicated her consent to be nominated by Galway County Council. In order for the Nomination to be valid, the Council had to be satisfied that Dana – Rosemary Scallon was an eligible candidate. Ms. Scallon had confirmed her Irish Citizenship and indicated that she was upwards of 35 years of age.

The Mayor called a vote on Comh. O'Cuaig's proposal, seconded by Cllr. Hynes that:

"Having complied with the terms of Section 16 of the Presidential Election Act 1993 and being satisfied that the nominee is eligible for election to the office of President and having received the nominee's consent to the nomination, Galway County Council hereby resolve to nominate:

Galway, and this was seconded by Cllr. Mullins and agreed. The Mayor declared Mr. Sherry elected.

Mr. Cullen stated that the draft Strategic Policy Committee Scheme endorsed by the Corporate Policy Group on 6<sup>th</sup> July, 2004 and approved by the Council, at their meeting on 26<sup>th</sup> July, 2004, was put on public display and no submissions were received during the public display period. He recommended that the Scheme be formally adopted by the Council.

He stated that the filling of the remaining Councillor positions on the Committees should be advanced as soon as possible so that all nominations to fill each Committee could be put forward for approval at the October Monthly Meeting of the Council.

Cllr. McDonagh stated that, as far as possible, the Councillors should be given the choice of which Committee they wished to be on.

Mr. Cullen stated that at the Corporate Policy Group Meeting of 6<sup>th</sup> July, 2004 it was agreed that a geographical spread be achieved in the nominations of Councillors to the S.P.C.s

Cllr. Regan proposed that each Cllr be written to listing the SPCs and giving them an opportunity to indicate their preferred SPC. This was seconded by Cllr. Walsh and agreed. Mr. Cullen agreed to do this but he said it had to be acknowledged that not everybody could be nominated to their chosen SPC.

On the proposal of Cllr. McDonagh, seconded by Comh. Ni Fhatharta, the Strategic Policy Committee Scheme was adopted.

## TO THE CONSIDER ANNUAL FINANCIAL STATEMENT FOR YEAR ENDED 31<sup>ST</sup> DECEMBER 2003

Report dated 14th September, 2004 already circulated to each Member.

Mr. Mullarkey stated that the Annual Financial Statement showed that the Council's finances remained in a healthy state at the end of 2003. He stated that the Council's accounting system had been changed from a cash based system to a full accruals system in 2003. He recommended that the Annual Financial Statement be adopted in order to formally close the accounts for 2003.

Cllr. McHugh stated that he hoped that the new accounting system would be more user friendly than the previous one. The County Manager suggested that the Council meet, as a Finance Committee, on a quarterly basis in future in order to receive a regular financial

update. It was proposed by Cllr. Cuddy, seconded by Cllr. Mannion and agreed that quarterly meetings be held to discuss the Councils finances.

On the proposal of Cllr. Hoade, seconded by Cllr. Mannion the Annual Financial Statement for year ended 31st December, 2003 was adopted.

#### REGIONAL BROADBAND PROGRAMME PHASE II

118

Report dated 21st September, 2004 already circulated to each Member.

Mr. Dawson stated that in August, 2004, the Department of Communications, Marine & Natural Resources announced the second phase of the Regional Broadband Programme and that a further 41 towns had been targeted for broadband infrastructure including four from County Galway, i.e. Ballinasloe, Athenry, Clifden and Furbo. He stated that the Minister had invited proposals from Public Authorities for the development of Metropolitan Area Networks in these towns and that Galway County Council had formulated proposals in this regard with the assistance of telecommunications consultants. He stated that the projects, if approved by the Department of Communications, Marine & Natural Resources would attract 90% funding., and that the remaining 10% would be funded by the County Council. He stated that the Members would be fully informed of progress in this regard.

Cllr. Mullins welcomed the inclusion of Ballinasloe in the Regional Broadband Programme and stated that this major infrastructure deficit in Ballinasloe had been used as an excuse for the town being unable to attract replacement industry. He appealed to the County Manager to take a keen interest in Ballinasloe as it was an employment blackspot which needed a major boost.

Cllr. Feeney welcomed the inclusion of Athenry in the Programme stating that he hoped that other towns in the county would be included in the future.

Comh. O Cuaig asked how would broadband be brought to Furbo and Clifden and Mr. Dawson stated that Furbo would be serviced by a wireless connection and that in the case of Clifden, the Council would work in collaboration with other utilities in doing so.

Cllr. McHugh stated that he was concerned that Tuam was not included in the current list because of the pilot scheme being undertaken there with the E.S.B.

Mr. Dawson stated that he had no reason to believe that Tuam would not be included in a future rollout of the Programme as it together with Loughrea and Gort was included in the original schedule of targeted towns to be served, announced in 2002.

