The Secretary submitted a statement showing a comparison between the Approved Road Works Scheme for 1935/36 and the Provisional Road Works Scheme for 1936-

North-Western Division.

Councillor Lambert proposed that a reduction of 25% be made in the County Surveyor's estimate of £47,280 for the repair of Main Roads outside the Urban Area of Galway. Councillor Nestor seconded the proposal which was adopted. Amount allowed, £35,460.

Councillor Conroy proposed and Councillor H. C. O'Toole seconded:—"That the County Surveyor's estimate of £6,000 for repair of Main Roads in Galway Urban District be reduced to £4,400."-Passed.

Councillor Nestor proposed and Councillor Lambert seconded :- "That the Surveyor's estimate of £1,800 for New Works (Main Roads) be reduced to £1,200."—Passed.

The County Surveyor was directed to effect the reductions decided upon either by the reduction of the estimates for specific works or by eliminating works which were not urgent. The Surveyor amended the Scheme accordingly.

Councillor Nestor proposed and Councillor O'Grady seconded:- "That the Surveyor's estimate of £1,133 10s. 2d.

for New Works on County Roads be reduced to £644 10s. 2d. by eliminating all of the proposals submitted under that heading with the exceptions of works Nos. 179s. and 229s. -Passed.

It was decided to adjourn consideration of this matter the meeting of the Council to be held on the 25th January, 1936.

5735. River Suck Drainage District:

The Secretary directed attention to the fact that the area of charge for the loan proposed to be raised in respect of the County contribution of £2,169 towards the reduction of assessments in the River Such Drainage District had been fixed by the Council as the County Health District of Galway, whereas the Arterial Drainage Maintenance Act, 1924, provided that the area of charge for such loans should, in the absence of special considerations, be the County-at-Large. The Secretary requested the Council to reconsider the area of charge before requesting the Minister the Minister to sanction the area of charge as the County Health District. Councillor Killilea proposed and Councillor Colleran seconded :- "That the previous resolution of the Council be amended so as to make the area of charge the County-at-Large. The amendment was adopted.

5736. Rates Inspectorship—Galway Area: The County Secretary was directed to issue an advertisement preparatory to the appointment of a Rates Inspector for Galway Area by the Council at its meeting on the 25th January, 1936. It was decided that the position be a parttime, non-pensionable one, and that the remuneration be £47 per annum. Candidates should be over 21 years of age and would be required to have a competent knowledge of Irish.

5737. Cappagh Drainage District: The following Notice of Motion submitted by Councillor Beegan, T.D., was considered :-That the collection of the Cost, Maintenance Rates and

Arrears, chargeable to the payees in respect of the Cappagh Restoration Scheme be, and is hereby suspended until a substantial reduction is made on the Annual Rate charged to said payees, by the raising of a Loan by the Galway County Council, and the availing of any further grant the Board of Public Works may be induced to contribute for the purpose of supplementing such reduction :

'That the amount of such Loan, rate of interest thereon, and term of years for repayment be fixed by the Council : That this Motion rescinds any previous Motion or Resolution of the Galway County Council affecting or relating to the collection of cost, maintenance rates and arrears in respect of this Scheme.'

Mr. P. Hogan, T.D., Solicitor, was heard on behalf of the drainage ratepayers of the Cappagh Drainage District.

The Secretary explained that the warrants issued for the collection of Drainage Rate during the current year could not be withdrawn. The Council had requested the Commissioners of Public Works to intimate what grant would be made available out of Central Funds to supplement a County contribution towards the reduction of future assessments in the district. He had not received a reply but would communicate with the Commissioners and would, as suggested by Mr. Hogan, inquire whether portion of the County contribution or portion of any grant made available could be applied to the reduction of the arrears of drainage rates which had already accrued due, the remainder being applied to the reduction of future assessments. In the meantime, the Secretary suggested that, having regard to the number of years' arrears of rates which had accrued due, Collectors would where necessary accept reasonable payments on account provided that no payment on account should be accepted without the issue of an official receipt in respect of it. The drainage ratepayers should be required to pay during the present financial year at least the amount of the arrears which had accrued due to the 31st March, 1935, but in cases of extreme difficulty the Collectors might accept such lesser amount as they considered reasonable, and the official Rate Receipts could be divided in the Council's Offices to enable the Collectors to issue an official Rate Receipt for such sum as might be accepted by them.