Cllr. Reilly stated that he was disappointed that Tuam was not included at this time as it was a Hub Town and that industry increasingly targets locations where fibre-based broadband is available. He proposed that the Council write to the Department of

Communications and the I.D.A. and ask them to include Tuam in the next call for proposals, as a matter of urgency. Cllr. M. Connolly seconded this proposal.

Clir. D. Connolly stated that no government investment had been made in Ballinasloe since 1973 and that he had seen some of his colleagues drifting outside of the county to find employment. He complimented the work being carried out by the Council officials in their efforts to secure industry for Ballinasloe.

Mr. Dawson stated that the Council would maintain contact with the Department and redouble efforts to have the towns addressed, including Tuam. He wished to put on record that there was an exceptionally close working relationship between the Council, the Ballinasloe Town Council and the I.D.A. to source new industrial projects for Ballinasloe and that a 29,000 sq. ft. factory was under construction by the I.D.A. in the town. He also stated that 110 Civil Servants were earmarked for decentralization to Ballinasloe and that the provision of fibre-based broadband would be a major contributory factor in attracting employment generating industrial investment.

Comh. Ni Fhatharta proposed that a special meeting of the Council be held to discuss the issue of unemployment in Ballinasloe, Tuam and other towns and that the Regional Manager of the I.D.A. be invited to attend the meeting. This proposal was seconded by Cllr. Mullins and agreed.

On the proposal of Cllr. Mannion, seconded by Cllr. Mullins, the Regional Broadband Programme Phase II was endorsed by the Council.

#### PRESENTATION ON WESTERN RIVER BASIN DISTRICT PROJECT 123

Mr. T. Kavanagh advised the Members that the previous Council and Environment & Conservation Strategic Policy Committee were advised about the Western River Basin District Project which concerned the future protection and improvement of water quality under the E.U. Water Framework Directive. He stated that the issue was to be addressed on the basis of River Basin Districts/Catchments and that Galway County Council was the lead authority for the Western River Basin District Project. The Council had gone through the Public Procurement Process for the appointment of Consultants and E.S.B. International were successful.

He stated that Mr. Paddy Kavanagh, E.S.B. International was the project leader and Mr. Pat Canney of Galway County Council had been appointed Project Co-ordinator. The project was now up and running and Messers. Kavanagh and Canny would make a short presentation to the Council.

Mr. P. Canney stated that the Water Framework Directive of the European Parliament and Council was a legislative framework setting clear objectives to ensure that "a good status" must be achieved for all European Waters by 2015 and that water use must be sustainable throughout Europe. This applied to Europe's rivers, lakes, estuaries, coastal waters and groundwater.

Mr. P. Kavanagh made a presentation to the meeting regarding the Western River Basin District Project stating that the Water Framework Directive was transposed into Irish Legislation by the European Communities (Water Policy) Regulations 2003, Statutory Instrument S.I. 722, and that this Legislative Instrument listed the local authorities in the Western River Basin District who had the statutory role in promoting, establishing and implementing the Directive's requirements. He stated that these local authorities must produce, review and update a River Basin Management Plan for the basin and also encourage the active involvement of all interested parties in its development and implementation. Importantly, they must implement the required measures to ensure that all waters within the basin district achieve the necessary status and do not deteriorate. He stated that the local authorities designated under S.I. 722 for the Western River Basin District were: Clare, Galway, Leitrim, Mayo, Roscommon and Sligo County Councils and Galway City Council and that Galway County Council was designated as the lead local authority under the legislation.

He stated that a WRBD Project was established to assist in implementing the requirements of the Water Framework Directive and the National Legislation and comprised of a Steering Group, a Management Group, a Project Coordinator and a core group of Consultants, ESBI. The project would deliver the

- Programme of Measures
- Monitoring Programme
- Public consultation
- River Basin Management Plan.

The Mayor thanked the speakers for their presentation.

Mr. Morgan circulated a report dated 24<sup>th</sup> September, 2004 to each Member detailing additional funding in the sum of €1,107,000 received from the Department of the Environment, Heritage and Local Government for non-national roads. He stated that the additional allocations would be spent as follows:

Mr. Morgan also informed the Members that the Department had requested that the Council submit its Roads Restoration Improvement Programme for 2005 by 22<sup>nd</sup> October, 2004. He stated that the proposed programme would be discussed by the Members at their Area Committee Meetings.

The Cllrs, welcomed the additional allocation for non-national roads.

#### MAYORS BUSINESS

Cllr. Kyne said that the people of Barna, through their Committee Pobal Bearna, had raised objections to the proposed changes to their village. They acknowledged that development would take place within zoned areas in the village. However, they urged the Council to take notice of the wishes of the Community and not to permit development of such a scale that the fishing village would be developed into a small town.

He stated that they felt that new development in the village would add considerable additional traffic to the Cois Farraige Road which already had considerable peak time delays and as yet there was no immediate plan in place to improve the traffic problems and also the primary school in Barna was already overcrowded and had no car park, and there is an absence of community facilities in Barna. There was also concern that Barna could lose its Gaeltacht status with continued development.

Cllr. Kyne asked that the officials and Councillors take on board the wishes of the local Community in Barna.

Comh. O'Cuaig stated that An Pobal Bearna had made a very good presentation at the Conamara Area Committee Meeting earlier that day and had outlined very clearly their concerns regarding development in Barna.

It was proposed by Cllr. Mannion, seconded by Cllr. Mc Donagh and agreed that a Special meeting of the Council be held to discuss planning issues. The Mayor stated that the meeting would be held within six to eight weeks and the County Manager confirmed that the meeting would be arranged.

Cllr. Keaveney asked for a clear and concise statement from the Council regarding the possibility that a road would be constructed through the Palace Grounds, Tuam.

Clir. Connolly stated that the Traffic Management Plan for Tuam included a reference to such a road, but he said that there was an alternative and that this would be presented to the Roads Department.

Cllr. McHugh stated that it was agreed that no aspect of the Tuam Traffic Management Plan would go ahead until prior agreement had been reached.

Mr. Morgan stated that the Tuam Electoral Area Councillors had been presented with the Tuam Traffic Management Plan and that a map contained in the Plan showed a line indicating a possible future road skirting the edges of the Palace Grounds to serve traffic relief, access to the schools and access to the swimming pool. He stated that the Traffic Management Plan was approved but that this did not mean that the road skirting the Palace Grounds was approved as any proposal to construct a road would be subject to Part 8 of the Planning & Development Regulations 2001 and would have to be approved by the members before the Council could go ahead with the design of the road.

Cllr. Reilly asked if the road through the Palace Grounds was off the agenda and Mr. Morgan stated that the officials reserved the right to plan ahead to resolve traffic management problems in Tuam, which would probably escalate in the future.

Cllr. Cuddy stated that the bottle-neck at Claregalway every morning and evening could not be allowed to continue and asked that the Council would urge the National Roads Authority to provide a by-pass of the village as a matter of urgency.

Cllr. Canney stated that if a by-pass was provided at Claregalway, this would only transfer the problem onto the outskirts of Galway City in the morning and the outskirts of Tuam in the evening. He stated that while the new N17 Galway to Tuam Road was awaited, a bus-lane should be provided which would alleviate the traffic problem and also a rail network from Tuam to Galway through Athenry would be an option.

The Mayor stated that the issues raised could be discussed at a meeting of the Roads & Transportation Strategic Policy Committee and Cllr. McDonagh agreed.

It was proposed by Cllr. McHugh, seconded by Cllr. Healy-Eames and agreed that a representative from the National Roads Authority be invited to attend a Council Meeting to discuss roads issues.

Cllr. Reilly asked that the Council erect road signs at Ballytrasnagh Crossroads and also at Milltown National School.

Monies were provided in the roads program for signing regional road junctions in 2005. The funding is for the whole county including the Loughrea Electoral Area.

The Regional Roads Signposting programme is being managed by the Council's Road Design Section. The introduction of new regulations with regard to the use of the Irish language on signs has necessitated a revision of the design software used for the Signposting Programme and the new software package is awaited."

(a) The Tender of a person or firm shall be delivered in person by the individual or by some person (other than a member or officer or employee of the Council) acting for him or her or such firm, addressed to the Secretary, Galway County Council, at the Council's offices, Aras an Chontae, Prospect Hill, Galway, not later than 4.00 p.m. on the latest date specified in the advertisement for the receipt of tenders.

#### OR

The tender of a person or firm may be sent by prepaid post addressed to the Secretary, Galway County Council, P.O. Box 27, Aras an Chontae, Prospect Hill, Galway to reach the said office not later than 4.00 p.m. on the latest date for the receipt of tenders as specified in the advertisement.

- (b) All envelopes containing tenders must be endorsed "Tenders for .....". All tenders duly received or delivered in accordance with these regulations shall be immediately placed in a locked receptacle.
- (c) Tenders shall only be opened by the County Secretary or other Authorised Officer in the presence of any two Members of the Council. Tenders estimated not to exceed €150,000 in value may in urgent cases, be opened in the presence of one Member, where a second Member is not available.
- (d) Each such tender shall thereupon be numbered and initialled by the Member/s of the Council and by the County Secretary/Authorised Officer. Details of each tender received and opened as aforesaid shall be entered in the Register of Tenders. The total number of tenders received shall be recorded in the Register of Tenders.