The Council approved of the Secretary's suggestion, but it was intimated to Mr. Hogan that, while the Council would do everything possible to effect a settlement of the grievances of the drainage ratepayers, the co-operation of the ratepayers in this matter was essential and they would be required to make a definite effort to clear off the arrears

of drainage rates which had accrued due as quickly as possible.

5738. Revision of Polling Scheme. Local Elections (Polling Districts and Polling Places) Rules, 1928 and Electoral Act, 1923:

The Secretary submitted for re-consideration the draft Provisional Polling Scheme, the consideration of which had been adjourned from the previous meeting of the Council. He reported that the County Registrar agreed that the following amendments might usefully be made in the Provisional Scheme :-

Page 8. The Electoral Division of Kilquain to poll at a house at Kilguain instead of at a house at Killi-

Page 11. The townlands of Pollagh and Rahoon to be added to those mentioned as polling at Boleybeg N.S., these two townlands being eliminated from those set out as polling at Barna N.S.

The County Registrar had intimated, the Secretary stated, that, having regard to the fact that reasonable voting facilities would be granted by the Provisional Scheme if amended in accordance with the foregoing suggestions and that any further amendments would cause serious difficulties in connection with the preparation of the Registrar of Electors and its Annual Revision, as well as adding to the amount of Election expenses, he did not consider it desirable that any further amendments should be made

Councillor Lambert proposed and Councillor Conroy seconded:—"That the Provisional Polling Scheme as circulated be amended in accordance with the suggestion of the County Registrar, and that two copies of the Scheme as amended be sealed and signed and submitted to the Minister for Local Government and Public Health for approval."-

5739. Nilling of Contracts—Loughrea Town Commissioners: Councillor O'Regan proposed "That all Road Contracts with the Loughrea Town Commissioners be cancelled as early as possible by the County Solicitor on behalf of the Council. This proposal was made by Councillor O'Regan after consideration of reports submitted by Mr. O'Keeffe, Assistant County Surveyor, on the condition of the roads in the town of Loughrea. The County Surveyor, Mr. Lee, stated, however, that while he agreed with Mr. O'Keeffe that there had been a certain amount of neglect of a minor character the neglect was not sufficiently serious to justify the cancelling of the Contracts, and he, Mr. Lee, would not be prepared to support any contention that there was serious neglect by the Contractors. It was ultimately agreed that the County Surveyor should, as from the 1st April, 1936, take over for maintenance by direct labour all roads which had been the subject of an Annual Agreement with the Loughrea Town Commissioners, and that he would instruct the County Solicitor to cancel the Contract in respect of Road No. 406 which would otherwise expire on the 31st March, 1938.

5740. Letter from Galway Gaelic League:

A letter was submitted from the Secretary of the Gaelic League in Galway reminding the Council of its previous resolution with reference to the intention of the Council to transact all business of the Council through the medium of Irish.

Councillor T. Flanagan, speaking in Irish, stated that he understood that the Gaelic League did not expect the Council to carry out all its business at its meetings through the medium of Irish as it was understood that many members of the Council did not know Irish, but it was thought that more might be done to further the use of Irish in the Council's

The Secretary explained that any letters received in Irish were replied to in Irish and that much had been done in the translation of official documents and notices into Irish. All publications, including Rate Demand Notes, Credit Notes, Claim Forms, etc., sent from his office to the Gaeltacht Areas were now in Irish. It was not considered possible to do more immediately but everything possible would be done to further the use of the Irish language in the Council's business.

5741. Vocational Education:

The Secretary submitted a letter No. G. 196868/35. dated 6th December, 1935, from the Department of Local Government and Public Health conveying the Minister's sanction to payment of a gratuity of £37 16s. 4d. to Miss M. Donoher, retired Domestic Economy Instructress under the County Galway Vocational Education Committee.

The Secretary submitted schedules showing the amount of rate arrears struck off as irrecoverable in each rate collection district in respect of the 1933/34 and 1934/'35 warrants. The amount struck off at the commencement of the year 1934/'35 out of rates included in the 1933/'34 warrants was £8,790 11s. 0d. Most of the arrears lists were dealt with by the Council on the 12th May, 1934. The remainder of the lists were dealt with by the Finance Committee with the previous authority of the Council on the 26th May, 1934, and the 2nd June, 1934. The amount struck off out of the warrants for 1934/'35 was £3,332 7s. 10d. The lists were submitted to the Council on the 20th April, 1935, and they were further considered by the Finance Committee on the 20th July, 1935, with the authority of the Council. The greater portion of the arrears struck off represented an accumulation of obviously irrecoverable rates on island districts where the Council had no collector for more than ten years.
